

## **NEW BEGINNINGS**



Today is the First Sunday of Advent, and a new liturgical year has begun. Jesus himself tells us: "Stay awake." But why do we need to remain "awake"? This is a perfect time for new beginnings as we understand that the Lord, who came more than 2,000 years ago, is coming back, and we must be ready to receive him again in our lives.

In today's Gospel, St. Matthew makes a big statement about the certain or imminent coming of Jesus. As believers, we must prepare our world well to watch for him. His coming is not the

destruction of the world like so many others without serious discernment or prayer. As good Catholics and mature people in faith, we are called to expect the second coming of Christ with serious preparation because any day, any moment, could be the final coming of the Lord for all of us. To watch for him is to constantly repent for all our sins, to receive the sacraments of reconciliation and Holy Eucharist frequently, and to make our emblem of life the most important of the commandments: "Love God with all our hearts and our neighbor as we love ourselves."

Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. St. Paul tells us in the second reading that it is time to awaken from our sleep, for our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.


Advent is a time to reflect on what's truly important in our lives and prepare to meet Jesus and welcome him into our lives.

We should ask ourselves, "If I changed some of my habits or activities would this give me a bit more time to grow closer to God?" Only we know what we must change, what must restart again in our relationship with God and our brothers and sisters. Our minimal effort is a great gift to God and a new beginning that, in this Advent season, will help us grow in holiness. If we give up something wrong each week or correct a defect at the end of these four weeks of Advent, we will see great fruits of salvation in our lives.

Las Posadas is a Christmas celebration in Mexico that lasts from December 16 to December 23 each year. The people of Mexico act out the story from the Bible when Mary and Joseph visited Bethlehem and Jesus was born.

In the tradition of Las Posadas, families visit different homes each of the nine nights. The people inside the homes will play the part of innkeepers. The people visiting will play the part of pregrinos or pilgrims. They are looking for a place to stay. The families share a feast of special Mexican foods prepared for the celebration. Some children are chosen to dress up as Joseph & Mary.

They also break piñatas and get candy and gifts. People go to church, say prayers, and sing Christmas songs in Spanish.

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## SAINT OF THE WEEK: ANDREW



Andrew was St. Peter's brother, and both were called to be disciples of Jesus. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

**Reflection:** As in the case of all the apostles except Peter and John, the Gospels give us little about the holiness of Andrew. He was an apostle. That is enough. He was called personally by Jesus to proclaim the Good News, to heal with Jesus' power, and to share his life and death. Holiness today is no different. It is a gift that includes a call to be concerned about the Kingdom, an outgoing attitude that wants nothing more than to share the riches of Christ with all people.

## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT SYMBOLISM & WREATH CANDLE



The word "<u>Advent</u>" comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming." In the 4th and 5th centuries, Advent was a time of preparation for the baptism of new Christians. Christians would spend 40 days in <u>prayer</u> and fasting to prepare for the celebration that accompanied the baptism of new believers.

Over time, Advent was connected to the coming of Christ. Originally, Christians used this term to reference Christ's second coming, but by the Middle Ages, Advent was connected to Christ's first coming that we celebrate at Christmas.

Today, we celebrate Advent over the four weeks leading up to Christmas each year. This year we begin Advent on November 27 and end this season of prayerful anticipation on December 24.

Advent season is an invitation to set your mind off of the stresses of the year. We can take our focus off of the crazy hustle that can be associated with the Christmas season, which often threatens to produce more hassle than delight. Advent is a chance to focus our thoughts on the gift God has given us in his son Jesus who stepped down from Heaven and took the form of a man so that we might believe.

The tradition for the first Sunday of Advent includes lighting the candle of hope.

This candle of hope symbolizes promises delivered through the prophets from God and the hope we have in Christ. God crafted a great rescue plan that he lays out in Scripture. This plan foretells years in advance the arrival of Christ. The Bible also gives us a glimpse of the future and promises that God will come down to create a new heaven and Earth.

This first Sunday of Advent, we read, pray, and reflect on the hope God's plan gives us (foretold by the prophets and fulfilled by the life and death of Christ), and we meditate on the promise of Christ's coming glory-filled return.

There are three suggested Scripture Readings for the First Sunday of Advent:

#### <u>Isaiah 64:1-5</u>

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down so that the mountains would quake at your presence—as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make your name known to your adversaries so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, and the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past, no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways.

#### Psalm 80:1-7

Please listen, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph's descendants like a flock. O God, enthroned above the cherubim, display your radiant glory to Ephraim, Benjamin, and Manasseh. Show us your mighty power. Come to rescue us! Turn us again to yourself, O God. Make your face shine down upon us. Only then will we be saved. O LORD God of Heaven's Armies, how long will you be angry with our prayers? You have fed us with sorrow and made us drink tears by the bucketful. You have made us the scorn of neighboring nations. Our enemies treat us as a joke. Turn us again to yourself, O God of Heaven's Armies. Make your face shine down upon us. Only then will we be saved.

#### <u>Psalm 80:17-19</u>

But let your hand be upon the one at your right hand, the one whom you made strong for yourself. Then we will never turn back from you; give us life, and we will call on your name. Restore us, O LORD God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

seria preparación porque cualquier día, cualquier momento, puede ser la venida final del Señor para todos nosotros. Velar por él es arrepentirnos constantemente de todos nuestros pecados, recibir con frecuencia los sacramentos de la reconciliación y la Sagrada Eucaristía, y hacer de nuestro emblema de vida el más importante de los mandamientos: "Amar a Dios con todo nuestro corazón y a nuestro prójimo como amarnos a nosotros mismos."

El Adviento es un tiempo de preparación para la venida del Señor. San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura que es hora de despertar de nuestro sueño, porque nuestra salvación está ahora más cerca que cuando creímos por primera vez.

El Adviento es un tiempo para reflexionar sobre lo que es verdaderamente importante en nuestras vidas y prepararnos para encontrarnos con Jesús y darle la bienvenida a nuestras vidas.

Deberíamos preguntarnos: "Si cambiara algunos de mis hábitos o actividades, ¿esto me daría un poco más de tiempo para acercarme más a Dios?" Solo nosotros sabemos lo que debemos cambiar, lo que debemos recomenzar en nuestra relación con Dios y con nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Nuestro mínimo esfuerzo es un gran regalo a Dios y un nuevo comienzo que, en este tiempo de Adviento, nos ayudará a crecer en santidad. Si renunciamos a algo mal cada semana o corregimos un defecto al final de estas cuatro semanas de Adviento, veremos grandes frutos de salvación en nuestra vida.




