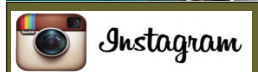

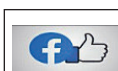

THE SEED FOR ETERNAL LIFE



In this Sunday's Gospel, Christ uses two parables: The mustard seed that became a giant tree and the other about the man who scattered seed. These stories describe us and call us to the kingdom of God. Jesus, the teacher or the master, uses dynamic examples to approach people of all times to help us comprehend the mysteries of heaven better and to feel our Heavenly Father very close to our lives. Parables have been used because, in this way, they cause us to reflect and meditate upon our relationship with God.

The kingdom he invites us to is a simple and peaceful one that grows gradually in our hearts, especially when we live in communion with Him. God owns, controls, and sustains everything within the kingdom.

We sometimes think that the protagonist of one of the parables is the sower who planted the seeds. But the reality is that the core of it is the seed, which sprouts almost in a magical way. This process is gradual but will grow until it is completely visible and perceptible for everyone who will use it (shade, wood, food, oxygen, or birds). For me, the mystery around a seed becomes the real example of how our God makes all things perfect and peaceful for us.

In the same way, we can think for a moment about what happened to the seed of faith in our lives at our baptism. We have received the seed of our faith, and as in the parable today about the mustard seed, the smallest of seeds which grows and becomes a big tree, our faith is represented by the small size of the seed from which it grew. Sometimes we don't understand at all the importance and what happened the day that we were baptized, but soon and slowly, the seed of faith starts to develop, giving us the joy of the love of God in our hearts even though that in the beginning, we cannot understand the mystery of the love of God completely.

The seed of our baptism is very insignificant to our eyes; we use water, oils, and a candle. The rite is very short, but the fruits that we can harvest once it has grown in our lives of faith are completely countless because the faith that we have received at our baptism becomes our support and the grace that gives us strength, especially in difficult moments.

Let us take care of our seed of faith so that we may always harvest abundant fruits of everlasting life.

WE NEED USHERS



Ushers are asked to arrive at least 15 to 20 minutes early.

Before Mass: Ushers greet and welcome Mass attendees at the church entrance ways. They serve as representatives of the church, and therefore their demeanor and body language should reflect its hospitality. They take note of any known doctors or nurses in attendance, should anyone need medical

assistance during the Mass. Also, they assist attendees as needed with finding a seat, paying particular attention to those with special needs. During crowded services, assisting with seating is especially important.

During Mass: Ushers sit at the back of the church and participate fully in the service. When late-comers arrive, ushers help minimize disruptions by asking them to momentarily stand by during the readings and the priest's homily. Ushers are also responsible for passing around the collection baskets. During communion, they assist the Eucharistic Ministers by pointing out those who cannot proceed through the communion line and therefore need communion.

WHAT'S UP IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION?



The Office of Religious Education wishes to announce the following:

2. Enrollment is still open for Pre-Confirmation and Confirmation students.
3. Those who have not settled their dues for the school year 2020-2021 are requested to come and settle at the Office of Religious Education Office as soon as possible.
4. Students who are to receive the sacrament of Confirmation this coming September 11, 2021, must submit the full name of their sponsor. The confirmandi is limited to only one sponsor.
5. Those first communicants who failed to get their certificate on May 22 may come to the office to get it.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. AMBROSE



Born of an outstanding Roman noble family, Ambrose rose to become a lawyer and then governor of a Roman province that had its center in Milan. He was still a catechumen when he attempted to quell the raucous crowd gathered to elect a new bishop and unexpectedly found himself the crowd's choice. He was baptized, ordained, and consecrated in quick succession. Ambrose prudently navigated a variety of political situations, all the while providing catechesis for a vast number of catechumens and countering the widespread Arian heresy.

When the Arians succeeded in getting the Emperor Valentinian to hand over to them the basilica outside the walls of the city, Ambrose made a decisive stand. He boldly entered the church with many of the faithful at the outset of the Holy Week liturgies. Soon afterward, the emperor's armed guard surrounded the church, trapping the bishop and people inside. Ambrose urged the people to fervent prayer and sought to stave off their exhaustion by introducing the antiphonal singing of hymns and psalms, a practice that would become enshrined in the West in the divine office. Ambrose's spiritual son, Augustine of Hippo, quotes four of Ambrose's hymns, and scholars have identified about a dozen thought to have been composed by him.

