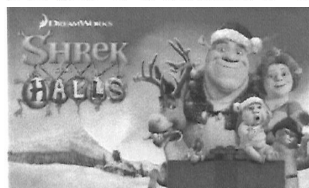

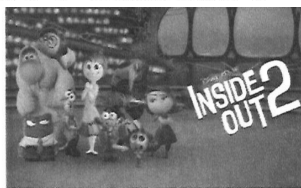

"Our teacher is female, and I really like her. English is my favourite subject."*

For Anaya, education is more than a personal dream, it's a way to serve others and inspire change.

"I want to become a doctor, serve my parents, and help people," she says.

Thanks to the Christmas Bowl, Anaya is not just learning, she's leading. And through her example, a new generation of girls in Umerkot is discovering that with faith, courage, and opportunity, change truly is possible.

NEW ARCHBISHOP FOR ADELAIDE

The Right Reverend Bradly Billings was elected 6 December to succeed the Most Reverend Geoffrey Smith, who retired as archbishop on 1 November, to be the 11th Archbishop of the Anglican Diocese of Adelaide and Metropolitan of South Australia. As Archbishop he will oversee 71 worship centres across 56 parishes in Adelaide, and will have responsibilities to the dioceses of Willochra and The Murray.

Bishop Billings said he firmly believed the Christian faith continued to be good news for all people, and making the gospel known was the shared task of all believers. "The hope we have in the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ gives me confidence and faith for the future, despite the many challenges we face as Anglicans and as disciples of Christ," he said. His first priority would be listening to members of the diocese as they discerned together what future God was calling them into. "I see myself as a partner in ministry with those with whom I live, work, and share my vocation," he said.

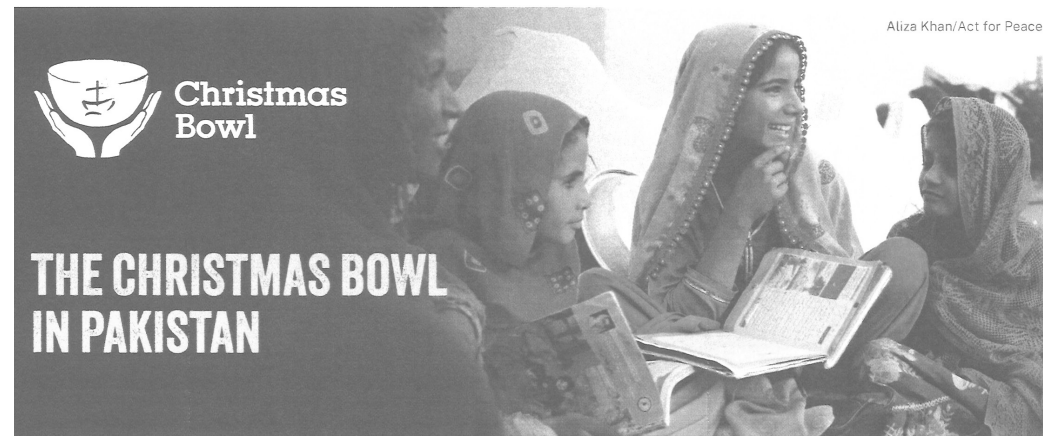
Bishop Billings has served as an assistant bishop in Melbourne since 2016. His qualifications include a doctorate in theology and a Master of Law in Canon Law.

Before his consecration as bishop, he served as Archdeacon of Stonnington and Glen Eira, vicar of parishes in Toorak and Gisborne, and curate in Frankston. He also served as director of theological education for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Bishop Billings said he would miss being the bishop for the Oodthenong area and the people he had worked with over two and a half years. He said he was proud of authorising four multicultural congregations and appointments where new leaders had flourished and brought significant change and growth to their congregations.

Bishop Billings was sitting next to Karen his wife when he received the phone call informing him of his election. He said they both felt overwhelmed by the weight of responsibility but also experienced a profound sense of peace. Bishop Billings and Karen have lived in Melbourne their entire lives and have been in ministry in the Melbourne diocese throughout their lay and ordained ministry. They have five adult children and three grandchildren. Their Hungarian Vizsla, Ruby, will relocate to Adelaide with them. Diocesan administrator Bishop Sophie Relf-Christopher said she had been keenly aware of the Holy Spirit's guidance at every stage of the nomination and election process.

Bishop Brad will be installed as Archbishop 7 March 2026.



In the dry, drought-affected district of Umerkot, in southern Pakistan, life has long been a struggle, especially for girls. Many families have been forced to move in search of water and work, and most children have missed out on school altogether.

With livelihoods disrupted by drought, education often takes a back seat to survival - yet it is education that offers families a pathway to greater stability and hope for the future. Recognising this, our local partner Community World Service Asia (CWSA) is helping communities rebuild not just their livelihoods, but their futures, through access to education.

"Due to the lack of a school, I used to think that maybe I would never be able to study," says ten-year-old Anaya. "And when I saw other girls going to school, I would think to myself, 'I wish I could also study and go to school like these girls.'" (name changed for safety reasons)

Through the Christmas Bowl, and our local partner CWSA, that dream is becoming a reality for Anaya and many other girls in her community.

CWSA runs awareness campaigns that help parents understand the importance of education for all children, not just boys. These efforts are shifting mindsets and opening doors that were once firmly closed.

"Before the CWSA program, parents focused more on boys' education, while girls were kept away from education. However, after the mobilisation efforts, both boys and girls have been given equal opportunities to a large extent."

Anaya's joy in learning is unmistakable.
