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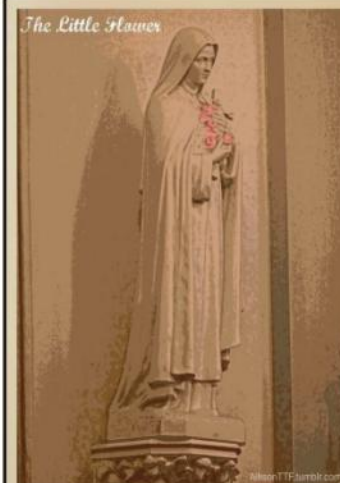

JESUS GENERATES NEW RELATIONSHIPS



During the last several weeks, the liturgy of the Church has led us to reflect on the Christian vocation, assumed as a project of life dear and loved by God, described and manifested in the testimony of men and women. By knowing Jesus Christ, they passed on the faith that we have believed for generations. In it, we confess that the human being created by and for God finds the will of God inscribed in his heart: “The highest reason for human dignity consists in the vocation to communion with God” (CEC n.27).

It is necessary that by acknowledging this call, we may receive with gratitude the teachings of Jesus. He shows us the essence of discipleship: every disciple is sent to proclaim the newness of the Kingdom of God. The teachings of this Sunday’s Gospel (Mk 9:38-48) open the disciples’ gaze to focus on a common goal. May the world know that we belong to Christ and that we can all be free from evil and reach the promised Kingdom in Him. Thus, in Jesus’s dialogue with John, we find teachings that generate new relationships in us.

The Gospel reveals what amazes the disciple. How is it possible that someone who does not belong to the group of messengers is expelling demons in His name? Here, we must note that the important thing is that to overcome the works of evil, it is necessary to invoke the name of Jesus. Whoever invokes His name and identifies with Him, as we do when we call ourselves Christians, has a responsibility, which is manifested in response to the disciple: “Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me” (Mk 9:39). The fundamental question here is whether we speak and act in the name of Christ in our daily lives. To strengthen us in our testimony, the Lord describes how our lives are strengthened. To improve situations that would cause us to choose evil, He tells us to renounce sins. For this, he encourages us by pointing out the goal: eternal life.

By meditating on his Word, let us ask the Lord that relationships with our brothers and sisters are established from gratitude because He allows us to glorify His name in social and personal life.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



St. Vincent de Paul was born to a poor peasant family in the French village of Pouy on April 24, 1581. His first formal education was provided by the Franciscans. He did so well that he was hired to tutor the children of a nearby wealthy family. He used the monies he earned teaching to continue his formal studies at the University of Toulouse, where he studied theology.

He was ordained in 1600 and remained in Toulouse for a time. In 1605, while on a ship traveling from Marseille to Narbonne, he was captured, brought to Tunis, and sold as a slave. Two years later, he and his master managed to escape, and both returned to France.

St. Vincent went to Avignon and later to Rome to continue his studies. While there, he became a chaplain to the Count of Goigny and was placed in charge of distributing money to the deserving poor. He became pastor of a small parish in Clichy for a short time while also serving as a tutor and spiritual director.

From that point forward, he spent his life preaching missions to and providing relief to the poor. He even established hospitals for them. This work became his passion. He later extended his concern and ministry to convicts. The need to evangelize and assist these souls was so great and the demands beyond his own ability

to meet that he founded the Ladies of Charity, a lay institute of women, to help, as well as a religious institute of priests—the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, commonly referred to now as the Vincentians.

This was at a time when there were not many priests in France and what priests there were, were neither well-formed nor faithful to their way of life. Vincent helped reform the clergy and how they were instructed and prepared for the priesthood. He did this first through the presentation of retreats and later by helping develop a precursor to our modern-day seminaries. At one point, his community was directing 53 upper-level seminaries. His retreats, open to priests and laymen, were so well attended that it is said he infused a “Christian spirit among more than 20,000 persons in his last 23 years.”

