From July 23 to August 2, Chinook Country Historical Society proudly presents: Historic Calgary Week 2010! We invite everyone to take A Walk Through Time by attending over 50 exciting, informative events. During these 11 days of summer we'll experience talks, walks, car and bus tours, a concert, a campfire, visits to parks and muscums, celebrations for the whole family and a gigantic Calgary Herald crossword puzzle contest based on local history: Many milestones are being celebrated; including centenarics of the City Parks and Chinatown and $125^{\text {th }}$ anniversaries of the school boards and the Calgary Fire Department.

This is the $20^{45}$ annual Historic Calgary Week. In 1991, while much of the downtown was being destroyed and replaced by skyscrapers, a small group of concerned citizens created the event to raise public awareness of the need to preserve our history: The Chinook Country Historical Society broadened the heritage focus in 1995 to include surrounding communitics as well as public and private collections of memorabilia. We honour the dedicated volunteers who first pioneered the concept of a historic week, and those who have kept these initiatives alive.