The men of his own time considered Ambrose the ideal bishop. He died in 397.

All-compassionate Father, through the intercession of St. Ambrose, help me to enter more fully into the prayers and hymns of the liturgy.

LA SEMILLA DE LA VIDA ETERNA



En el evangelio de este domingo, Cristo usa dos parábolas: la semilla de mostaza que se convirtió en un árbol gigante y la otra sobre el hombre que esparció la semilla. Estas historias nos describen y nos llaman al reino de Dios. Jesús, el maestro, usa ejemplos dinámicos para acercarse a personas de todos los tiempos para ayudarnos a comprender mejor los misterios del cielo y sentir a nuestro Padre Celestial muy cerca de nuestras vidas. Las parábolas se han utilizado porque, de esta manera, nos hacen reflexionar y meditar sobre nuestra relación con Dios.

El reino al que nos invita es sencillo y pacífico que crece gradualmente en nuestro corazón, especialmente cuando vivimos en comunión con él. Dios posee, controla y sostiene todo dentro del reino.

A veces pensamos que el protagonista de una de las parábolas es el sembrador que plantó las semillas. Pero la realidad es que su núcleo es la semilla, que brota casi de forma mágica. Este proceso es gradual pero crecerá hasta que sea completamente visible y perceptible para todos los que lo usarán (sombra, madera, comida, oxígeno o pájaros). Para mí, el misterio alrededor de una semilla se convierte en el ejemplo real de cómo nuestro Dios hace que todas las cosas sean perfectas y pacíficas para nosotros.

De la misma manera, podemos pensar por un momento en lo que le sucedió a la semilla de la fe en nuestras vidas en nuestro bautismo. Hemos recibido la semilla de nuestra fe, y como en la parábola de hoy sobre la semilla de mostaza, la más pequeña de las semillas que crece y se convierte en un gran árbol, nuestra fe está representada por la pequeña semilla que creció. A veces no entendemos para nada la importancia y lo que sucedió el día que nos bautizamos, pero pronto y lentamente, la semilla de la fe comienza a desarrollarse, dándonos el gozo del amor de Dios en nuestro corazón a pesar de que a principio, no podemos comprender completamente el misterio del amor de Dios.

La semilla de nuestro bautismo es muy insignificante a nuestros ojos; usamos agua, aceites y una vela. El rito es muy corto, pero los frutos que podemos cosechar una vez que ha crecido en nuestra vida de fe son completamente innumerables porque la fe que hemos recibido en nuestro bautismo se convierte en nuestro apoyo y la gracia que nos da fuerzas, especialmente en los momentos difíciles.

Cuidemos nuestra semilla de fe para que siempre podamos cosechar abundantes frutos de vida eterna.

SAN AMBROSIO



Nacido en el seno de una destacada familia noble romana, Ambrosio se convirtió en abogado y luego en gobernador de una provincia romana que tenía su centro en Milán. Todavía era un catecúmeno cuando intentó sofocar a la ruidosa multitud reunida para elegir un nuevo obispo e inesperadamente se encontró con la elección de la multitud. Fue bautizado, ordenado y consagrado en rápida sucesión. Ambrosio navegó con prudencia en una variedad de situaciones políticas, mientras proporcionaba catequesis a un gran número de catecúmenos y contrarrestaba la herejía arriana generalizada. Cuando los arrianos lograron que el emperador Valentiniano les entregara la basílica fuera de las murallas de la ciudad, Ambrosio tomó una posición decisiva. Entró audazmente en la Iglesia con muchos de los fieles al comienzo de las liturgias de Semana Santa. Poco después, la guardia armada del emperador rodeó la iglesia, atrapando al obispo y a la gente en el interior. Ambrosio instó a la gente a orar fer-

vientemente y trató de evitar su agotamiento introduciendo el canto a antifonal de himnos y salmos, una práctica que se consagraría en occidente en el oficio divino. El hijo espiritual de Ambrosio, Agustín de Hipona, cita cuatro de los himnos de Ambrosio, y los eruditos han identificado alrededor de una docena de pensamientos que fueron compuestos por él. Los hombres de su época consideraban a Ambrosio como el obispo ideal. Murió en 397. Padre compasivo, por intercesión de San Ambrosio, ayúdame a entrar más de lleno en las oraciones y los himnos de la liturgia.