The Vincentians remain with us today, with nearly 4,000 members in 86 countries. In addition to his order of Vincentian priests, St. Vincent co-founded the Daughters of Charity and St. Louise de Marillac. There are more than 18,000 Daughters today serving the needs of the poor in 94 countries. He was eighty years old when he died in Paris on September 27, 1660. He had “become the symbol of the successful reform of the French Church.” St. Vincent is sometimes referred to as “The Apostle of Charity” and “The Father of the Poor.”

His incorrupt heart can be found in the Convent of the Sisters of Charity, and his bones have been embedded in a wax effigy of the saint located at the Church of the Lazarist Mission. Both sites are located in Paris, France.

Two miracles have been attributed to St. Vincent—a nun cured of ulcers and a laywoman cured of paralysis. As a result of the first, Pope Benedict XIII beatified him on August 13, 1729. Less than eight years later (on June 16, 1737), he was canonized by Pope Clement XIII. The Bull of Canonization recognized Vincent for his charity and reform of the clergy and his early role in opposing Jansenism.

It has been reported that St. Vincent wrote more than 30,000 letters in his lifetime and that nearly 7,000 had been collected in the 18th century. There are at least five collections of his letters in existence today.

The feast day for St. Vincent, the patron of all charitable societies, is September 27.

YOUNG PEOPLE COME TO THE GREAT JUBILEE

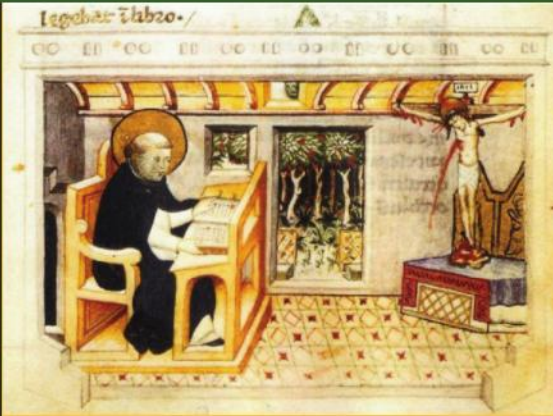


ST. THERESA OF THE CHILD JESUS

“Only” a young saint, since she died when she was just 24; the saint of simplicity and love; the saint of trusting abandonment to God’s will. These are the qualities that make St. Theresa of the Child Jesus so dear to the hearts of today’s young people, as the large number of them who came to Paris attested, and as the Pope said when he announced the imminent proclamation of Theresa of Lisieux as a Doctor of the Church: “The message of St. Theresa, a holy young woman so present in our times, is of particular interest to you, young people. In the school of the Gospel, she indicates to you the path of Christian maturity. She calls you to an infinite generosity; she invites you to remain in the heart of the Church as disciples and ardent witnesses of Christ’s charity.”

However, John Paul II’s decision surprises us for a very special reason: the contrast between Theresa’s holiness and the other Doctors of the Church she joins. Throughout the centuries, the Church has given the title of Doctor to only 32 of her children to stress their holiness of life and orthodoxy. But above all, their great theological wisdom is generally confirmed by monumental works. Thirty men and only two women, until now, one of whom, the Carmelite (like St. Theresa of Lisieux) Teresa of Avila, was a great reformer and prolific writer. Before these examples, the wisdom of the young woman whom the Pope points out today as an example for young people stands out even more: the author of only three books, written by hand on school exercise books, at the request of her superiors, to all practical purposes not destined for publication. And yet, as soon as they were known, they immediately became real best-sellers. The summary of the spiritual experience of a soul still attracts attention.

THE NINE WAYS OF PRAYER OF ST. DOMINIC



Eighth Way of Praying

Our Fr. St. Dominic had another way of praying, beautiful, devout, and pleasing to him. He was soon going to be alone somewhere, to read or pray, staying with himself and with God.

He would sit quietly and, having made the protective sign of the cross, he would open a book before him. He read, and his mind was filled with sweetness, as if he were listening to the Lord speaking to him, according to what is said in the psalm: "I am going to listen to what the Lord says" (Ps 84:9).

Throughout this solitary reading, he venerated the book, leaned toward it, and also kissed it, especially the Gospel.

