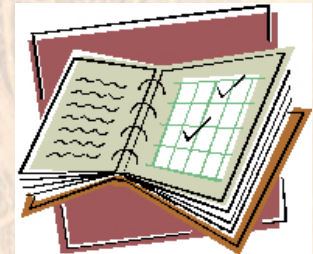


Wheelchair Quilt Kits are ready to be picked up at our November meeting! We have had three turned in already... if you can only do the top, someone can do the quilting for you!
