



# NEW ANGLICAN ARCHBISHOP OF MELBOURNE ELECTED

Diocesan Administrator, Bishop Genieve Blackwell announce the decision following the deliberations of the Archbishop Election Synod.

The Election Synod of the Diocese of Melbourne, comprising approximately 760 clergy and lay parish representatives of the diocese, began its work on Friday 23 May. On the 24th May the synod elected The Right Reverend Dr Richard (Ric) Thorpe to be the next Archbishop of Melbourne. He will succeed Archbishop Philip Freier who retired in February after serving 18 years in office, once internal processes to confirm his election have been completed.



The Archbishop-elect currently serves in a special episcopal role as Bishop of Islington in the Diocese of London to oversee church planting in London and allow him to develop church planting initiatives throughout the Church of England. This encompasses diocesan, national and international responsibilities, held together within the Gregory Centre for Church Multiplication with a focus on church planting. He has also had liited experience of broader episcopal responsibilities during episcopal vacencies within the London Diocese.

Ordained in the Diocese of London, Bishop Thorpe did his undergraduate theological studies at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford University and his doctorate through Asbury Theological Seminary, Kentucky United States. His passion was, "Seeing the whole Church of God thrive, enabling churches to be healthy, new congregations planted, and struggling churches revitalised."

From early in his ministry at Holy Trinity Brompton (think the origins of Alpha), Ric has ben personally involved in revitalising small or shrinking

# Worship Today: SUNDAY AFTER ASCENSION

**Sentence**: God has raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named.

Ephesians 1:20-21

**Church**: for all church leaders and the unity of the worldwide Church; in our communion the election of an Archbishop of Canterbury, retirement of our National Primate, Bishop Ric Thorpe and Louie as they prepare to come among us; the establishment of the Youth and Family Community Cinema at Meredith, to be a church seeking what God wants us to be and do and nurture a church culture that enables growth spiritually and in numbers.

**Community**: the Wadawarrung and all our first nations peoples, their elders; those working toward reconciliation and treaty, recognition of the country on which we live, work, play and pray; for all who come into our communities of any race, creed, colour, faith, or no faith that they will experience welcome; for all who continue to struggle with the cost of living; looking for the lonely and forgotten neighbours so they will find community and better hope among us and the promise of the Kingdom under the ascended Jesus.

parishes and planting new churches.

Bishop Thorpe has visited Melbourne often and said, "We have come to love Melbourne over the years, as we have served and ministered in the diocese, in other denominations, and across the nation."

Chair of the Board of Nominators, Dr Jenny George, described the Archbishop-elect as "an experienced and visionary leader. Ric has been personally involved in revitalising small or shrinking parishes and planting new churches," Dr George said. "His commitment to developing future leaders is seen in his local and global training of church planters and other leaders."

As he listens and learns about the deeper context of the Anglican Church in Australia, in comparison to the established Church of England, he will discover that there are privileges he once operated in that do not exist here. Bishop Ric will need to come to understand the colonist perspective of Australia and the ongoing work of reconciliation with our first nations people.

Bishop Thorpe will be installed as archbishop in St Paul's Cathedral later in the year at a date to be advised. Bishop Blackwell will continue to serve as administrator until that time.

Bishop Ric is married to Louie, who has been in ministry longer than him, and they have three adult children. His hobbies include:


