To be invited here today as chairperson of the Quaker Committee in Britain which is involved in our work in the Middle East is a great pleasure and honour.

You have many well wishers in England who pray that BHS will continue to thrive and expand into a School where its students leave, at their graduation with the traditional motto "I SERVE" deep in their hearts and their attitudes towards their Country and fellow Lebanese and to all the peoples of the World.
