BRING FLAVOR TO THE WORLD



On this Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Lord Jesus presents this brilliant idea about his followers being the salt of the earth. There is a lot of connotation in this comparison and exhortation to live our lives as real disciples. Disciples who feel the love of Him first are then called to bring an important “taste” to our neighbor. Salt is the symbol of sharing and preservation. As salt preserves food from putrefaction, so do practicing Christians preserve society from moral and political decay. Christ says that we are the salt of the earth.

Today, salt has a bad reputation because of health issues, and we indeed use less in our diet. But salt-free food has no taste. I am not encouraging you to consume salt in large amounts. I, too, have a recommendation from my nutritionist to eat it only in small amounts. But in what context did Jesus make this comparison? In ancient times, discovering how salt could extend food’s shelf life was one of humankind’s most important findings when refrigeration was non-existent, in addition to the flavor it gives to the food. In primitive communities, salt was an important material belonging that was very important in commerce. Sometimes people paid wages with salt, which is why the word salary was developed to reference how the workers received their payment for their work. Getting back to the Gospel reading, salt was also very important in many religious practices. In Egypt, it was used for burials; in the Old Testament, we found passages in which people used salt for legally binding covenants and sacrifices on the altar. As part of our Church today, we have the sacramental right of blessing holy water, which includes adding a little salt. With this information, I am sure that we better understand why Jesus is giving a protagonist position to salt and asking us to be ready to provide the flavor of the Gospel to the entire world by word, action, and testimony.

So when Jesus says, you are the salt of the earth, he is inviting us to consider that by becoming disciples that proclaim the Kingdom of God in word and deed, we become the preservative that keeps the world from spoiling. He is also saying that by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through the example of our lives, we will give the world in which we live a better taste. Just as food tastes better with salt, the world tastes better when people live the Gospel.

THE 2023-2024 FAITH FORMATION YEAR IS UPON US!

Registration period for the 2023-2024 Academic Year opens on Tuesday, February 7.

All documents, including the Registration Info sheet, Registration documents, and the breakdown of fees, can be found on the parish website. You may download the documents and complete the forms before you arrive at the Fr. Carlos Building to register your child(ren).

Registration Fee: \$25 per family up to four (4) children.
The fee is waived for a family registering five (5) or more children.

Textbook Fee: \$50 for each child being registered.

All Fees are due at the time of Registration. All Fees are non-refundable. Your child is not considered registered unless payment is made at the time of Registration.

Registration will be in the Fr. Carlos Building only; will take place only on the following days; and only during the hours listed:

Registrations will be accepted during the week on Tuesday, Thursday, & Friday only, except for Tuesday, February 14, as the ORE will be closed on that day. The hours of Registration will be between 10:30 AM and 4:00 PM only. No registrations will be accepted before 10:30 AM and after 4:00 PM.

Registration will also be on the following Saturdays in February: February 11, February 18, & February 25. Hours: 1:00 PM to 2:45 PM only. Registrations will not be accepted before 1:00 PM and after 2:45 PM.

Sacramental Preparation: Except for several very limited and special exceptions, Sacrament Preparation will **TAKE AT LEAST TWO ACADEMIC YEARS**. A new Registration is required for each year of the program.

For children in Grades 3, 4, & 5 who have already received their First Communion, we are offering a Home Study Faith Formation program. This is highly recommended, as Faith Formation is a lifelong journey. Participation will instill in your child, as well as in you, as the parent, a willingness to have your child complete their initiation into the Catholic Church by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation during the fall of their 8th-Grade year.

It is solely a parent’s responsibility to provide to the Office of Religious Education the necessary document(s) that will verify that a child has received the Sacrament of Baptism and if required, the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. A child **WILL NOT BE ABLE TO** receive the Sacrament for which they are preparing if the Office of Religious Education does not receive these documents.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: SCHOLASTICA



Twins often share the same interests and ideas with equal intensity. Therefore, it is no surprise that Scholastica and her twin brother, Benedict, established religious communities within a few miles of each other.

Born in 480 to wealthy parents, Scholastica and Benedict were brought up together until he left central Italy for Rome to continue his studies.

Little is known of Scholastica's early life. She founded a religious community for women near Monte Cassino at Plombariola, five miles from where her brother governed a monastery.

The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters.

According to the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great, the brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand, and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day.

