Historic Calgary Week Wrap-up By Walt & Irene DeBoni

The theme for Historic Calgary Week 2023 honoured the importance of transportation in our history with many events highlighting the benefits and the impacts of progress. The festival acknowledged three significant events in history, 140 years since the arrival of the Canadian Pacific Railway and the Calgary Herald in Calgary and the 100th anniversary of the imposition of the Chinese Immigration Act, more commonly known as the Chinese Exclusion Act. The festival showed how the first two events provided Calgary and region with connections to the outside world while the action taken against our Chinese citizens culminated years of discrimination that severely impacted the lives of the Chinese community.

The program comprised 82 events that, although primarily in Calgary, included events in Bragg Creek, Canmore, Chestermere, Cochrane, High River, Irricana, Okotoks, and Strathmore. HCW was "kicked off" at the Central Public Library with Opening Ceremonies that featured an address and blessing by Clarence Wolfleg, a video commemorating Gordon Lightfoot's Canadian Railroad Trilogy, and an address by Councillor Terry Wong.

In addition to presentations that highlighted the CPR and other transportation in our history, there were a variety of other stories presented including the history of individual pioneers, neighbourhood walking tours and museum visits.

As part of its regular program Historic Calgary Week 2023 co-sponsored, with the Winnifred Eaton Archive of the University of British Columbia, a three-day conference entitled Onoto Watanna's Cattle at 100: Indomitable Women in the West During Chinese Exclusion. Winnifred Eaton Babcock Reeve (1875-1954) was a popular early Chinese North American fictionwriter, journalist, screenwriter, and playwright with a diverse and sometimes controversial history.

A huge thanks to our volunteers and presenters for a job well done.
