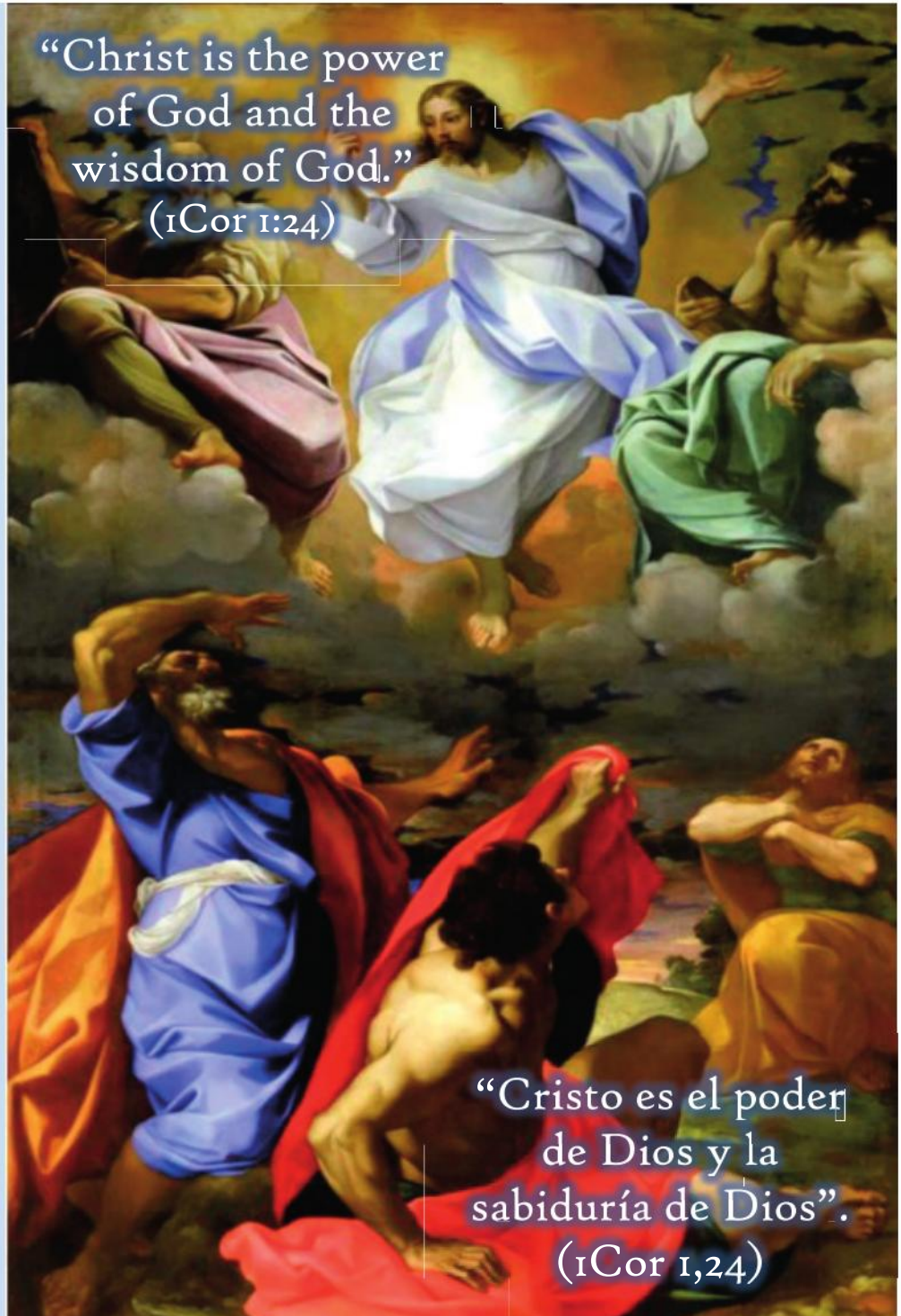

INVESTMENT FOR ETERNAL LIFE



In the Gospel this Sunday, the man who found the buried treasure in a field sold everything he had to buy that field. The merchant who found the pearl of great price sold everything to buy it. This is an excellent explanation by Jesus to his disciples to help them understand how important heaven is for Catholics. We must work hard and constantly seek the mercy of God to get it. But for our personal reflection, it could be very important to answer these questions: How much can we leave behind us for the Kingdom of Heaven? What kind of possessions are we ready to give up for Heaven? Are we willing to sell all that we have for the cause of our salvation?

As humans, we are sometimes moved by certainties or assurances that we are not wasting our time or that our efforts and investments will have a positive result in the future and glory in everlasting life. This means we will inherit the Kingdom of Heaven by doing good things.

