

Lowelyfe, Episode 1: The Only Way Out is Through (work in progress)



In this version of shed, Charlotte battles feelings of being intellectually, socially, and physically behind—particularly in dance. As she works through insecurities about specific parts of her body and her past, each discarded layer of clothing becomes a physical manifestation of release.
