IT'S WONDERFUL TO BE HERE



In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John are taken up to a high mountain by Jesus, and there they have an experience with him that leaves them astonished. The experience was so precious to Peter that he couldn't let it go. He wanted to prolong it and proposed to Jesus: "Rabbi, it is wonderful for us to be here, so let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." They completely forgot about their world: family, other disciples, and the people they loved. In this moment of glory, he persuaded them to think only of themselves. They had a heavenly vision and wanted to remain in that state forever. They felt that this vision of heaven could be with them in this world, but the reality was that they had only a glimpse of their future life. But while they were still in this world, they had to return to their present life with all kinds of suffering, joy, tribulations, fights, or battles—in one word: the CROSS of our own lives.

Beauty always attracts; it calls out to us. But great moments pass quickly in this present life. When it comes to a party or celebration, we dedicate a lot of time preparing for it. When the time comes to celebrate, it passes so fast that for moments, we would like to stop time and celebrate longer. All we will have will be good memories, pictures, or videos that will tell us about that experience that happened in the past. When we look back on our past with sadness or longing, we need to remember that one day, we will be in the presence of the Lord, celebrating forever what we expect to experience in heaven.

Our task, for now, is to listen to our Lord Jesus; that was the order the disciples heard on Mount Tabor. We spend our lives listening to the Lord as he speaks to us in his word and through the circumstances of our lives. We listen to him as a preparation for that beautiful moment when we see him face to face in eternity and we can finally say, "It is wonderful to be here."

OFFICE OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Parents of children currently in our Kindergarten class: Our First-Grade class remains outside the Sacramental preparation process. However, allowing your child to continue their Faith Formation by participating in our First Grade is still a benefit for your child, even though they will not be preparing for a Sacrament until they enter the Second Grade.

Parents of children currently in our First-Grade class: First Holy Communion is traditionally received at the Second-Grade level. Delaying your child's receipt of their First Holy Communion delays the progress and quality of their Faith Formation journey.

Parents of children currently in our Sixth-Grade class: It is highly recommended that you register your child for our Seventh Grade Confirmation Preparation Class. Doing otherwise will delay your child's receipt of the Sacrament of Confirmation, which should traditionally take place in September of their Eighth-Grade year (September 2025). Your child's current class is only preparing them to receive their First Reconciliation on April 27 and their First Holy Communion on May 18.

Parents of children currently participating in our Home Study Continuing Formation Program: Current students who will be entering Grades 3, 4, or 5 when school begins in August 2024 (all of whom must have already received their First Holy Communion or will receive it on May 18) will have an opportunity to participate in our 2024-2025 Continuing Formation Program. For this upcoming academic year, this program is being made available as a Home Study Program with one in-class date per month or a weekly in-class program. Participation in either program is limited.

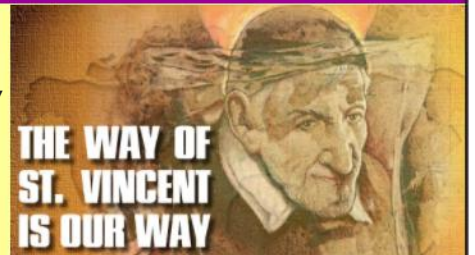

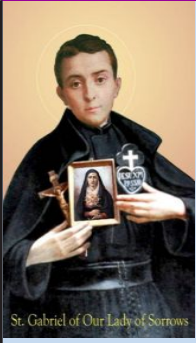

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. GABRIEL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS



Born in Italy into a large family and baptized Francis, St. Gabriel lost his mother when he was only four years old. He was educated by the Jesuits and, having been cured twice of serious illnesses came to believe that God was calling him to the religious life. Young Francis wished to join the Jesuits but was turned down, probably because of his age, not yet 17. Following the death of a sister to cholera, his resolve to enter religious life became even stronger, and he was accepted by the Passionists. Upon entering the novitiate, he was given the name Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows.

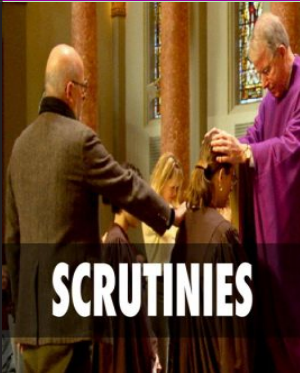
Ever popular and cheerful, Gabriel quickly was successful in his effort to be faithful in little things. His spirit of prayer, love for the poor, consideration of the feelings of others, exact observance of the Passionist Rule, and his bodily penances—always subject to the will of his wise superiors—made a deep impression on everyone.

His superiors had great expectations of Gabriel as he prepared for the priesthood, but after only four years of religious life, symptoms of tuberculosis appeared. Ever obedient, he patiently bore the painful effects of the disease and the restrictions it required, seeking no special notice. He died peacefully on February 27, 1862, at age 24, having been an example to both young and old.

St. Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows was canonized in 1920.

Reflection: When we think of achieving great holiness by doing little things with love and grace, Therese of Lisieux comes first to mind. Like her, Gabriel died painfully from tuberculosis. Together, they urge us to tend to the small details of daily life and be considerate of others' feelings every day. Like theirs, our path to sanctity probably lies not in heroic doings but in performing small acts of kindness every day.

