

# EXPECTATIONS THAT CAUSE CONFLICT

Here are 3 types of expectations that can cause conflict

Whether we realize it or not, our expectations have a big impact on how we perceive and experience life. Unmet expectations are the root cause of many disagreements within



congregations. Conflicts depend on what type of expectations we have.

#### Unrealistic

Having expectations can be healthy. They help to set a standard for what is or isn't acceptable and provide a baseline for holding ourself and each other accountable and push us to be a better participants in our church. However, when they are too idealistic, chances are they are going to let us down. Expecting perfection from any member is not realistic – we are only human, after all!

#### Ingrained

Some expectations we don't even realize we have. They have been imprinted upon us through observations growing up, society, what happened in the past, and culture. When ingrained expectations are not met, it can spark emotions that seem to come out of nowhere, and that can cause conflict in our churches.

#### **Silent**

Sometimes we are aware of the expectations we have, but we don't actually communicate them to those we work with. Instead, we hope somehow they can read our mind, then feel disappointed or upset when they don't do what we expect. By clearly communicating expectations, we give those around us the best chance of meeting them, or renegotiating them and not feeling let down.

Expectations are like a measuring stick that we hold our reality up against. They play a huge role in how happy and satisfied we are in our relationships and work. The problem with these three types of expectations is that they sour your perception of those we fellowship and minister with. The key is to prioritize communication and work together to create expectations that set a healthy standard for how we want to operate as a faith community.


