
The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Ukrainian Catholic Church

This local landmark was built in 1955. But the Calgary parish itself dates back to 1909, when it was known as St. Stephen's. The first parish church was built in 1911 in the Tuxedo Park district, but in 1926 was physically moved down to the NW corner of 6th Street and 1st Ave NE in Bridgeland, which is 6 blocks due south of here.

Following a fire at St. Stephen's in 1942 and, after WW2, the parish began to search for a new building site. In 1952, the land at 704 6th Street NE was purchased, and construction began in 1955. In 1957, the parish changed its name to the present one, which respectfully, is a bit of a mouthful.

And speaking of mouthfuls, locals know that the Church's annual perogy suppers in the fall aren't to be missed!
