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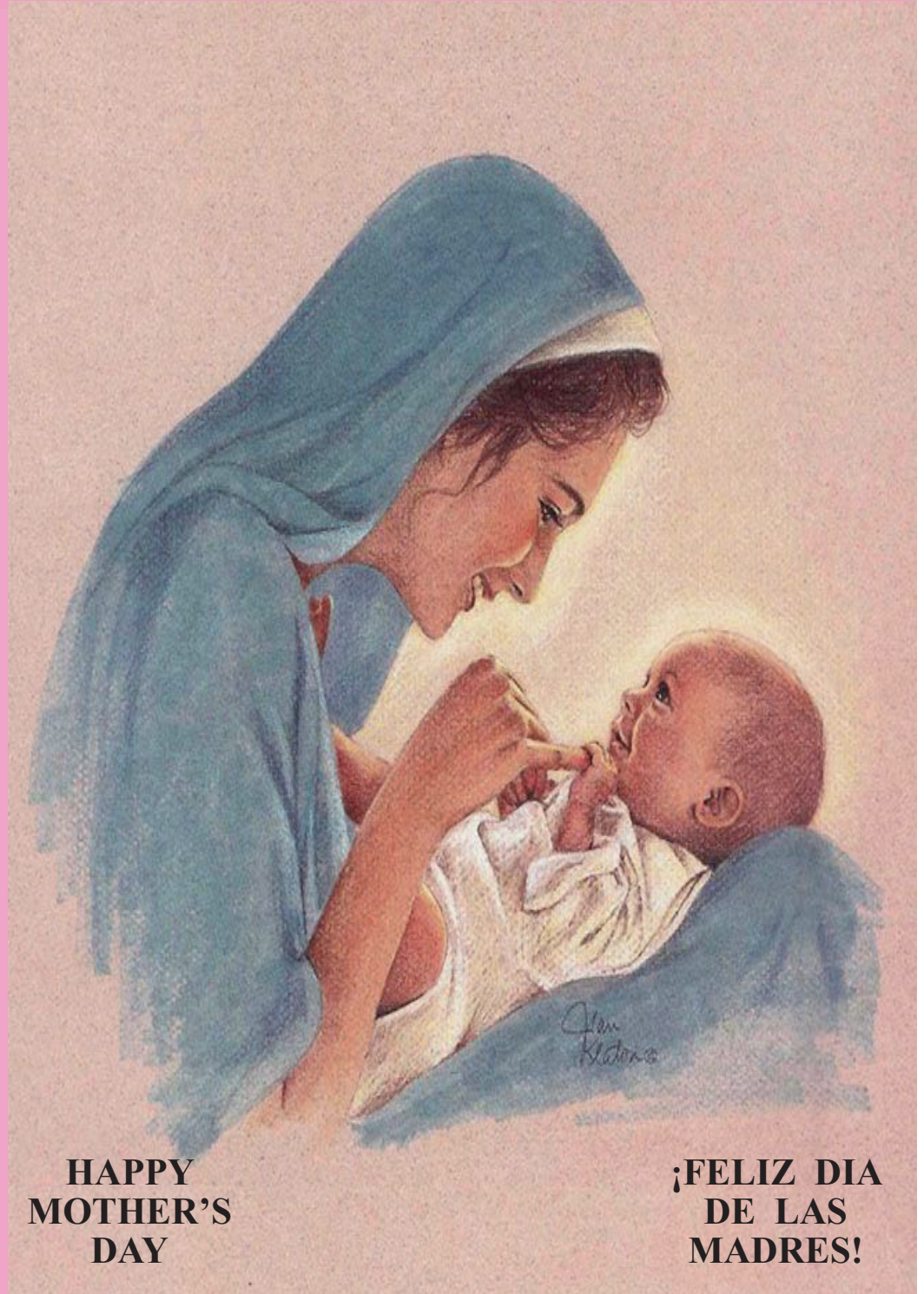

## TO LIVE IN PERFECT JOY



To remain in the love of God is the invitation that Jesus gives us, and it is part of the identity of his disciples. This love is evident in the way in which each one heard the call of God. Let us meditate on some ideas of this love in the biblical readings for this 6th Sunday of Easter.