At this present time, we have a lot of visible signs that help us to have a glimpse of heaven on earth. Pope Benedict XVI said, “The Liturgy is the act in which we believe that God enters our lives and that we touch Him...We come into contact with God. He comes to us—and we are illumined by Him” (“Light of the World,” p. 155). In a very unique and special way, Jesus is really present in the liturgy, especially in the Eucharist. Pope St. John Paul II said, “The liturgy we celebrate on earth is a mysterious participation in the heavenly liturgy” (Angelus, Nov. 3, 1996). He further said that, in fact, “It is the eternal worship of Heaven, but it is also steeped in time” (Address on Liturgy to the U.S. Bishops, 1998). Dr. Scott Hahn, a famous biblical scholar in the U.S., said, “When Jesus comes again at the end of time, he will not have a single drop more glory than he has right now upon the altars and in the tabernacles of our churches. God dwells among mankind, right now, because the Mass is heaven on earth” (The Lamb’s Supper, p.116). St. John Chrysostom attested this truth: “When Mass is celebrated, the sanctuary is filled with countless angels who adore the Divine Victim immolated on the altar.”

My dear parishioners, it is time to contemplate the real presence of Jesus in the next Eucharist, in which we will participate and be part of this great mystery of Heaven while we continue living in this world. One day, we will contemplate the whole truth in heaven when the Lord calls us to be in one of the many dwelling places that he has prepared for us and realize at that moment that we never waste our time with God. Rather, what we are doing now in adoration will be the eternal joy of the faithful in heaven.

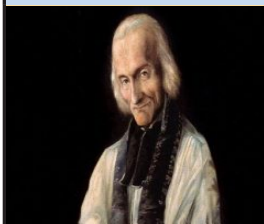

ST. JOHN VIANNEY, THE CURÉ OF ARS, PATRON OF PARISH PRIESTS



“If we really understood the priest on earth, we would die: not of fear, but of love.” St. John Vianney’s whole life could be summed up in this saying attributed to him.

Known as the “Curé d’Ars,” Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney was born on May 8, 1786, in France in the town of Dardilly, near Lyons. His devout Catholic parents were farmers, and from an early age, John worked in the fields. Without formal education, as a young man, he was functionally illiterate. But thanks to his mother’s teaching, Vianney could memorize and understand numerous prayers and live a devout religious life.

At that time in France, the winds of Revolution were blowing. Young John made his Confession at home, rather than in a church, to a “non-juring” priest who had not sworn loyalty to the revolutionary government. The same priest gave him his First Communion in a barn during an “underground” Mass. At 17, John Vianney felt the call to the priesthood. “If I am to be a priest,” he said, “I will win many souls for God.”

But the path to ordination was not easy due to the corrupt morals of the day. It was only thanks to some wise priests – including Fr. Bailey, the parish priest of d’Écully, that he finally received Holy Orders on February 13, 1815, at 29.

Patron of Parish Priests

Having given his whole life for God and his parishioners, John Vianney died on August 4, 1859. He was 73 years old. His relics can be found in Ars, in the sanctuary dedicated to him, which is visited by some 450,000 pilgrims every year. He was beatified by Pope St. Pius X in 1905 and canonized twenty years later by Pope Pius XI. In 1929, the same Pope proclaimed him the “heavenly patron of all parish priests throughout the world.” During the centenary of his death in 1959, Pope St John XXIII dedicated an encyclical to St. John Vianney, pointing him out as an exemplary model for priests. Fifty years later, Pope Benedict XVI inaugurated a “Year of Priests” on the 150th anniversary of his birthday into heaven in order “to deepen the commitment of all priests to interior renewal for the sake of a stronger and more incisive witness to the Gospel in today’s world.”

SAINT OF THE WEEK: JEAN-BAPTISTE-MARIE VIANNEY



A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible. John Vianney was a man with vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

Situations calling for “impossible” deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney’s most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months, he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months, this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God’s people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil.

Who but a man with vision could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.

Reflection: Indifference toward religion and a love for material comfort seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us as pilgrims on our way elsewhere. On the other hand, John Vianney was a man on a journey, with his goal before him at all times.

REFLECTION OF THE EUCHARIST



Jesus’ one perfect sacrifice is thus eternally present before the Father, who eternally accepts it. This means that in the Eucharist, Jesus does not repeatedly sacrifice himself. Rather, by the power of the Holy Spirit, his one eternal sacrifice is made present once again, re-presented, so that we may share in it. Christ does not have to leave where he is in heaven to be with us. Rather, we partake of the heavenly liturgy where Christ eternally intercedes for us and presents his sacrifice to the Father and where the angels and saints constantly glorify God and give thanks for all his gifts: “To

the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever” (Rev 5:13). As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “By the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all” (no. 1326).

