JESUS STRETCHED OUT HIS HAND



Ash Wednesday is on February 17. With that celebration, we will begin the Season of Lent, a special time in which we reflect on the paths that lead us to better live our Christian commitments, which are strengthened by remembering the work of God in our lives. The greatest gift that human beings can receive is the Redemption offered to us in Jesus. In today's Gospel, St. Mark (Mk 1:40-45) helps us to prepare ourselves properly for the sign of conversion which we will receive next Wednesday, "the ashes."

In the evangelical context, whoever suffered from a disease such as leprosy, in addition to the suffering of his pain, which was visibly present in his body, had an obligation to warn others that he suffered from it (Lev 13:1-46). This pain and self-marginalization is the one suffered by the man who approached Jesus with firm faith. In our faith, we understand that Jesus came into this world to re-establish the Father's plan in his creatures. This is his redeeming sacrifice (prepared in his preaching and all his gestures of mercy) to heal man, marked on body and spirit by the consequences of sin.

To be healed of our diseases, following the example of the leper described in the Gospel, each one of us must approach recognizing our disease with the full assurance that Jesus can heal us. To assist us with this process, we offer the season of Lent. To follow this path well is to understand that Jesus is the merciful hand of the Father extended to us, to lead us to the eternal Passover. If we approach with confidence, we will also see him extending his hand and saying, "I do will it. Be made clean" (Mk 1:41).

In search of our salvation, as we begin Lent, let us participate in charity and prayer. Let us remember that the bell of the "Catholic Appeal" of our diocese is a very special way to participate in the solidarity dimension of our Church, and the path of consecration to St. Joseph that begins on February 15, an opportunity to strengthen ourselves in prayer.

POPE FRANCIS



The first Pope of the Americas hails from Argentina. Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, 76, was elected the 266th pope on March 13, 2013 and took the name Pope Francis.

The Jesuit Archbishop of Buenos Aires is a prominent figure throughout the continent, yet remains a simple pastor who is deeply loved by his diocese, throughout which he has traveled extensively on the underground and by bus during the 15 years of his episcopal ministry.

"My people are poor and I am one of them", he has said more than once, explaining his decision to live in an apartment and cook his own supper. He has always advised his priests to show mercy, apostolic courage and to keep their doors open to everyone. The worst thing that could happen to the Church, he has said on various occasions, "is what de Lubac called spiritual worldliness", which means, "being self-centered". And when he speaks of social justice, he calls people first of all to pick up the *Catechism*, to rediscover the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. His project is simple: if you follow Christ, you understand "trampling upon a person's dignity is a serious sin." *Orlando Website: Feb. 2021*

ST. OF THE WEEK: ST. ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE



A native of Grenoble, France, Rose was in her teens when she learned of the missions to the natives of the New World. Longing to be part of them, she joined the Visitation nuns, but the Revolution intervened, and the convent was dissolved. After several years at home, she entered the Society of the Sacred Heart under foundress St. Madeleine Sophie Barat.

Rose begged to be allowed to go on mission, but Barat insisted that she wait. About twelve years passed before she was able to set out with four companions on the arduous journey across the Atlantic and up the Mississippi. After the first year a permanent home was found for them at Florissant, Missouri, where a school for poor children was built. Rose pressed forward to found more schools, welcome novices into the order and staff an orphanage, despite the persistent lack of funds, resistance from naysayers, and the ever-present language barrier.

When Rose was 72, the call came at last to serve in a Native American mission at Sugar Creek, Kansas. By this time, she was too old to do much but kneel in the chapel. After 2 years, she returned to Missouri, where she died at 83.

"She was the St. Francis of Assisi of the Society," a contemporary said. "Everything in and about her was stamped with the seal of a crucified life."



DID YOU KNOW?

Bishop John Noonan sees his ministry as a priest and bishop as a mandate from God. His Episcopal motto "God before me and God with me" originates in Exodus when Moses was leading the chosen people out of slavery and into the Promised Land. That same prayer was spoken by St. Patrick as he preached the Gospel in Ireland. Like Moses and St. Patrick, Bishop Noonan, fifth bishop of Orlando, is following God's call to serve his people.

Bishop John Noonan was born in Limerick, Ireland, and immigrated to New York at the age of 18 and later relocated to Miami where his calling to the priesthood led him to St. John Vianney College Seminary. After graduation, he attended St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary and graduated with a Master of Divinity in 1983. On September 23, 1983, he was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Miami, and received his first pastoral assignment as parochial vicar, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, Pompano Beach.

From early in his priesthood, he was seen as a humble servant willing to do whatever needed in service to the Lord. He excelled at leading young people to Christ and became chaplain for Youth Ministry in Broward County between 1985 and 1987. He then assisted young men discerning a vocation to the priesthood as Dean of Men, St. John Vianney College Seminary from 1989 to 1993.

He continued to serve in the area of education forming young people in the faith and leading Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Miami. He served as supervising principal of Msgr. Edward Pace High School, Miami Gardens, from 1993 to 1994 and supervising principal of St. Brendan High School, Miami, from 1994 to 1996.

