Rubric for the Lake County Cattlewomen Beef Poster Contest:

For FFA Chapters and 4H Clubs

Premiums: \$250.00 for Grand Champion and \$100.00 for Reserve Champion Awards (gift certificates) to be presented during the Round Robin competition

Goals/Purpose:

- For Club/Chapter members to express their support of agriculture through visual means
- To acquire and improve their knowledge and the public's understanding of the economic importance, versatility, ecosystem services, importance to the community, and nutritional value of beef products
- For youth to develop skills and knowledge of researching sound scientific knowledge in order to accurately promote the beef industry

Poster Guidelines:

- 1. There are <u>no age divisions</u> but topics should be age-appropriate.
 - High Schoolers should not create a poster about breeds but instead something like beef quality assurance program, safety, ethics, grading beef, careers, marketing, etc.
 - Younger 4-Hers should create a poster about recognizing healthy animals, shopping or cooking beef and beef by-products, etc.
- 2. All messaging should be positive and promote the production of cattle.
- 3. Develop ideas from several different resources but the concept and poster need to be original and not copied. **Copied posters will be disqualified. References must be included on a 3 x 5 card on the back of the poster.**
 - a. Note: An exhibit card will be made available at check-in time. All posters will have the club name, authors of the poster, leader or advisor's contact information, and date of completion.
 - b. Reference list should/might include website links, interviews from professionals, books, magazines, etc. References can be mounted on the back of the poster or visible on the front of the poster
- 4. Copyrighted material, pictures, and clip-art may not be used. Computer-generated clip-art may be used if not copyrighted.
- Posters should be displayed horizontally and be at least 36" x 36". The display must be able to hang above the designated club/chapter area across the aisle without creating a safety hazard. Posters should be self-supporting (i.e. foamboard or heavy cardboard)
- 6. Display must be in place by noon on Thursday and hang through 3 pm on Monday
