

GOD SHOWS US HIS FACE



On this second Sunday of Lent, the Word of God invites us to climb the mountain, a special place of encounter with God. In each moment before the divine presence, the human being acquires a deep meaning of his life in such a way that it leads him to strengthen his position in this world. This is how we can see it in at least two sacred stories presented to us in this time of Lent, to strengthen our practices of sacrifice and prayer.

On the first hand, Abraham went to the mountain to offer the sacrifice to God (Gen 22:1-18). We are surprised by Abraham's willingness to obey God in everything, to discern his ways, and to this end, nothing is set aside. Precisely when his intentions are exposed, the signs that indicate God's intended offering appear in his presence. He himself provides the lamb for the sacrifice. Also, in our life, we can only offer to the Lord what we have received. So, the sacrifice pleasing to God is the blessings that we have received from Him and with which we serve in the community. We are the depositaries of the promise made to Abraham: "In your descendants, all the peoples of the earth will be blessed because you obeyed my words" (Gen 22:18).

In the second story, we witness the power of prayer on Mount Tabor. The events that the Scriptures tell us (Mk 9:2-10) we call the Transfiguration. At this moment, Jesus presents himself differently. He lets his disciples see the splendor of his Spirit that is reaffirmed in the voice of the Father, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him" (Mk 9:7b). It is a moment of revelation, which produces in his disciples the joy of meeting God and prepares them to face all the trials that will come. In prayer, we too are called to establish that dialogue of friendship with God, where our spirit is filled with his presence and can return to daily life to communicate the joy of the encounter.

In this second week of Lent, let us prepare ourselves so that we can contemplate Jesus crucified. And strengthened in his surrender without measure, we can offer in prayer the sacrifice pleasing to our God.


CONSECRATION OF ST. JOSEPH

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FISH FRY



St. Fintan of Clonenagh, Ireland, came from Leinster and at an early age studied with St. Columba of Tir da Glas. As he entered manhood, Fintan embraced an austere simple life at Clonenagh. It was his habit to eat only barley bread and herbs and to drink only muddy water.

So many men were drawn to Fintan that he eventually founded a monastery for them, with a Rule that was almost as strict as his own regimen. After a time, many of the monks found the diet which entirely excluded all meat, butter, and milk - too severe. St. Canice, who lived nearby, shared their concerns. When at last Canice came to the monastery to talk to Fintan about it, Fintan readily agreed to relax his rules for the sake of the health of the monks.

Another time, some clansmen who were celebrating their victory over a rival clan deposited the heads of their enemies near the monastery. Fintan immediately directed the monks to bury the heads as close as possible to the monastery cemetery. When the monks wondered at this, Fintan reassured them that he was entrusting these men's souls to the intercession of the holy ones who were buried there, confident that through their prayers, "these men shall not be condemned on the day of judgment.....We hope clemency for their souls."

WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is a time of prayer and penance, when Christ wants to lead us back to our baptismal promises of dying to sin and of living for God.



WHEN IS LENT?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues until the afternoon of Holy Thursday. It runs for about 40 days.

WHY 40 DAYS? The "40 days" (not including Sundays) of fasting, prayer, and penitence before Easter reflect Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness.

WHAT SHOULD WE DO DURING LENT?

1. Turn away from our sins and turn back to God. Detach from habits and tendencies that are contrary to God's will. Lent is a time of conversion.

2. Open our hearts to our Father, so that we may live with Christ for God. Jesus is calling us to be people of praise and prayer, and living signs of his love for all.

"This time of fasting opens the gates of heaven to us. Let us welcome it and pray that when Easter comes we may share the joy of the risen Lord."

UN LUGAR ESPECIAL PARA EL ENCUENTRO



En este segundo Domingo de Cuaresma, la Palabra de Dios nos invita a subir al monte, lugar de encuentro con Dios. En cada momento ante la presencia divina, el ser humano adquiere un profundo sentido de su vida, de tal manera que le conduce a fortalecer su puesto en este mundo. Así lo podemos ver, al menos en dos relatos sagrados que se nos presentan este Domingo, para fortalecer nuestras prácticas de sacrificio y oración cuaresmal.

En el primer relato, encontramos a Abraham dirigiéndose al monte para ofrecer el sacrificio a Dios (Gn 22,1-18). Nos sorprende la disposición que tiene Abraham para obedecer a Dios en todo, para discernir sus caminos y en este propósito no se reserva nada. Precisamente cuando sus intenciones quedan al descubierto, aparecen ante su presencia los signos que le señalan la ofrenda querida por Dios. Él mismo le proporciona el cordeiro para el sacrificio. También en nuestra vida, solo le podemos ofrecer al Señor, lo que dé el mismo hemos recibido. Así que el sacrificio agradable a Dios, son las bendiciones que de Él hemos recibido y con las cuales servimos en la comunidad. Somos depositarios de la promesa hecha a Abraham: "En tu descendencia serán bendecidos todos los pueblos de la tierra, porque obedeciste a mis palabras" (Gn 22,18)

En el segundo relato, en el monte Tabor, somos testigos de la fuerza de la oración. El hecho que nos cuentan las Escrituras (Mc 9, 2-10) le llamamos Transfiguración. En este momento Jesús se presenta diferente, deja que sus discípulos puedan ver el esplendor de su Espíritu que se reafirma en la voz del Padre "Este es mi Hijo amado, escúchenlo". Es un momento de revelación, que produce en sus discípulos la alegría del encuentro con Dios y los prepara para afrontar todas las pruebas que sobrevendrán. También nosotros en la Oración estamos llamados a establecer ese diálogo de amistad con Dios, en donde nuestro espíritu se llena de su presencia y puede regresar a la vida cotidiana para comunicar la alegría del encuentro.

Dispongámonos para que, en esta segunda semana de Cuaresma, podamos contemplar a Jesús crucificado. Y fortalecidos, en su entrega sin medida, podamos ofrecer en oración el sacrificio agradable a nuestro Dios.

SANTO DE LA SEMANA: FINTAN



San Fintan de Clonenagh, Irlanda, vino de Leinster y a temprana edad estudió con San Columba de Tir da Glas. Cuando entró en la edad adulta, Fintan adoptó una vida austera y sencilla en Clonenagh. Tenía la costumbre de comer solo pan de cebada y hierbas y beber solo agua turbia.

Tantos hombres se sintieron atraídos por Fintan que finalmente fundó un monasterio para ellos, con una Regla que era casi tan estricta como su propio régimen. Después de un tiempo, muchos de los monjes encontraron que la dieta que excluía por completo toda la carne, mantequilla y leche era demasiado severa. St. Canice, que vivía cerca, compartió sus preocupaciones. Cuando por fin Canice llegó al monasterio para hablar con Fintan al respecto, Fintan accedió de inmediato a relajar sus reglas por el bien de la salud de los monjes.

En otra ocasión, algunos miembros del clan que estaban celebrando su victoria sobre un clan rival depositaron las cabezas de sus enemigos cerca del monasterio. Fintan inmediatamente ordenó a los monjes que enterraran las cabezas lo más cerca posible del cementerio del monasterio. Cuando los monjes se maravillaron de esto, Fintan les aseguró que estaba confiando las almas de estos hombres a la intercesión de los santos que estaban enterrados allí, confiando en que a través de sus oraciones, "estos hombres no serán condenados en el día del juicio ... Esperamos clemencia para sus almas". *Magnificat: febrero 2021*


