TO WHOM SHALL WE GO?



When I see Peter the Apostle's behavior and reactions, everything to him is something unexpected or a surprise. He's a character in the stories we have read about in the Bible. It sounds strange to me that with all his impulses, our Lord Jesus chose him to be the leader of the Church.

Peter is very sincere, and his words reveal a strong man very capable of saying everything he thinks. He looks like a very earthly person, like one of us. In the Gospels, we see his ups and downs. At times, he is very brave; at other times, he is very cowardly. At times, he is rocklike in his faith, and at other times, he is more like a bowl of jello.

But it is fascinating how the Lord dealt with him, how the Lord molded him to the point where he was strong enough to return to Rome to be crucified there.

The relationship between Christ and Peter started with a simple call, "Come, follow me!" Peter was not clear about the mission. He could have thought that he would oversee the logistics, or maybe he would be the one to carry the luggage or perhaps someone that would prepare a location for the Lord to preach. He recognized his own limitations. For example, after the miraculous catch of fish, he said: "Lord, depart from me, for I am a sinful man." Christ did not deny that Peter was a sinner, but he challenged him to reach out, to go forward.


But Peter had numerous occasions when he, moved by the Holy Spirit, replied correctly to demonstrate his great faith. One example was when Jesus asked about himself: "Who do people say I am? And who do you say that I am?" (Lk 9:18). His declaration astonished everyone, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16:16).

For me, Peter's answer to Jesus' question: "Do you also want to leave me?" (Jn 6:67) revealed his mood and the communion between Jesus and Peter: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (Jn 6:68). This understanding made Peter the head of Jesus' disciples. As the first pontificate of our Church, we can identify many aspects of our personal relationship with the Lord in him. He is an excellent example of the moment when the Lord calls us to a mission. He directs and turns us, with our doubts and human miseries, into great and good servants for the cause of the Gospel.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO



St. Augustine of Hippo is the patron saint of brewers because of his conversion from a previous life of loose living, which included parties, entertainment, and worldly ambitions. His complete turnaround and conversion have been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

This famous son of Santa Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived, and although he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and pride darkened his mind so much that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the wonderful preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the only true religion. He did not become a Christian then because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day, however, he heard about two men who had suddenly been converted on reading the life of St. Anthony, and he felt ashamed of himself. "What are we doing?" he cried to his friend Alipius. "Unearned people are taking Heaven by force, while we, with all our knowledge, are so cowardly that we keep rolling in the mud of our sins!"

Full of bitter sorrow, Augustine flung himself out into the garden and cried out to God, "How much longer, O Lord? Why doesn't this hour put an end to my sins?" Just then, he heard a child singing, "Take and read!" Thinking that God intended him to hear those words, he picked up the book of Letters of St. Paul and read the first passage in which his gaze fell. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and live in imitation of Jesus. That did it! From then on, Augustine began a new life.

He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, founder of religious orders, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too. On the wall of his room, he had the following sentence written in large letters: "Here we do not speak ill of anyone." St. Augustine overcame strong heresies, practiced great poverty and supported the poor, preached very often, and prayed with great fervor right up until his death. "Too late I have loved you!" he once cried to God, but with his holy life, he certainly made up for the sins he committed before his conversion. His feast day is August 28.

CAN WE MOTHERS PERSEVERE LIKE ST. MONICA?



St. Monica is a patron saint for mothers and wives. She was an exemplary woman who never gave up hope and her faith in God among all tribulations in her family life.

St. Monica was born in the year 332 in Tagaste, North Africa. Monica had a conversion experience at a very young age and lived a life of virtue.

When she reached a marriageable age, her parents gave her in marriage to a non-Christian man named Patricius. Monica's husband Patricius not only came home drunk each day but had a violent temper, and Monica was often the victim of his rage. Patricius was neither a faithful husband, and therefore, Monica's life was full of trials.

Monica endured all her trials with patience, gentleness, and kindness. She would pray daily for the conversion of her husband, even though he would oppose her Christian practices. Her strong faith and hope in God's mercy finally paid off. Patricius accepted his wife's faith a year before his death. He admitted that he admired his wife's strong faith, and it was her unwavering kindness towards him that changed him.

St. Augustine, St. Monica's son, was seventeen when his father died. Monica and Patricius had three children, out of whom St. Augustine was the son who was to give his mother the worst heartaches.