It would be interesting if we pray as Our Father teaches us today: with the reading of the Word of God, only in this way will our lips come out of what the heart abounds: love because God is love.

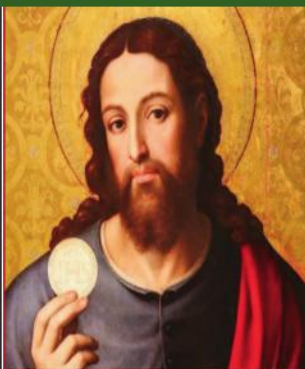

JESUS GENERA NUEVAS RELACIONES



Durante las últimas semanas la liturgia de la Iglesia nos ha conducido a reflexionar sobre la vocación cristiana, asumida como un proyecto de vida querido y amado por Dios, descrito y manifiesto en el testimonio de hombres y mujeres que, conociendo a Jesucristo, han transmitido por generaciones la fe que nos gloriamos de profesar. En ella confesamos que el ser humano creado por Dios y para Dios, encuentra la voluntad de Dios inscrita en su corazón: “La razón más alta de la dignidad humana consiste en la vocación a la comunión con Dios”. (CEC n.27)

Es necesario que, reconociendo este llamado, podamos recibir con gratitud las enseñanzas de Jesús, quién nos muestra la esencia del discipulado: todo discípulo es enviado a proclamar la novedad del Reino de Dios. Las enseñanzas del Evangelio de este domingo (Marcos 9, 38-48) abren la mirada discipular para que nos centremos en un objetivo común; que el mundo

conozca que somos de Cristo y que en él todos podemos librarnos del mal y llegar al Reino prometido. Así en el diálogo de Jesús con Juan, encontramos enseñanzas que generan en nosotros nuevas relaciones.

El Evangelio pone en evidencia lo que causa asombro en el discípulo. Cómo es posible que alguien que no pertenece al grupo de los enviados, este expulsando demonios en su nombre. Aquí tendremos que fijarnos que lo importante es que, para poder vencer las obras del mal, es necesario invocar el nombre de Jesús. Quién invoca su nombre y se identifica con él, como la hacemos al llamarnos cristianos, tiene una responsabilidad que se manifiesta en la respuesta al discípulo: “No se lo prohíban, porque no hay ninguno que haga milagros en mi nombre, que luego sea capaz de hablar mal de mí” (Mc 9,39). Aquí la pregunta fundamental es si en nuestra vida cotidiana, hablamos y actuamos en nombre de Cristo. Para fortalecernos en el testimonio, el Señor, describe la manera en que nuestra vida se fortalece; corrigiendo las situaciones que nos conducen a optar por el mal, es decir renunciando al pecado. Para ello nos anima señalando la meta: la vida eterna.

Pidamos al Señor que, al meditar en su Palabra, las relaciones con nuestros hermanos se establezcan desde el agradecimiento, porque es él quien nos permite que en la vida social y personal sea glorificado su nombre.

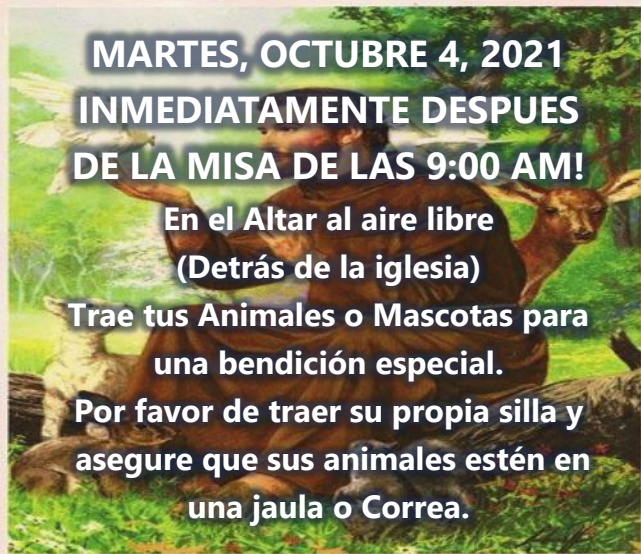
