
ATCO Site- the Southerns

On the west side of Edmonton Trail between 7th and 8th Avenues NE once stood the forerunner of the ATCO Trailer Company- Alberta Trailer Sales- the site of which is today occupied by a nondescript beige neighborhood mall. Alberta Trailer Sales was formed in 1947 by Ron Southern and his dad. The Southern residence itself was also located on the property. Ron Southern attended Stanley Jones School and later Crescent Heights High, where he met his future wife Marg Visser. In this 1960's picture (Glenbow na-5713-8), we're looking west across Edmonton Trail, with 7th Avenue NE on the left.