St. Augustine was brilliant in his studies and therefore was sent to Carthage to develop his talents and become a man of culture. Although he excelled in his studies, his behavior became unacceptable to his mother. Not only that, he went into loose living with women, alcohol, and addictions of all kinds, but he also got involved with a cult called Manichaeism. One could only imagine the anguish of this poor mother, St. Monica.

Monica never gave up her prayers for her son. She would fast, cry, and beg God for her son's conversion. Legend says that a drain formed in the ground where her tears fell while praying for her son. Monica would approach the local bishop and ask them to win her son over to the faith.

The Bishop would often console her, saying, "God's time will come. Go now; it is not possible that the son of so many tears should perish." Monica was a mother who never gave up.

Finally, the time came when Augustine was twenty-nine, a successful teacher then, and had to work under the influence of Bishop Ambrose. Monica found that her son had at this stage given up Manichaeism. Monica made friends with Bishop Ambrose to help her son give up his current lifestyle.

For her greatest joy, Augustine not only embraced Christianity during an Easter celebration, but he decided to live a life of celibacy and devote himself to God's service. St. Augustine was a wonderful Bishop and later became one of the greatest saints and doctors of the Catholic Church. This was the culminating point of his mother's prayers being answered.

THE NINE WAYS OF PRAYER OF ST. DOMINIC



Third Way of Praying

Motivated by St. Dominic by everything that precedes, he rose from the ground and disciplined himself, saying: "Your discipline trained me for combat" (Ps 17:35), "Mercy, my God," (Ps 50), or also: "From I cry out to you, Lord" (Ps 129). No one, however innocent, should deviate from this example.

He suffers and prays for all those who suffer, prolonging the Passion of Jesus in his body.

We make memory within ourselves for those who suffer, in body or spirit, perhaps acquaintances or relatives of ours.

But we remember, in a special way, the incurable patients, those with AIDS, so many people whose images come to us through the media, who are victims of wars, violence, and terrorism.

A QUIÉN IREMOS?



Cuando veo el comportamiento y las reacciones de Pedro el Apóstol, todo para él es algo inesperado o una sorpresa. Es un personaje de las historias que hemos leído en la Biblia. Me suena extraño que con todos sus impulsos, nuestro Señor Jesús lo eligió para ser el líder de la Iglesia.

Pedro es muy sincero y sus palabras revelan a un hombre fuerte muy capaz de decir todo lo que piensa. Parece una persona muy terrenal, como uno de nosotros. En los evangelios, vemos sus altibajos. A veces, es muy valiente; otras veces es muy cobarde. A veces, es como una roca en su fe, y otras veces, es más como un plato de gelatina.

Pero es fascinante cómo el Señor lo trató, cómo el Señor lo moldeó hasta el punto en que fue lo suficientemente fuerte como para regresar a Roma y ser crucificado allí.

La relación entre Cristo y Pedro comenzó con un simple llamado: "¡Ven, sígueme!" Pedro no tenía clara la misión. Pudo haber pensado que supervisaría la logística, o tal vez sería él quien llevaría el equipaje o tal vez alguien que prepararía un lugar para que el Señor predicara. Reconoció sus propias limitaciones. Por ejemplo, después de la pesca milagrosa, dijo: "Señor, apártate de mí, que soy un hombre pecador". Cristo no negó que Pedro fuera un pecador, pero lo desafió a extender la mano, a seguir adelante.

Pero Pedro tuvo numerosas ocasiones en las que, movido por el Espíritu Santo, respondió correctamente para demostrar su gran fe. Un ejemplo fue cuando Jesús preguntó acerca de sí mismo: "¿Quién dice la gente que soy? ¿Y tú dices que soy?" (Lc 9,18). Su declaración asombró a todos: "Tú eres el Cristo, el Hijo del Dios viviente" (Mt 16,16).

Para mí, la respuesta de Pedro a la pregunta de Jesús: "¿Tú también quieres dejarme?" (Jn 6, 67) revela su estado de ánimo y la comunión entre Jesús y Pedro: "Maestro, ¿a quién iremos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna" (Jn 6, 68). Este entendimiento convirtió a Pedro en la cabeza de los discípulos de Jesús. Como primer pontificado de nuestra Iglesia, podemos identificar muchos aspectos de nuestra relación personal con el Señor en él. Es un excelente ejemplo del momento en que el Señor nos llama a una misión. Él nos dirige y nos convierte, con nuestras dudas y miserias humanas, en grandes y buenos servidores de la causa del Evangelio.
