community. Parish Community Growth Meetings were an opportunity to work out issues as a community. We need to create more opportunities to simply meet together.

The Past was not Revd Tim's great concern, the future is. However it is apparent that the past is still interfering in our being one parish with three centres. Forgiveness is a gift we offer, opening the way for a new relationship, but it means both sides need to feel sorry for what happened, confess to one another, and do the work of repair. Other concerns raised:

Burnout of members was raised and again we are reminded of a healthy church culture, where we do a few things and do them well, and be good stewards of the people who are serving on behalf of our parish. Consider expanding the roster for worship.

A **Pastoral Care Team** has been established thinking that we are not picking up people in need. Pastoral care is every members responsibility. Although much pastoral care happens naturally, please make yourselves available to be a part of the pastoral care team when it needs to be organises. Notice if someone is missing and check on them, If you are in need of pastoral care, including food because you cannot cook, please use the email that is available in the newsletter.

What we are doing well is not said. We are in the need of encouragement in what is a struggle of ministry in our current context. We need celebrate the activities we are doing well including those times when we have shared our faith with someone. Let us make opportunities to celebrate the good things that are happening within our parish.


