our hope is in seeing God's kingdom come and not building our own empires we need not fear:

Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord. Psalm 31:24

I am holding on to the same hope as I lead LyCiG through times of change and transition such as:

- Expanding our work and yet retaining our core DNA
- Delivering more conferences
- · Adding in follow up and going deeper sessions
- Developing some specialist conferences for leading Children's and Youth Work into growth.

There is much to be done! All of it whilst building and retaining an incredible volunteer team who themselves know, love and serve the local church. Now I am not currently in parish ministry, I left my parish to take on this new role. However, to have integrity as Director I know and believe that I will need to be involved with my local church, and I will seek to do that when I move to a new house around Easter time. In the meantime, I am enjoying visiting other churches, being "in the pews" and being in church to worship knowing that the dodgy sound, the missing reader and the faulty heating are not mine to sort.

On Sunday I visited a local church, one that might have been considered a 'rival' to my former parish. I've never seen them as a rival, but I was interested to go along and worship there. It was great. There was a dedicated welcome team, tea, coffee and hot pastries, it was warm, there were children playing and there was a sense of life and vibrancy. It's not a big resource church, it is just another parish church doing its best to meet the needs of its local community. During the sermon I was struck by one particular line:

"Pursue holiness like its oxygen ... "

This was in the context of an engaging talk about the challenge to live a holy life, but these words are what stayed with me. What would life be like if we were as focused on being holy as we are on breathing? If we felt the same physical pain and need to inhale God deeply if we withhold our lives from Him as we do when we try to hold our breath to the point of needing to inhale deeply? As we seek to grow our churches it is not because we want crowds, it is not because we want the ego boost of a full church, it is because we want people to know Jesus. To be so in love with Him and so desiring of life with Him that there is physical pain when they feel disconnected from Him. I love the idea that as we numerically grow our churches, we will be growing disciples who pursue holiness like it is oxygen and who then feel empowered to go and breathe life in to the communities around us.