Having a keen interest in education, Bishop Noonan pursued additional studies and received a Master of Education from Boston College in 1996. He then assumed a leadership role at the seminary he once attended, serving as Rector/President, St. John Vianney College Seminary between 1996 and 2005. He also assisted priests with encouragement and support as Director of Priestly Life and Ministry between 2001 and 2010.

Pope John Paul II conferred the title of monsignor upon Reverend John Noonan on October 22, 2001. Pope Benedict XVI named him auxiliary bishop of Miami, June 21, 2005 and he was ordained to the episcopacy, August 24, 2005 at the Cathedral of St. Mary, Miami. The Holy Father appointed him bishop of Orlando on October 23, 2010, and his installation ceremony occurred on December 16, 2010, at the Basilica of the National Shrine of Mary, Queen of the Universe.

Bishop Noonan serves as the Episcopal Liaison to Catholic Volunteers in Florida, an organization dedicated to providing people of all faiths the opportunity to volunteer for a year and live out their faith by serving the diverse needs of the people of Florida. Catholic volunteers work towards justice and peace, transforming the community they serve as well as themselves.

Bishop John Noonan is fluent in Gaelic, English and Spanish.



JESUS NOS EXTIENDE SU MANO



El próximo 17 de febrero, es miércoles de ceniza y con ésta celebración daremos inicio al Tiempo de Cuaresma, tiempo especial en el que reflexionamos sobre los caminos que nos conducen a vivir mejor nuestros compromisos cristianos, los cuales se fortalecen al recordar la obra de Dios en nuestra vida. El mayor regalo que el ser humano puede recibir es la Redención que se nos ofrece en Jesús. El texto de san Marcos de este domingo (Mc 1, 40-45) nos ayuda a prepararnos convenientemente para el signo de conversión que recibiremos el próximo miércoles, "las cenizas".

En el contexto evangélico, quien padecía una enfermedad como la lepra, además del sufrimiento propio de su dolencia, visiblemente presente en su cuerpo, tenía la obligación de advertir a los otros que la padecía (Lv 13, 1-46). Esta situación dolorosa y que producía a su vez marginación, es la que padecía el hombre que se acerca a Jesús con una fe firme. En nuestra fe, entendemos que Jesús ha venido a este mundo para restablecer el plan del Padre en sus criaturas. En esto consiste su sacrificio redentor, (preparado en su predicación y en todos sus gestos de misericordia) sanar al hombre, marcado en el cuerpo y en el espíritu por las consecuencias del pecado.

Para ser sanado de sus enfermedades, a ejemplo del leproso descrito en el Evangelio, cada uno de nosotros debe acercarse reconociendo su enfermedad y con la plena seguridad de que Jesús puede curarle. Para ayudarnos en este proceso se nos ofrece el Tiempo de Cuaresma. Recorrer bien este camino, es entender que Jesús es la mano misericordiosa del Padre que se extiende sobre nosotros, para conducirnos a la Pascua eterna. Si nos acercamos con confianza también lo veremos extendiendo su mano y diciendo "Sí, quiero: sana" (Mc 1,41).

Para buscar nuestra salvación, al empezar la cuaresma, participemos activamente en la caridad y la oración. Recordemos que la campaña del "Llamado Católico" de nuestra diócesis es una manera muy especial de participar en la dimensión solidaria de nuestra Iglesia, y el camino de consagración a san José que inicia este 15 de febrero, una oportunidad para fortalecernos en la oración.





ST. DE LA SEMANA: ST. ROSA FILIPINA DUCHESNE

Nacida en Grenoble, Francia, Rose era una adolescente cuando se enteró de las misiones a los nativos del Nuevo Mundo. Anhelando formar parte de ellos, se unió a las monjas de la Visitación, pero la Revolución intervino y el convento se disolvió. Después de varios años en casa, ingresó en la Sociedad del Sagrado Corazón bajo la dirección de Santa Magdalena Sophie Barat, fundadora.

Rose suplicó que le permitieran ir a la misión, pero Barat insistió en que esperara. Pasaron unos doce años antes de que pudiera emprender con cuatro compañeros el arduo viaje a través del Atlántico y remontando el Mississippi. Después del primer año se les encontró un hogar permanente en Florissant, Missouri, donde se construyó una escuela para niños pobres. Rose siguió adelante para fundar más escuelas, dar la bienvenida a los novatos a la orden y formar un orfanato, a pesar de la persistente falta de fondos, la resistencia de los detractores y la barrera del idioma siempre presente.

Cuando Rose tenía 72 años, llegó por fin el llamado a servir en una misión de nativos americanos en Sugar Creek, Kansas. Para entonces, ella era demasiado mayor para hacer mucho más que arrodillarse en la capilla. Después de 2 años, regresó a Missouri, donde murió a los 83 años.

"Ella era la San Francisco de Asís de la Sociedad", dijo un contemporáneo. "Todo en ella y alrededor de ella estaba estampado con el sello de una vida crucificada". Padre Eterno, por intercesión de Santa Rosa Filipina Duchesne, ayúdame a sobrellevar con confianza las dificultades presentes.
