OUR STRENGTH IS GOD'S MESSAGE



On this Sunday, we are given the opportunity to consider a founding reality of our faith: God is attentive with his creation and specifically with the human being to whom he allows intelligence so that they can reflect and nurture their experience of faith. We know this based on the evidence of so many people who can bear witness to the efficacy of the Word of God that continues to encourage their sons and daughters on the journey of this life.

The prophet Jeremiah recorded the hope of a people who, forgotten by their leaders, wait for divine justice, and for this reason, he says, "the Lord, our justice" (Jr 23:6). The reality surpasses expectations because God does not show himself as a leader seated on his throne to apply his justice but rather approaches human realities, exercising his authority as a solicitous shepherd of his flock. The people of Israel understood that God's justice brings peace. This, as the fruit of justice, is given to perfection in the surrender of Jesus, who, knowing the difficulties of human life perfectly, shows in God the abundant source of divine mercy that reconciles us and leads us to true peace. This leads Saint Paul to say, "He is our peace" (Eph 2:14).

To continue his ministry, Jesus himself has chosen disciples sent to continue his work. He teaches them by his example, how they should exercise their ministry in the same way the Father supports him in carrying out his mission. Thus, the disciples also feel the Master, who supports them, indicating the precise moment to shepherd, rest, and pray. The work of Jesus goes far beyond comforting human needs; his mission is to make the Kingdom of God present and reveal the will of the Father.

By inviting the disciples to "come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile" (Mk 6:31), he wants to teach them to assume the signs that they have shown in his teaching. After witnessing the obvious signs of the presence of the Kingdom, it is necessary to reflect on them so that they strengthen the disciples in times of trial. We today must also take time to rekindle inside the constant presence of God, who approaches us, provides us with what we need, and invites us not to remain in the external signs of his mercy, but rather to take them so that they become moments that strengthen our Christian life.


VOCATION GIFT FROM GOD

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. WENDELIN OF TRIER



The 7th-century hermit Wendelin is famous for his cures of afflictions of cattle and his patronage of country folk and herdsmen. According to the tradition handed down to us, he was a youth of Scottish origin who, after making a pious pilgrimage to Rome, felt called to a solitary life. He settled in a remote spot in the diocese of Trier, Germany, where he lived in a simple hut.

One day, Wendelin was in the town begging for his bread when a nobleman accosted him. He wanted to know why a healthy young man was begging for bread that could go to the poor. The nobleman offered Wendelin a job on his farm, and the hermit, seeing this as an opportunity to mortify his own will, accepted. From that time, he occupied himself with the castle and the sheep. It is said that he often took his flock very far afield, but miraculously transported them each night.

Eventually, Wendelin took his leave from the farm and returned to the hermitage. He established a group of hermits who eventually formed the monastery of Tholey. Upon his death, many miracles were reported at his grave, and a chapel was erected on the spot. In the 14th century, the chapel was rebuilt by the bishop in Trier after Wendelin's intercession ended a deadly plague on cattle.

Father of mercies, through the intercession of Saint Wendelin, help me to do my job with attention and commitment.



WEEKLY REFLECTION OF THE EUCHARIST



"Unless you eat the flesh and drink the blood of the Son of Man, you will not have life in you" (Jn 6:53). We believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist because Jesus has said it and his word is Truth, and the Catholic Church, the body of Christ, faithfully transmits this truth to us. But what is the manner of this presence?

We turn to the words of Jesus. "He who eats my flesh" (Jn 6:56). John invokes the Incarnation by using the Greek word **Sarx** for flesh. It is the same Greek word used at the beginning of the Gospel, "the Word became **flesh** and lived among us" (Jn 1:14). The most straightforward way to interpret this, and the one which, we would affirm, has been the preference of the magisterium, is to assert an identity between the earthly presence of Christ 2,000 years ago and the Eucharist in their whole respective existential realities.

The Incarnation, the Word made flesh, is to continue through space and time. The body of Christ is to be concretely, historically, physically, wholly present to men down the ages and across the globe.


El profeta Jeremías deja consignada la esperanza de un pueblo que olvidado por sus dirigentes espera en la justicia divina y por ello dice “el Señor es nuestra justicia” (Jr 23,6). Las expectativas se ven superadas en la realidad pues Dios para aplicar su justicia no se muestra como un dirigente sentado en su trono, sino que se acerca a las realidades humanas, ejerciendo su autoridad como un pastor solícito de su rebaño. El pueblo de Israel, entendía que la justicia de Dios trae consigo la paz. Esta como fruto de la justicia, se da a perfección en la entrega de Jesús, quien conociendo perfectamente las dificultades de la vida humana, muestra en Dios la abundante fuente de la misericordia divina que nos reconcilia y nos conduce a la paz verdadera. Esto lleva a san Pablo a decir “Él es nuestra paz” (Ef 2,14)

Para continuar su ministerio, Jesús mismo ha elegido discípulos enviados a continuar su obra y les enseña con su ejemplo, la manera en que deben ejercer su ministerio, de la misma manera en que Él es sostenido por el Padre en la realización de su misión, así también los discípulos sienten la presencia del Maestro que les sostiene indicándoles el momento preciso para pastorear, para descansar, para orar. La obra de Jesús va mucho más allá de calmar las necesidades humanas, su misión es hacer presente el Reino de Dios y revelar la voluntad del Padre.

Después de los signos evidentes de la presencia del Reino, es necesario reflexionar en ellos, para que les fortalezcan en los momentos de las pruebas. También hoy tenemos que tomar tiempo para reavivar en el interior la presencia constante de Dios, que se acerca a nosotros proporcionándonos lo que necesitamos e invitándonos a no quedarnos en los signos exteriores de su misericordia, sino más bien tomarlos para que se conviertan en momentos que fortalecen nuestra vida cristiana.

REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DE LA EUCHARISTIA




"Jesús les dijo: «En verdad les digo que si no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre y no beben mi sangre, no tienen vida en ustedes.» (Jn 6, 53). Nosotros los católicos creemos en la presencia real de Jesús en la Eucaristía, porque Jesús lo ha dicho y su palabra es verdad absoluta, y la iglesia católica, a través del Cuerpo de Cristo, fielmente transmite su verdad a nosotros. ¿Pero en qué manera se hace presente?

Primero que todo analicemos las palabras de Jesús "El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre permanece en mí y yo en él." (Jn 6, 56) Juan invoca la encarnación usando la palabra griega *Sark* para referirse a la carne. Esta palabra es la misma usada al principio del evangelio "Y la **Palabra** se hizo carne, puso su tienda entre nosotros, y hemos visto su Gloria: la Gloria que recibe del Padre el Hijo único, en él todo era don amoroso y verdad." (Jn 1, 14). La manera más correcta de interpretar esto, y en la cual afirmaríamos la presencia de Cristo, ha sido la preferida por el magisterio, es acertar una identidad entre la presencia humana y real de Cristo en la tierra durante 2000 años y en la Eucaristía en sus realidades existenciales.

La encarnación, La Palabra hecha carne, continua a través de espacio y tiempo. El Cuerpo de Cristo está concretamente, históricamente, físicamente y completamente presente entre los hombres a través de los tiempos y el mundo.

Amén.