The Sanctus proclamation, “Holy, Holy, Holy Lord . . .,” is the song of the angels who are in the presence of God (Is 6:3). When we proclaim the Sanctus in the Eucharist, we echo on earth the song of angels as they worship God in heaven. In the Eucharistic celebration, we do not simply remember a historical event. Rather, through the mysterious action of the Holy Spirit in the Eucharistic celebration, the Lord’s Paschal Mystery is made present and contemporaneous to his Spouse, the Church. Furthermore, we are not simply spectators in the Eucharistic re-presentation of Christ’s eternal sacrifice before the Father. The priest and the worshiping community are active in the Eucharistic sacrifice in different ways. The ordained priest standing at the altar represents Christ as head of the Church. All the baptized, as members of Christ’s Body, share in his priesthood as both priest and victim. The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church. The Church, the Body and Bride of Christ, participates in the sacrificial offering of her Head and Spouse. In the Eucharist, the sacrifice of Christ becomes the sacrifice of the members of his Body who united to Christ to form one sacrificial offering (cf. Catechism, no. 1368). As Christ’s sacrifice is made sacramentally present, united with Christ, we offer ourselves as a sacrifice to the Father. “The whole Church exercises the role of priest and victim along with Christ, offering the Sacrifice of the Mass and itself completely offered in it” (Mysterium Fidei, no. 31; cf. Lumen Gentium, no. 11).

INVERSIÓN PARA LA VIDA ETERNA



En el Evangelio de este domingo, el hombre que encontró el tesoro enterrado en un campo vendió todo lo que tenía para comprar ese campo. El mercader que encontró la perla de gran precio vendió todo para comprarla. Esta es una excelente explicación de Jesús a sus discípulos para ayudarlos a comprender cuán importante es el cielo para los católicos. Debemos trabajar duro y buscar constantemente la misericordia de Dios para conseguirlo. Pero para nuestra reflexión personal, podría ser muy importante responder a estas preguntas: ¿Cuánto podemos dejar atrás para el Reino de los Cielos? ¿Qué tipo de posesiones estamos dispuestos a dejar por el Cielo? ¿Estamos dispuestos a vender todo lo que tenemos por la causa de nuestra salvación?

Como seres humanos, a veces nos mueve la certeza o la seguridad de que no estamos perdiendo el tiempo o que nuestros esfuerzos e inversiones tendrán un resultado positivo en el futuro y la gloria en la vida eterna. Esto significa que heredaremos el Reino de los Cielos haciendo cosas buenas.

En este momento tenemos muchas señales visibles que nos ayudan a vislumbrar el cielo en la tierra. El Papa Benedicto XVI dijo: “La liturgia es el acto en el que creemos que Dios entra en nuestras vidas y que lo tocamos... Entramos en contacto con Dios. Él viene a nosotros – y somos iluminados por Él” (“La luz del mundo”, p. 155). De una manera muy singular y especial, Jesús está realmente presente en la liturgia, especialmente en la Eucaristía. El Papa San Juan Pablo II dijo: “La liturgia que celebramos en la tierra es una participación misteriosa en la liturgia celestial” (Ángelus, 3 de noviembre de 1996). Dijo además que, de hecho, “Es la adoración eterna del Cielo, pero también está impregnada de tiempo” (Discurso sobre la liturgia a los obispos de EE. UU., 1998). El Dr. Scott Hahn, un famoso erudito bíblico en los EE. UU., dijo: “Cuando Jesús regrese al final de los tiempos, no tendrá ni una gota más de gloria de la que tiene ahora sobre los altares y en los tabernáculos de nuestras iglesias. . Dios habita entre los hombres, ahora mismo, porque la Misa es el cielo en la tierra” (La Cena del Cordero, p. 116). San Juan Crisóstomo atestiguaba esta verdad: “Cuando se celebra la Misa, el santuario se llena de innumerables ángeles que adoran a la Divina Víctima inmolada en el altar”.

Mis queridos feligreses, es hora de contemplar la presencia real de Jesús en la próxima Eucaristía, en la cual participaremos y seremos parte de este gran misterio del Cielo mientras sigamos viviendo en este mundo. Un día contemplaremos toda la verdad en el cielo cuando el Señor nos llame a estar en una de las tantas moradas que tiene preparadas para nosotros y nos demos cuenta en ese momento que nunca perdemos nuestro tiempo con Dios. Más bien, lo que estamos haciendo ahora en adoración será el gozo eterno de los fieles en el cielo.

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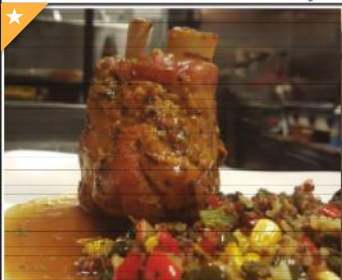


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
