



FOUR AREAS TO TAKE INITIATIVE IN YOUR CHURCH

When you see a problem, do you take the initiative to fix it?

Are there aspects of your church you know could be better? Instead of waiting for someone else or your Pastor to take the lead or hoping things magically improve on their own, it's time to be proactive.



Here are areas to take initiative in your church this year.

Role management

If you're struggling with the divisions of labour or notice your Pastor looking overwhelmed by what's on their plate, it's okay! The current breakdown of roles and responsibilities is not set in stone. In fact, most churches benefit from reassessing and making adjustments to how to manage the roles throughout the changes in their congregations. After all, a church's needs will vary as it goes through different seasons of life. Take initiative this year by sitting down as church to discuss what is and isn't working. Brainstorm some practical ways you can work towards a more satisfying balance and meet needs not being met. Think of actionable steps that alleviate those things that are

THE MELBOURNE ANGLICAN (TMA) TO BE DISCONTINUED

The TMA has served the Melbourne Diocese since 1994 continuing a longer tradition of the diocesan newspapers that tradition stretches back to the 1850s with the publication of *The Church of England Messenger* and TMA's immediate predecessor, *SEE* for about 170 years.

After a careful and considered review, early in 2025, Archbishop in Council made the difficult and sad decision to cease the production of The Melbourne Anglican due to the Diocese's wider financial challenges and prior to the installation of Archbishop Ric. This means TMA's social media posts as well as its weekly digital newsletters, Newsstand and Best of the Week, will also cease being published. Looking ahead, future communications from the Diocese will be shared through the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne (ADOM) website and official social media channels.

TMA's contribution has also been recognised nationally through multiple awards from the Australasian Religious Press Association, including the Gutenberg Award for excellence on four occasions (one when the newspaper was still called SEE) and being named Publication of the Year in 2017. These awards reflect the professionalism, integrity and editorial care that have characterised the publication over many years.



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overwhelming the congregations. Don't be afraid to get creative or try out something new for a couple of weeks.

Social and quality time

Do you wish you and your church had more social times, or that it was more of a priority in your church? You'll always find an excuse for why it's not feasible, but the truth is, you can make it work if you want to! Time to be social as a church, a congregation, or just with others you know well, or those you don't know so well, is a healthy part of congregational life. And if this issue wasn't on their radar for others, that's okay! But, jump in – put the effort into planning an activity and the logistics that go with it. Then, invite your church or selected others to come! Not only will they likely appreciate your initiative, it sets a precedent and makes it easier for both of you to grow in knowledge of one another and encourage each other.

Self-improvement

It's not always easy to recognize your own weaknesses, and when you do, it can be even harder to do anything about them. We often let avoidance, projection, or shame take over. Instead of getting on with the things you know you can do and already do, face whatever is getting in the way head on. Get feedback from your trusted friends or a spiritual advisor or coach to get more insight into where you can grow. Then think through small changes you can make or habits you can establish as stepping stones toward where you want to be. Whether it's being a more supportive member of the congregation, more active in a particular ministry, or better at talking about your faith. You have the power within you to be the person you strive to be.

Relationship growth

You might feel your relationships with other members of your church are as strong as ever, or you might be aware that some complacency or conflict is creeping in. Wherever you fall, the reality is that keeping honest and vitalized relationships with those you work alongside requires ongoing effort and intention from all of you. It can be as simple as having a conversation you've been avoiding, or discussing your relationships with your colleagues more intentionally. Being proactive about growing together is a crucial part of an enduring church and a church that offers a faith community to those who are looking for it.

The best churches aren't perfect – they are intentional. Whether it's starting an honest conversation about your needs, planning intentional ministries, organising times to socialise and play, working out who does what and when together, or simply showing more appreciation to each other every opportunity you have. Take the initiative and watch your church community grow stronger.
