

JESUS STRENGTHENS HIS DISCIPLES



Last year, we began Holy Week with a sad heart because we experienced the anxiety that thirst produces, and the means to quench it were scarce. I am referring to the spiritual thirst that every penitent manifests after crossing the Lenten desert. That day, all the temples were closed. When we started our celebrations, the powerful sign of what was happening was not manifested by shaking a palm in our hands, but instead, it was suspended on the doors of our homes. Thus, we could declare that we would still receive Jesus (who no longer entered the streets of Jerusalem riding a donkey and where the crowd welcomed him as king) with devotion if we could not go to the temple. But, it was he who hastened to fill us with hope in the intimacy of our homes. Obviously, it was not an ordinary Holy Week.

This year, we also continue to maintain some security measures in our celebrations. Still, we are blessed to go to the temple to strengthen our hope, alongside brothers and sisters, who share the same faith and the same baptism, united to thank God for the way he has accompanied us, especially in this year of trial.

On the way to Jerusalem and before the fixed time of our redemption by his death on the Cross would arrive, Jesus prepared his disciples to overcome this suffering, which they faced amid anguish, fear, and desolation. The fulfillment the bloody death announced is understood in light of the revelation of his glory to them in the transfiguration on Mount Tabor. It was not just another Easter, and for that, everything shared with the Master would help them. With faith, we, too, celebrate the mysteries that summon us this Week. We need to remember the way in which God has encouraged us during this year and accept the invitation that Jesus makes to his disciples: "watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation."

Just as Jesus received the tribute that the people offered him upon entering Jerusalem, he will also welcome the manifestations of our faith and love that we present to him. Let us pray that oriented in the generosity of service, the Lord does not find the fervor of one day, but the fidelity of those who accept and are grateful for the gift of Salvation that He offers us.

HIS VICTORY: OUR VICTORY

As Catholics, we call the week of the commemoration of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus the Major Week. We start this celebration on Palm Sunday in which together we proclaim Jesus the King, the king of our lives. With palms and branches in our hands, we sign: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the king of Israel." Holy Thursday is a beautiful day to remember the institution of the Holy Eucharist, the priesthood, and the commandment of love. Good Friday follows where we walk with Jesus to Calvary, and we close this Major Week with the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus, the triumph of Jesus over death.

All the prophecies about the Messiah are accomplished in Jesus Christ by his passion, death, and resurrection. He makes us co-heirs of life everlasting. The entire week we will have important events that will help us to meditate and contemplate the love of God through Jesus Christ; he has opened the gates of heaven, making way for our sin to be forgiven and guide us into the presence of God (Rm 5:8).

During the celebration of the Jewish Passover, they used to sacrifice the Lamb according to the prescriptions of the law, but in Jesus, the Lamb of God, becomes the perfect sacrifice in which we are cleansed of all our sins, and it makes us worthy of life everlasting.

This week: We, a people of faith, are invited to make it very special. We are invited to utilize the opportunities to pray and to contemplate the mystery of our salvation from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. This is a good time to feed our souls and build strong foundations that will make us a new creation.

WHAT IS HOLY WEEK?



What is Holy Week? Holy Week is an important time for Christians throughout the world. Holy Week, the final week of Lent, begins on Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter. Holy Week is a time when Catholics gather to remember and participate in the Passion of Jesus Christ. The Passion was the final period of Christ's life in Jerusalem. It spans from when He arrived in Jerusalem to when He was crucified.

Palm Sunday recalls Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem. Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the re-enactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem with a procession. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem, riding a donkey to the praise of the townspeople who laid palms or small branches in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Holy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus consecrated bread and wine. In the morning, bishops typically gather with priests from their diocese for the Chrism Mass or a day near Holy Week that works best for the Archdiocese. They bless holy oils during the Mass. The washing of the feet takes place during the Mass of the Lord's Supper in the evening.

Good Friday is one of the darkest days of the year for Catholics. It covers Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. His death and burial are also memorialized. The events of Good Friday are commemorated in the Stations of the Cross, a 14-step devotion, traditionally prayed during Lent and especially on Good Friday.

Good Friday is a day of fasting within the Church. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist. Communion comes from hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday. Church bells are silent. Altars are left bare. The solemn, muted atmosphere is preserved until the Easter Vigil.

