The Southern Alberta Pioneers and Their Descendants welcome you to the Pioneer Memorial Building. The log structure, built by Hobart Dowler in 1955, houses an extensive photo and resource library dedicated to those families who arrived in Southern Alberta prior to 1891. In 2009 the Memorial Building was designated a Municipal Heritage Resource.

Settling on the banks of Fish Creek they established Alberta's first heavy industry, the Midnapore Woolen Mills. **Neil Brown** tells the story of his great grandfather.

Dale Portman's greatest love is trips to remote parts of the Canadian Rockies, whether on skis, on foot or on horseback. William James Scott was Registrar of the North West Territories in 1874 and served on the first Council held at Fort Livingstone in 1876. William married Maria Patricia Gough in 1877. Together they settled in Battleford and raised eight children. In 1899, after William's death, Maria Patricia and children came to Calgary to be near her brother, Francis Gough. Join Patricia Cox as she shares her grandparents' journey to the Territories and Southern Alberta.

2:00-3:00 pm FORGING THE FUTURE: METAL WORKERS IN CALGARY'S ARCHITECTURAL HISTORY

Ever walked along Calgary's historic commercial main streets such as 9th Avenue in Inglewood and admired the sandstone cornices? You may be surprised to learn many are sand-painted pressed metal! Tinsmiths and metal workers crafted essential building components from windows and roofs to radiators and cast iron tubs. Marilyn Williams gives an overview of this vital early building trade in Calgary.

This tour begins and ends at The Calgary Chinese Cultural Centre, the only replica of Beijing's Temple of Heaven outside of mainland China.
