We were all disappointed that Historic Calgary Week 2020 had to be cancelled in its traditional form due to COVID-19. The HCW Committee had organized another exciting program with over 80 events. Thankfully, many of these can be held over for next year when we hope to return to being able to meet in larger groups.

In the meantime, however, we have been working with Calgary Public Library (CPL) to bring some virtual programs to you. On June 3, in cooperation with CPL, Doug Coats presented his Calgary Welcomes The Car PowerPoint on Zoom with great success. This was followed up with five events from July 24 to July 30 in honour of HCW. In addition, Fort Calgary showcased six events between July 27 and August 3. Thanks to our partners for their efforts in promoting our history.


Cemetery Virtual Tours

Grain Academy Opens in Pioneer Acres in Irricana

This time last year we were mourning the closing of the Grain Academy at Stampede Park. Now the Grain Academy has a beautiful new home in Pioneer Acres in Irricana. And importantly for people that would like to visit, it is open!

Among other things the exhibit features a restored boxcar from 1906 and a dissected working grain elevator, along with many tools and other items used in the early days of Alberta's agriculture production.

Shelly McElroy is the manager and curator and welcomes visitors Thursday to Monday from 9 am to 5 pm. The museum is located just north of Irricana, off Township Road 274.