First, let us contemplate the love that God has for us and revealed in his Son Jesus Christ. In the 1st letter of Saint John, we hear: "The love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him" (1 Jn 4:9), demonstrating the completeness of the expression "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8), which makes us understand that he is communion and gift. The Trinity is closely united, and from this union comes a gift. God does not remain closed in upon himself but gives himself so that he reaches out to us. Thus, the Church teaches us that, by believing in the love of God, Christians can express the fundamental choice of his life. "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, who gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction" (Deus Caritas EST n. 1)

Subsequently, let us recognize that this initiative of God manifests itself to us as a gratuitous love, "He first loved us" (1 Jn 4:19) without regard of who we are, as Peter has said in the house of Cornelius. The only thing he asks for is the willingness to receive his love. The love of God is fruitful in the human being who acts with the honesty of conscience and goodwill. This leads us to experience the need to respond to God's generous love, which is the key to allowing ourselves to be loved by Him. Jesus' command to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love" (Jn 15:9).

As the Feast of Pentecost approaches, let us prepare ourselves unhesitatingly to implore the Holy Spirit, who sustains the ecclesial Community and each disciple of the Lord, so that by giving witness to the love of the Father, we can live in the joy that he offers us as he does. Jesus said: "so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (Jn 15:11).

## PENTACOST



The Christian holiday of Pentecost is a moveable feast, which is celebrated on the 50th day (the seventh Sunday) from Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1–31).

The holiday is also called "White Sunday" or "Whitsunday" or "Whitsun", especially in the United Kingdom, where traditionally the next day, Whit Monday, was also a public holiday (since 1971 fixed by statute on the last Monday in May). The Monday after Pentecost is a legal holiday in many European countries.

In Eastern Christianity, Pentecost can also refer to the entire fifty days of Easter through Pentecost inclusive; hence the book containing the liturgical texts is called the "*Pentecostarion*". Since its date depends on the date of Easter, Pentecost is a "moveable feast".

Pentecost is one of the Great feasts in the Eastern Orthodox Church, a Solemnity in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, a festival, in the Lutheran Churches, and a Principal Feast in the Anglican Communion. Many Christian denominations provide a special liturgy for this holy celebration.

## WHAT'S UP IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION?



Our first communicants are getting ready for their big day on May 22<sup>nd</sup> ready to witness and experience the real presence of Jesus. While catechists continue to reinforce their yearning to know more about our Lord, they also together with the parents are preparing them on the logistics of the day: dress code, active participation in the mass, how to proceed for communion and to learn their song for the day. Parents were told not to take pictures during the event as an official photographer will take care of it. Everyone is asked to come at 9 am to give a little time for practice and last minute instructions.

Our confirmandi, on the other hand will continue deepening of their faith under the guidance of their catechists.

The Office is still in the pandemic mode so the number of students are limited. For now, candidates for pre confirmation and confirmation is still open. Those interested must bring their certificate of Holy Communion when they come to fill out the registration forms.

There has been announcements in various times reminding parents of the logistics and requirements for First Communion: at class time by catechists and by myself in some zoom classes, in the bulletin article as well as emails and texts to parents. This is a repeat of previous announcements. Communion dresses must be white preferably and decent in style. Boys are to wear dark colored pants (Not jeans) and preferably light colored shirt.

Final call for those who missed their First Reconciliation. Make sure to call the parochial office to ask for appointment. There is no need for godparent or sponsor for them but if they have one, they can come but they cannot be seated with the child.

