

Church: for all church leaders and the unity of the worldwide Church; our Diocese in this time of leadership transition; the Board of Nominators and the election of a new archbishop; the establishment of the Youth and Family Community Cinema at Meredith, to identify our hopes in the nature and person of God and be inspired to be a faith community bringing your light to a darkened world, seeing others come to faith through us; may all we do and say nurture our hope as we see Christ at work growing our church.

took and every breath I breathed He was orchestrating and making way for far greater things than I could have ever imagined.

As a result of pressing into Him very hard He has shown me what my gifts are, what studies to undertake, provided work in the exact field I've studied and that is a perfect fit for me and even provided me with a potential lifelong partner. I have learnt that all I need is to remain in him and knowing that he will remain in me and that is my hope and assurance in the times of pure joy and the times of pain and suffering. Placing my hope in Jesus gives me a peace that surpasses understanding and a hope for all circumstances knowing that He has a plan for every breath that I take. Surrendering my life and allowing Jesus to work and use me for his glory has allowed me to serve, live a life that is God honouring, achieve and see miracles to an extent I didn't know was possible. Jesus is the true and living hope, by him we can see everything else and hold a true hope in a dark world.

Questions for reflection:

- 1. Simeon (Luke 2:25-32) spent his whole adult life hoping for the appearance of one to be Saviour fulfilled in Jesus. What have you been hoping a long time for? And how can Jesus words give you strength to keep hoping?
- 2. What things do you persistently pray for, or struggle to be persistent? What gives you hope to keep praying?
- 3. What promises of God have been fulfilled in your life? How does this give you hope for things remaining to be fulfilled?
- 4. Can you think of someone who is feeling hopeless regarding things taking place in their life or in the world? Can you think of some words of Jesus that would give them?

Pray:

God of hope, you call us to be your witnesses in this uncertain world. By your Spirit awaken in us a true vision of your kingdom, a greater certainty of our salvation, and a deeper dedication to your service. Through our words and actions may the same Spirit bring many who are lost to be found, and for them to celebrate the hope that we can only have in Jesus Christ, in whose name we pray. **Amen**.