He refused her request because he did not want to spend a night outside the monastery, thus breaking his own Rule. Scholastica asked God to let her brother remain, and a severe thunderstorm broke out, preventing Benedict and his monks from returning to the abbey.

Benedict cried out, "God forgive you, Sister. What have you done?" Scholastica replied, "I asked a favor of you and you refused. I asked it of God and he granted it."

Brother and sister parted the next morning after their long discussion. Three days later, Benedict was praying in his monastery and saw his sister's soul rising heavenward as a white dove. Benedict then announced the death of his sister to the monks and later buried her in the tomb he had prepared for himself.

Reflection: Scholastica and Benedict gave themselves totally to God and gave top priority to deepening their friendship with him through prayer. They sacrificed some of the opportunities they would have had to be together as brother and sister to fulfill their vocation to the religious life better. In coming closer to Christ, however, they found they were also closer to each other. In joining a religious community, they did not forget or forsake their family but rather found more brothers and sisters.

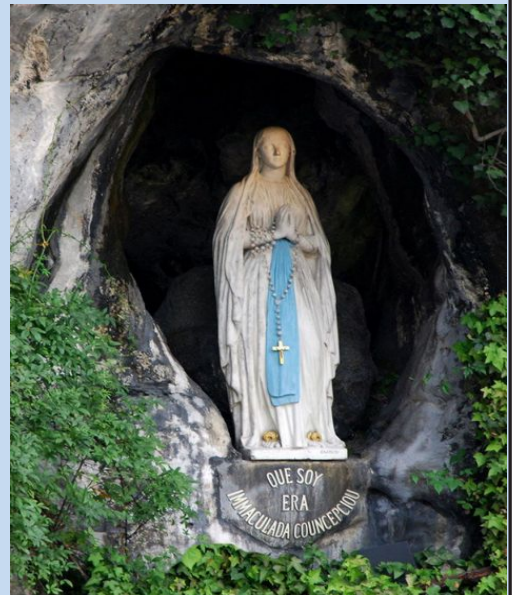
WORLD DAY OF THE SICK: FEBRUARY 11

The celebration of the World Day of the Sick on February 11, the liturgical memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lourdes, is an opportunity to devote special attention to the sick and those who provide them with assistance and care, both in healthcare institutions and within families and communities. The experience of sickness makes us realize our vulnerability and innate need for others. It makes us feel more apparent that we are creatures dependent on God. Fear and bewilderment can grip our minds and hearts when we are ill. Sickness raises the question of life's meaning, which we bring before God in faith. In seeking a new and deeper direction, we may not find an immediate answer. Nor are our relatives and friends always able to help us in this demanding quest.

Dear brothers and sisters, the commandment of love that Jesus left to his disciples is also kept in our relationship with the sick. In a spirit of fraternal love, society is more human to the degree that it cares effectively for its most frail and suffering members. Let us strive to achieve this goal so that no one will feel alone, excluded, or abandoned.

To Mary, Mother of Mercy and Health of the Infirm, I entrust the sick, healthcare workers, and all those who generously assist our suffering brothers and sisters. From the Grotto of Lourdes and her many other shrines throughout the world, may she sustain our faith and hope and help us care for one another with fraternal love. To each and all, I cordially impart my blessing.

O Mary,
You shine continuously on our journey
as a sign of salvation and hope.
We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick,
who, at the cross,
united with Jesus' pain,
kept your faith firm.
You know what we need,
and we trust that you will provide for those needs so that,
as at Cana of Galilee,
joy and celebration may return
after this moment of trial.

LLEVEN SABOR A EL MUNDO



En este Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, el Señor Jesús presenta esta brillante idea acerca de que sus seguidores son la sal de la tierra. Hay mucha connotación en esta comparación y exhortación a vivir nuestras vidas como verdaderos discípulos. Los discípulos que primero sienten el amor de Él son llamados luego a traer un “gusto” importante a nuestro prójimo. La sal es el símbolo de compartir y preservar. Así como la sal preserva los alimentos de la putrefacción, los cristianos practicantes preservan a la sociedad de la decadencia moral y política. Cristo dice que somos la sal de la tierra.