A \$5 photographer fee for each child will be collected in the narthex as they enter the church on their big day. Individual photographers are not allowed. Individual picture-taking will be outside of the church. No one is allowed to stay in the narthex before and after the mass.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. EMILIE DE VILLENEUVE



Emilie de Villeneuve 1811-1854

Emilie was born in 1811 to a noble family in Toulouse, France. While she received a profoundly Christian education at the family estate, Emilie remained attuned to the destiny of those in nearby Castres, where industrialization was causing family breakdown and widespread poverty.

After her mother's death, Emilie was sent to live with her grandmother. When she returned home at the age of nineteen to manage her father's estate, she told him of her desire to enter the Daughters of Charity. His insistence that she wait led Emilie into the heart of prayer, and a new call emerged. With two companions, she formed a congregation devoted to Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception. Committing themselves "to go where the voice of the poor

calls us," the Blue Sisters of Castres opened their doors to young workers, the sick, prostitutes, and convicts.

In 1854, a cholera outbreak in Castres drew the sisters into an active ministry for the sick. Emilie herself became sick and was the final person to die of the epidemic in the town. Today, Emilie's sisters minister in eighteen countries.

"God is everywhere," she had told them, "even in the darkness. A perhaps it is even better that way."

## ¿EXISTE LA ALEGRIA PERFECTA?



Permanecer en el amor de Dios, es la invitación que nos hace Jesús y es parte de la identidad de sus discípulos, este amor se hace evidente en la manera en que cada uno ha escuchado el llamado de Dios. Consideremos algunas ideas de este amor a partir de la Palabra propuesta para este 6° Domingo de Pascua.

En primer momento contemplemos el amor que Dios nos tiene y que ha sido revelado en su Hijo Jesucristo. En la 1ª carta de san Juan, hemos escuchado: “El amor que Dios nos tiene se ha manifestado en que envió al mundo a su Hijo unigénito, para que vivamos por él” ( 1 Jn 4,9) y al explicar en qué consiste la expresión “Dios es amor” (1 Jn 4,8) nos hace entender que es comunión y don. La Trinidad está estrechamente unida y desde esta unión se hace don. Dios no permanece encerrado en sí mismo, sino que se entrega de tal manera que llega a nosotros. Así la Iglesia nos enseña que, al creer en el amor de Dios, el cristiano puede expresar la opción fundamental de su vida. “No se comienza a ser cristiano por una decisión ética o una gran idea, sino por el encuentro con un acontecimiento, con una Persona, que da un nuevo horizonte a la vida y, con ello, una orientación decisiva” (Deus Caritas Est n.1)

En segundo lugar, reconozcamos que esta iniciativa de Dios, se manifiesta a nosotros como un amor gratuito, “Él nos amó primero” (1 Jn 4,19) sin acepción de personas, como lo ha dicho Pedro en la casa de Cornelio, lo único que pide es disponibilidad y acogida. El amor de Dios fecunda en el ser humano que actúa con honestidad de conciencia y buena voluntad. Esta nos lleva a experimentar la necesidad de responder al amor generoso de Dios, para lo cual la clave se encuentra en dejarnos amar por Dios. El mandato de Jesús a sus discípulos es este: “Como el Padre me ama, así los amo yo. Permanezcan en mi amor” (Jn 15,9).

Ante la cercanía de la fiesta de Pentecostés, preparémonos convenientemente para implorar al Espíritu Santo, quien sostiene a la Comunidad eclesial y a cada discípulo del Señor, para que dando testimonio del amor del Padre, podamos vivir en la alegría que él nos ofrece, como lo ha dicho Jesús: “para que mi alegría este en ustedes y su alegría sea plena” (Jn 15,11).

