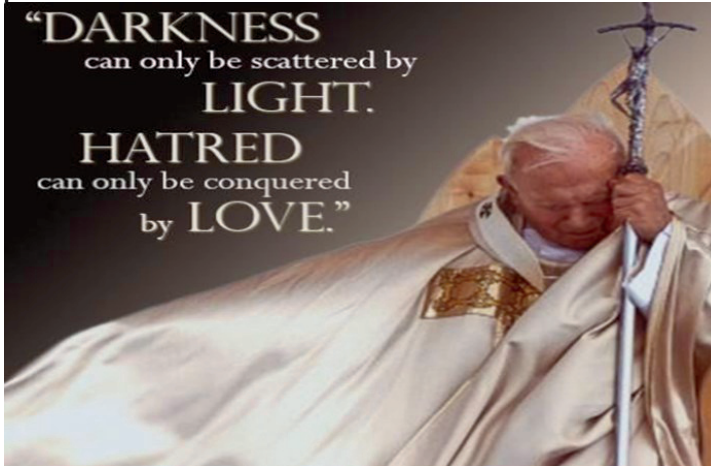

GOD'S WORD GUIDES OUR LIFE



By celebrating the Eucharist, we commemorate the proximity of God. The holy presence moves us to carry out the works that give us life while being open to his grace. Thus, we are aware of the necessity of accepting St James's invitation to his community. It also teaches us: "Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and can save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (Jas 1:21-22).

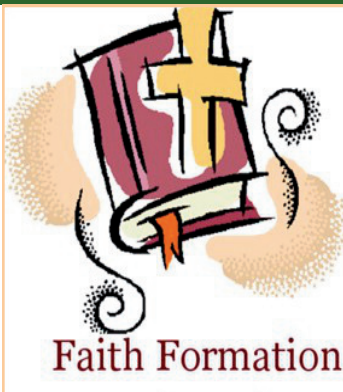
Listening to the Word makes sense insofar as it can be meditated, assumed, and served. Authentic religion is recognized as how we live and treat those around us. In the proximity of the month of the Bible, let us prepare our physical and innermost spaces for the reception of the Word of God in such a way that it strengthens us for the testimony that true faith provokes. In the apostolic exhortation on the Word of God in the life and mission of the Church, we can find the following reflection that guides our Catholic faith in the concretion of meditation on the Word.

Commitment to justice, reconciliation, and peace find their ultimate foundation and fulfillment in the love revealed to us in Christ. We saw more clearly the bond between a love-filled hearing of God's Word and the selfless service of our brothers and sisters. All believers should see the need to translate the Word that we have heard into gestures of love because this is the only way to make the Gospel proclamation credible, despite the human weakness that marks individuals. Jesus passed through this world doing good. Listening with docility to the Word of God in the Church awakens charity and justice towards all (Verbum Domini n.103).

We entrust our community to Mary, a woman who, in listening attentively to the Word of God, disposes herself to serve with humility the promptings of the Spirit. Like her, may our individual and community life be an eloquent sign of God who has made his home among us. The Word listened to, meditated upon, and served brings abundant fruits in our Church.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: GREGORY THE GREAT



Gregory was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office, he resigned, founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate, and became a Benedictine monk in his own home in Rome.

Ordained a priest, Gregory became one of the pope's seven deacons and served six years in the East as papal representative in Constantinople. He was recalled to become abbot, but at the age of 50, he was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome.

Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards, and cared for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery. He is known for his reform of the liturgy and for strengthening respect for doctrine. Whether he was largely responsible for the revision of the "Gregorian" chant is disputed.

Gregory lived in a time of perpetual strife with invading Lombards and difficult relations with the East. When Rome itself was under attack, he interviewed the Lombard king.

His book, *Pastoral Care*, on the duties and qualities of a bishop, was read for centuries after his death. He described bishops mainly as physicians whose main duties were preaching and the enforcement of discipline. In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily Gospel to the needs of his listeners. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church.

An Anglican historian has written: "It is impossible to conceive what would have been the confusion, the lawlessness, the chaotic state of the Middle Ages without the medieval papacy; and of the medieval papacy, the real father is Gregory the Great."

SEPTEMBER MONTH OF THE BIBLE



A Spiritual Feast for Your Home: How Catholics Can Use the Old Testament in the Family

What is your family's favorite meal? Is it a holiday recipe, a simple weeknight dinner, or a gourmet dessert treat?