Hoy en día, la sal tiene mala reputación debido a problemas de salud y, de hecho, usamos menos en nuestra dieta. Pero la comida sin sal no tiene sabor. No te estoy animando a consumir sal en grandes cantidades. Yo también tengo una recomendación de mi nutricionista para comerlo solo en pequeñas cantidades. Pero, ¿en qué contexto hizo Jesús esta comparación? En la antigüedad, descubrir cómo la sal podía extender la vida útil de los alimentos fue uno de los hallazgos más importantes de la humanidad cuando no existía la refrigeración, además del sabor que le da a la comida. En las comunidades primitivas, la sal era una propiedad material importante que era muy importante en el comercio. A veces, las personas pagaban salarios con sal, por lo que se desarrolló la palabra salario para hacer referencia a cómo los trabajadores recibían el pago por su trabajo. Volviendo a la lectura del Evangelio, la sal también era muy importante en muchas prácticas religiosas. En Egipto, se utilizó para entierros; En el Antiguo Testamento, encontramos pasajes en los que la gente usaba sal para pactos y sacrificios legalmente vinculantes en el altar. Como parte de nuestra Iglesia hoy, tenemos el derecho sacramental de bendecir el agua bendita, lo que incluye agregar un poco de sal. Con esta información, estoy seguro de que entendemos mejor por qué Jesús le da un lugar protagónico a la sal y nos pide que estemos listos para llevar el sabor del Evangelio al mundo entero con la palabra, la acción y el testimonio.

Entonces, cuando Jesús dice, ustedes son la sal de la tierra, nos está invitando a considerar que al convertirnos en discípulos que proclamamos el Reino de Dios en palabra y obra, nos convertimos en el conservante que evita que el mundo se eche a perder. También está diciendo que proclamando la Buena Nueva del Evangelio a través del ejemplo de nuestra vida, daremos un mejor sabor al mundo en el que vivimos. Así como la comida sabe mejor con sal, el mundo sabe mejor cuando la gente vive el Evangelio.

2023-2024 REGISTRACIONES OFICINA DE EDUCACIÓN RELIGIOSA

El plazo de matrícula para el curso 2023-2024 se abre el martes 7 de febrero.

Todos los documentos, incluida la hoja de información de registro, los documentos de registro, así como el desglose de las tarifas, se pueden encontrar en el sitio web de la parroquia. Puede descargar los documentos y completar los formularios antes de llegar al Edificio Padre Carlos para registrar a su hijo o hijos.

Cuota de Inscripción: \$25 por Familia hasta cuatro (4) niños.
La tarifa no se aplica a una familia que registra (cinco) 5 o más niños.

Cuota de libros de texto: \$50 por cada niño registrado.

Todas las tarifas deben pagarse en el momento de la inscripción. Todas las tarifas no son reembolsables una vez pagadas.

Su hijo no se considera registrado a menos que se realice el pago en el momento de la inscripción.

El lugar para el registro es el p. Carlos Building únicamente y tendrá lugar únicamente en los siguientes días y únicamente en el horario indicado:

Se aceptarán inscripciones durante la semana los martes, jueves y viernes únicamente, con excepción del martes 14 de febrero, ya que la ORE estará cerrada ese día. El horario de Registro será de 10:30 AM a 4:00 PM únicamente. No se aceptarán inscripciones antes de las 10:30 AM y después de las 4:00 PM.

La inscripción también se llevará a cabo los siguientes sábados de febrero: 11 de febrero, 18 de febrero, y 25 de febrero. Horario: 1:00 PM a 2:45 PM únicamente. No se aceptarán inscripciones antes de las 13:00 horas ni después de las 14:45 horas.

Preparación Sacramental: Excepto por varias excepciones muy limitadas y especiales, la Preparación Sacramental TOMARÁ POR LO **MENOS DOS AÑOS ACADÉMICOS.** Se requiere una nueva inscripción para cada año del programa.

Para los niños en los grados 3, 4 y 5: que ya han recibido su Primera Comunión, estamos ofreciendo un programa de Formación de Fe de Estudio en el Hogar. Esto es muy recomendable ya que la formación en la fe es un viaje de toda la vida. La participación inculcará en su hijo, así como en usted, como padre, la voluntad de que su hijo complete su iniciación en la Iglesia Católica al recibir el Sacramento de la Confirmación durante el otoño de su octavo grado.

Es responsabilidad exclusiva de los padres proporcionar a la Oficina de Educación Religiosa los documentos necesarios que verifiquen que un niño ha recibido el Sacramento del Bautismo y, si es necesario, también el Sacramento de la Primera Comunión. Un niño **NO PODRÁ** recibir el Sacramento para el cual se está preparando, si la Oficina de Educación Religiosa no recibe estos documentos.