Holy Saturday remembers the day which Jesus spent in the grave resting. The Easter Vigil begins at sunset on Holy Saturday because the new liturgical day begins at sunset. This year, the service will begin at 8:30 PM outside the church, where an Easter fire is kindled, the Paschal candle is blessed, and then lit. This Paschal candle will be used throughout the Easter Season, remaining in the sanctuary of the church and throughout the coming year at baptisms and funerals, reminding all that Christ is our life and light. After the conclusion of the Liturgy of the Word, the water of the baptismal font is solemnly blessed, and any catechumens and candidates for full communion are initiated into the Church.

HOLY THURSDAY

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday of Holy Week. It represents the day that the Jewish Passover was celebrated in the Bible Story of Easter. On that day, Jesus had his last meal with his friends and followers before he was killed. This meal is now known as "The Last Supper." At the meal, Jesus and his friends would have followed the Jewish Passover custom of eating roast lamb and unleavened bread (matzah) and drinking red wine. However, Jesus gave the bread and wine a special meaning. When they got to the part of the meal when the Bread was eaten and the wine drunk, Jesus said that these would be a symbol of his body and blood to his followers to help them remember that through his death, our sins are forgiven. Maundy comes from Latin and is the word for "Command." At the meal that Jesus had with his followers, he told them: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (John 13:34). Also, at the same meal, Jesus told/commanded his followers to think of him when they ate bread and drank wine. This is very important to Christians and is now remembered in the Christian service known as Communion, Mass, or Eucharist. Jesus washed his disciples' feet before the meal to show that it is important to be helpful and serve others. People in Jesus' time wore open sandals, and the streets were very dirty, so washing people's feet was normally done as you entered the house by the lowest servant who got the worst jobs! After the meal, Jesus and some of his friends went to a nearby garden called Gethsemane to pray. Later in the evening, he was betrayed by one of His disciples called Judas. Jesus was arrested and taken to trial. In some countries, priests wash the feet of church goers at the Maundy Thursday services to remember what Jesus had done. In some Catholic countries, ladies wear black on Maundy Thursday as a sign of mourning for Jesus to remember he died on Good Friday.

GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday is a very important day for all Christians. On Good Friday, Christians remember that Jesus died for everyone. He was crucified by the Romans on a hill outside Jerusalem, although he had not done anything wrong. When a person was crucified, they were tied and nailed by the wrists and feet to a large wooden cross or scaffold and left to die. This is why a cross is often used as a symbol of the Christian faith. Good Friday comes from old English when Good meant Holy. So you could call Good Friday, "Holy Friday." There are parades all over the world to celebrate and remember Good Friday. In Spain and some other countries, people who are very sorry for their wrongdoings (called 'Penitents') walk through the streets wearing long robes with hoods and carrying a big cross of wood. In some Central and South American countries, there will be a procession of statues to the church before the service. These are often statues of Jesus, Mary, and other saints. In most Anglican churches, there are no flowers or altar cloths.

WHAT'S UP IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION?

El año anterior iniciamos la Semana Santa con el corazón triste, porque experimentamos la ansiedad que produce la sed y eran escasos los medios para calmarla. Me refiero a la sed espiritual, que todo penitente manifiesta después de cruzar el desierto cuaresmal. Llegaba el cumplimiento de la muerte cruenta anunciada antes de revelarles su gloria en la transfiguración en el monte Tabor. No se trataba de una Pascua más y para ello, todo lo compartido con el Maestro les habría de ayudar. Así también nosotros, para celebrar con fe los misterios que nos convocan en esta Semana, necesitamos recordar la manera en que Dios nos ha alentado durante este año, y aceptar la invitación que hace Jesús a sus discípulos: oren y velen para que no caigan en la ententación.

Como Jesús acogió el homenaje que el pueblo le ofrece al entrar en Jerusalén, así acogerá también las manifestaciones de nuestras fe y amor que le presentemos. Roguemos para que orientados en la generosidad del servicio, el Señor no encuentre el fervor de un día, sino la fidelidad de quienes aceptan y agradecen el don de la Salvación que Él nos ofrece.



