The CCHS Mobile App Update


The CCHS App Committee is hard at work creating an interactive application for walking tours and individuals looking to explore the exciting history of Calgary.

We have worked hard to film The Grand Theatre as well as historical Rouleauville, the French quarter of the early Calgary. On October 25, 2020, MacKenzie Brash and Andrew Bardsley, members of the CCHS App Committee, interviewed Suzanne de Courville Nicol for a video featuring the Rouleau House. This video will be featured in the Chinook Country Historical Society's walking-tour mobile app. Ms. de Courville Nicol is a researcher with a passion for Calgary's French-speaking heritage, especially the history of the Village of Rouleauville (1899-1907). She has recently published a book, in collaboration with Ken LaPointe and Ben Van De Walle, which is titled ROULEAUVILLE, THE CRADLE OF CALGARY - Pre-1899-1907 and Beyond.

The app committee is completing the filming of our first set of sites which include Fort Calgary, the Brewery Flats region of downtown Calgary and others.
