President's Report Walt DeBoni

Congratulations to Debbie Goodine on her retirement as Coordinator at the Historical Society of Alberta. Her promotion of the Society, and working with all the Chapters was much appreciated and will be missed. Enjoy your retirement, Debbie, and the many volunteering opportunities that are out there!

As we move into the new year, this is a good time to reflect on the state of our finances. As you are likely aware, the Alberta Historic Resources Foundation has been dissolved and funding for organizations such as ours is now the direct responsibility of the Ministry of Culture and Multiculturalism. The budget allocation we received in the fall decreased by 7%. We expect a further decrease of approximately 12% when the Winter/Spring budget is announced. So CCHS will receive a reduced grant from the HSA. At this point our finances are in good shape, but the real impact of these reductions has not been incorporated into the future activities of CCHS. We will be reflecting on this over the next few months and we are hopeful we will still be in a position to continue to deliver quality programming and services to our community. Please keep us in mind when considering your charitable giving and stay tuned for updates on this issue.

The Historic Calgary Week committee held its Partners' Meeting on January 23 with more than 50 people with an interest in history in attendance. This marks the beginning of our planning for this festival that will be held from July 24 through August 3, 2020. A good discussion was held about possible events under our theme this year: "Vision 2020: Perspectives from the Past Informing the Future." Late last year, CCHS was awarded a \$35,000 grant by the Calgary Foundation for our Mobile History App. This two-year project will develop a series of short videos of historic sites in Calgary and region that will incorporate historic photos and other material alongside interviews with individuals connected with the sites. The app will be accessible on mobile devices such as cell phones and could be used by tourists and Calgarians on a self-guided walking tour or from anywhere in the world by anyone interested in our City.

Paleo 2020


Fossils! Dinosaurs! Enjoy fascinating palaeontology talks, fossil displays and posters from 9 am to 4:30 pm on **Saturday**, **March 21**, **2020** at the Jenkins Theatre, Mount Royal University. This annual event allows adults and children from the general public to learn about the latest palaeontological research.

All are welcome! Free admission!

Dr. Stan Stancliffe will show how waste has changed the world over the past 3.5 billion years. Dr. Jon Noad of Gran Tierra Energy will describe the fauna of the Cretaceous Upper Chalk. Dr. Robert MacNaughton of the Geological Survey of Canada will tell about how he is using new fossil data to solve old stratigraphic problems around the Ediacaran-Cambrian boundary in Mackenzie Mountains, NWT. Dr. Corwin Sullivan from the University of Alberta will show how the Upper Cretaceous Wapiti Formation of Northern Alberta is a unique window into the continental vertebrate fauna of boreal Laramidia during Bearpaw times. Aaron Dyer of the University of Calgary will illustrate the histopathology of a pachycephalosaur (dinosaur) frontoparietal dome. Dr. Michael Wilson of Douglas College will discuss the ice advance and retreat and the evidence for mixed Quaternary faunal assemblages on the Canadian plains. Darren Tanke of the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology will describe the relocation of the 1913-1914 American Museum of Natural History ankylosaur quarry and the retrieval of new bones found therein. Dr. Rowan C. Martindale from the University of Texas in Austin will outline the integrated paleoecological and paleoenvironmental records from a new exceptional fossil deposit in Alberta: the Early Jurassic Ya Ha Tinda Lagerstatte.

This event is **FREE** to the public, is family friendly and no registration is required. Paleo 2020 is sponsored by the Alberta Palaeontological Society, Mount Royal University and the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists Palaeontological Division.