## SANTO DE LA SEMANA: EMILIE VILLANUEVO



Emilie nació en 1811 en una familia noble en Toulouse, Francia. Si bien recibió una educación profundamente cristiana en la finca familiar, Emilie se mantuvo en sintonía con el destino de aquellos en la cercana Castres, donde la industrialización estaba causando la ruptura familiar y la pobreza generalizada. Después de la muerte de su madre, Emilie fue enviada a vivir con su abuela. Cuando regresó a casa a la edad de diecinueve años para administrar la finca de su padre, le contó su deseo de ingresar a las Hijas de la Caridad. Su insistencia en que esperara llevó a Emilie al corazón de la oración y surgió una nueva llamada. Con dos compañeras, formó una congregación dedicada a Nuestra Señora de la Inmaculada Concepción. Comprometiéndose “a ir donde la voz de los pobres nos llame”, las Hermanas Azules de Castres abrieron sus puertas a los jóvenes trabajadores, los enfermos, las prostitutas y los presos. En 1854, un brote de cólera en Castres llevó a las hermanas a un ministerio activo para los enfermos. La propia Emilie se enfermó y fue la última persona en morir de la epidemia en la ciudad. Hoy, las hermanas de Emilie ministran en dieciocho países. “Dios está en todas partes”, les había dicho, “incluso en la oscuridad. Quizás sea incluso mejor así”.

## ¿QUÉ HAY DE NUEVO EN LA EDUCACIÓN RELIGIOSA?



Nuestros primeros comulgantes se están preparando para su gran día el 22 de mayo listos para presenciar y experimentar la presencia real de Jesús. Mientras los catequistas continúan reforzando su anhelo de saber más sobre nuestro Señor, también junto con los padres los están preparando sobre la

logística del día: código de vestimenta, participación activa en la misa, cómo proceder para la comunión y aprender su canto para el día. Se les dijo a los padres que no tomaran fotografías durante el evento ya que un fotógrafo oficial se encargaría de ello. Se les pide a todos que vengan a las 9 am para dar un poco de tiempo para practicar y recibir instrucciones de última hora. Nuestros confirmamandi, por otro lado, continuarán profundizando en su fe bajo la guía de sus catequistas.

Debido a la pandemia el número de estudiantes es limitado. Aún están abiertas las inscripciones para pre-confirmación y confirmación. Los interesados deben traer su certificado de la Sagrada Comunión cuando vengan a llenar los formularios de inscripción.

Ha habido anuncios en varias ocasiones recordando a los padres la logística y los requisitos para la Primera Comunión: en el horario de clase por los catequistas y por mí mismo en algunas clases de zoom, en el artículo del boletín, así como correos electrónicos y mensajes de texto a los padres. Esta es una repetición de anuncios anteriores. Los vestidos de comunión deben ser preferiblemente blancos y de estilo decente. Los niños deben usar pantalones de color oscuro (no jeans) y preferiblemente camisa de color claro.

Llamada final para quienes perdieron su Primera Reconciliación. Asegúrese de llamar a la oficina parroquial para pedir una cita. No hay necesidad de padrinos para ellos, pero si tienen uno, pueden venir pero no pueden sentarse con el niño. Se cobrará una tarifa de fotografía de \$ 5 por cada niño en el nartex cuando ingresen a la iglesia en su gran día. No se permiten fotografías individuales. La toma de fotografías individual será fuera de la iglesia. Nadie puede permanecer en el nartex antes y después de la misa.

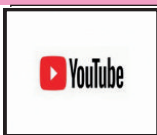

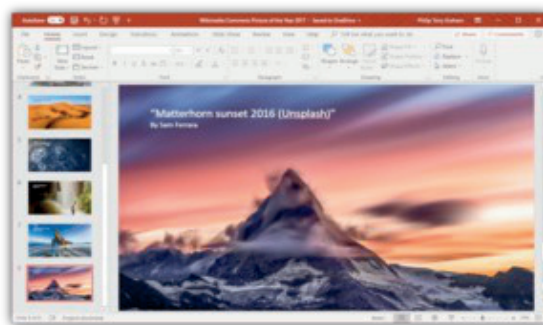
