From 1870 to 1885 teams of oxen, or bull trains, moved goods from Fort Benton to Fort Macleod. Steamboats had transported the supplies along the Missouri River to Fort Benton. The goods were then transported every summer up the old Macleod Trail to Calgary. To mark the historic route, a group of volunteers began to erect markers in the early 1980s. continued ...

## Marking Macleod Trail-continued

There are now 17 wagon wheel markers along the trail. This exhibit relates the story of the glory years of the Macleod Trail before the coming of the railway and the dedication of the volunteers who preserve that history. Guest curator and trail preservationist Bill Dunn will present a program about the early days of Macleod Trail, then participants will visit the High River marker and the site of the Smith and French Stopping House.
