Cyle, thanks for the call & got your voicemail message about wanting to do some moving of rocks out of the road. I need to see on a map where you believe this needs to be done. I have been up a few times this summer/fall and have not seen a need to move rocks on NFS portions of the road, it is a high clearance road and not to be improved except for occasional passage. I have noticed work done on NFS portions of the road above the mines on the way to the area we had lunch with you and others last year. That section of road is not authorized in your permit and road work is not authorized. Please remember that the only portions of NFS road that are authorized for CCOA motor travel and minimal clearance is from the gate to the mine area near Quality for animal life. All the other sections of old mining roads up above on NFS are not permitted and therefore work not authorized. We have had reports from different folks about someone doing unauthorized work on roads and areas of NFS that we have had to check out. Just a reminder...people are watching to find any violations to report to us. Please just keep your improvements only to your own private land.
