Well, I never thought it could happen, but it has. We have been out of our Church building for 15 weeks as of June 28, 2020. The Annual Conference of Arkansas United Methodism was held on line by Zoom for the first time in history. I never thought either of these would ever happen, but they have.

Annual Conference was held in two sessions. One to deal with the regular business of the conference and then also a clergy session to approve all who are under appointment by the Bishop. The business session lasted 4 and 1/2 hours (normally it takes 3 1/2 days for the business.) The 700+ lay and clergy delegates plus visitors met from home instead of gathering. No celebration for the retiring--no memorial service for those who died during this past year--no gathering of all those who are retired to eat together and see each other. It was all very different.

Our Church Relaunch Team met again this week and after reviewing all the guidelines for reopening for worship and looking at all the health issues involved at this time, we decided to not re-open our Church for worship at least during the month of July. We will look at all the issues again before making any decision to re-open for worship. I will be glad to share all we talked about with anyone interested in knowing more. So, for now stay home--practice good health guidelines and pray daily for our Church and all those who are on our prayer list.

Oh, by the way--I was appointed to return as your part-time pastor for the 7th year. I am glad.

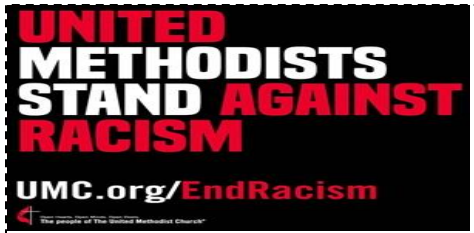

In a statement released by Council of Bishops President Bishop Cynthia Fierro Harvey, the bishops are urging every United Methodist to reclaim their baptismal vows to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. "We ask every United Methodist to name the egregious sin of racism and white supremacy and join together to take a stand against the oppression and injustice that is killing persons of color," the statement said.

The bishops said they are joining with other church leaders and boards and agencies of the United Methodist Church to add strength to the message that "we will no longer remain silent nor complicit but must act now!"

As part of the that pledge, for at least the next 30 days, all United Methodists everywhere are asked to join in prayer at 8:46 a.m. and p.m. for 8 minutes and 46 seconds, the time the officer held his knee on George Floyd's neck. "Pray for all persons of color who suffer at the hands of injustice and oppression. Pray for our church as we take a stand against racism."