The Second Vatican Council teaches that "the treasures of the Bible are to be opened more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's Word" (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, 51). Is the Bible a special table around which your family gathers, as if for a favorite meal?

As we consider ways to share the Old Testament in the family, we discover that the Bible, whether prominently displayed or gathering dust on a shelf, offers rich spiritual nourishment for children, teenagers, and adults in your home.

It is said that we live in the Age of Information. The information superhighway moves us through the high-speed traffic of news conveyed through television, the Internet, blogs, and instant messaging. We may have instant and high-speed access to information at our fingertips. But the search for human happiness and daily wisdom remains. What is the place of the Bible in this Information Age?

The *Catechism* tells us that the books of the Old Testament "are a storehouse of sublime teaching on God and of sound wisdom on human life, as well as a wonderful treasury of prayers; in them, too, the mystery of our salvation is present in a hidden way" (CCC 122, quoting *Dei Verbum* 15).

Much of the Old Testament takes the form of stories. The way God teaches resounds with human imagination. Through the rich tapestry of biblical narratives, we learn about God's love and fidelity in the face of human doubt, apathy, and infidelity. The drama of the biblical stories reflects our own journeys of faith with our daily joys, struggles, and hopes.

Old Testament stories are especially compelling for young children who, with their natural capacity for awe and wonder, marvel at the unfolding of God's saving action and living presence in the world. Biblical stories that reveal weakness and sin are opportunities to discuss, at age-appropriate levels, our humanness considering God's love and mercy. Through the biblical range of human experiences, we learn God's ways and our response to faith.

To bring the Old Testament to life, assign family members to gather artistic images that depict biblical stories and themes. Let the painting, sculpture, stained glass, or piece of sacred music serve as a discussion starter for family reflection on God's word expressed in artistic forms.

The Psalms are a rich storehouse of prayers. In spite of overloaded family schedules taking brief moments to pray together, the Liturgy of the Hours, whether Morning or Evening Prayer, connects your home to the Church's rhythm of praise, thanksgiving, and intercession. Handy Catholic resources now available make daily praying of Morning and Evening Prayer simple and sustainable.

Finally, *lectio divina* is another practical way to feast on the Old Testament in your home. This ancient Christian practice is being recovered in our time and strongly encouraged during the 2008 Bishops Synod on the Word of God and in Pope Benedict's Exhortation following the Synod. Through the steps of *lectio divina*—reading, meditation, prayer, and contemplation—the wisdom of the Old Testament can bear rich fruit in your home and may even become your family's favorite spiritual food.

THE NINE WAYS OF PRAYER OF ST. DOMINIC



Fourth Way of Praying

After this, St. Dominic turned to the crucifix and looked at it with great attention.

Sometimes, after praying the Compline prayer and until midnight, he would say, like the leper in the Gospel: "Lord, if you want, you can heal me" (Mt 8:2).

Or like Esteban, who cried out: "Do not hold this sin in mind" (Acts 7:60).

He had great confidence in the mercy of God, in his favor, in the good of all sinners, and in the protection of the young friars whom he sent to preach.

At times he could not contain his voice, and the friars heard him say: "To you, Lord, I invoke you, do not be deaf to my voice, do not be silent" (Ps 27:1); as well as other words from Holy Scripture.

Dominic prays before Christ, presenting him with the work of his hands, hands that are also ours. What can we present to him of our lives?

Let us raise our hands before Him, we do not seek merit or praise, but we wish to have a heart full of names, of concrete faces whom we love and wish to love more.

That is why we remember our families, who have given us life, or to whom we have given life, love, education ... or who have made it possible for us to be here.

That is why we remember our communities, fraternities, groups, movements, our superiors, leaders ...

That is why we remember our friends, neighbors, people who share our lives, co-workers, students ...

But we cannot forget those we do not love yet, those with whom we have tense relationships ...

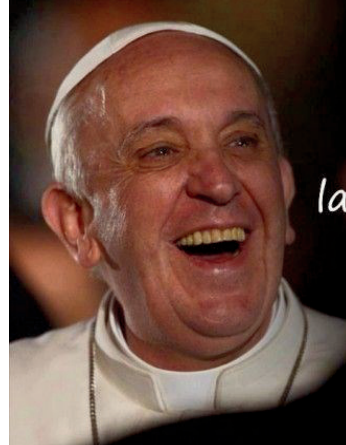
