2020 Challenge Fabric Event

Quantity: 1 piece of 12" x 11 1/4" Challenge Fabric

Rules:

- 1. The finished piece may be ANY size you desire, but must not exceed 160" in full perimeter.
- 2. You MUST include an element of something *LIVING*. This can range from flowers, animals, bugs, trees, fish, humans, etc. <u>OR</u> it can be an interpretation of "alive:" the night sky, wind, our emotions. Just something that shouts "Hello World!"
- 3. Piece must be FINISHED: quilted to a background with a binding to be qualified.