WHAT ARE THE SCRUTINIES?



These Rites are celebrated to help deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover and heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the elects' hearts and to bring out through

repentance all that is upright, strong, and good. Three Scrutinies are celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent after the homily. The Scripture readings for the Scrutinies ordinarily come from Cycle A of the Lectionary: the Gospel story of the Samaritan woman at the well for the 1st Scrutiny, the Gospel story of the healing of the man born blind for the 2nd Scrutiny, and the Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus for the 3rd Scrutiny. The celebrations of the Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on their own sins and the need for God's help.

Our videos for Jesus in the Eucharist will also include a video presentation of the scriptural stories of the scrutinies to benefit the elect in attendance. Please join us by 9:30 AM to catch the full video presentation and let those encounters speak to your heart, as this year, we will be reading from the Year B readings, which do not include these encounters.

DURING LENT

Sometimes, we take the celebration that is the Mass for granted. During the period of Lent, areas around the church and the Mass undergo several changes to remind us of the glorious celebration waiting for us on Easter Sunday. Here are just a few things that change:

- No Flowers. This means there will be no flowers in front of the altar or statues in the assembly area or at weddings, funerals, or Quinceaneras.
- No Gloria and no Alleluia. Both call to mind the rejoicing at the work of salvation complete in the resurrection and are, therefore, not used from Ash Wednesday until the Easter Vigil.
- Changes to Mass settings or music selections to complement the season. During the Lenten season, we will switch to the Chant Mass in Latin.
- OCIA participants become an important part of our congregation as the readings at the 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM Masses are different on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, like those in OCIA. We revisit three unique encounters with Jesus Christ: the woman at the well, the man born blind, and Lazarus.
- We add Stations of the Cross on Fridays as we are asked to contemplate, in a special way, the suffering Jesus endured to accomplish the work of our salvation. Participation in the Stations also provides participants with a plenary indulgence.
- No baptisms will be celebrated during Lent. The Rite of the Baptism of Children recommends, in number 47: "Since Lent is a time of preparation for Baptism of catechumens and renewal of the baptismal conscience of the faithful, it seems opportune that said sacrament not be celebrated during Lent, precisely so that the Easter Vigil and the day of the Resurrection appear as the "baptismal day" par excellence."

ES MARAVILLOSO ESTAR AQUÍ

Quería prolongarlo y le propuso a Jesús: “Rabí, es maravilloso para nosotros estar aquí, así que hagamos tres tiendas: una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías”. Se olvidaron por completo de su mundo: la familia, los demás discípulos y las personas que amaban. En este momento de gloria, los persuadió a pensar sólo en sí mismos. Tuvieron una visión celestial y quisieron permanecer en ese estado para siempre. Sintieron que esta visión del cielo podría estar con ellos en este mundo, pero la realidad era que sólo tenían un vislumbre de su vida futura. Pero mientras aún estaban en este mundo, tuvieron que regresar a su vida presente con toda clase de sufrimientos, alegrías, tribulaciones, peleas o batallas; en una palabra: la CRUZ de nuestras propias vidas.

La belleza siempre atrae; nos llama. Pero los grandes momentos pasan rápidamente en esta vida presente. Cuando se trata de una fiesta o celebración, dedicamos mucho tiempo a prepararla. Cuando llega el momento de celebrar, pasa tan rápido que por momentos quisiéramos detener el tiempo y celebrar más. Lo único que tendremos serán buenos recuerdos, fotografías o vídeos que nos hablarán de esa experiencia que pasó en el pasado. Cuando miramos hacia atrás a nuestro pasado con tristeza o anhelo, debemos recordar que un día estaremos en la presencia del Señor, celebrando para siempre lo que esperamos experimentar en el cielo.

Nuestra tarea, por ahora, es escuchar a nuestro Señor Jesús; esa fue la orden que escucharon los discípulos en el monte Tabor. Pasamos nuestras vidas escuchando al Señor mientras nos habla en su palabra y a través de las circunstancias de nuestras vidas. Lo escuchamos como preparación para ese hermoso momento en el que lo veremos cara a cara en la eternidad y finalmente podremos decir: “Es maravilloso estar aquí”.

OFICINA DE EDUCACION RELIGIOSA

Padres de niños que actualmente están en nuestra clase de Kindergarten: Nuestra clase de Primer Grado permanece fuera del proceso de preparación sacramental. Sin embargo, permitir que su hijo continúe su formación en la fe participando en nuestro primer grado sigue siendo un beneficio para su hijo, aunque no se preparará para un sacramento hasta que ingrese al segundo grado.

Padres de niños actualmente en nuestra clase de Primer Grado: La Primera Comunión se recibe tradicionalmente en el nivel de Segundo Grado. Retrasar la recepción de la Primera Comunión de su hijo retrasa el progreso y la calidad de su viaje de formación en la fe.

Padres de niños que actualmente están en nuestra clase de Sexto Grado: Se recomienda encarecidamente que inscriba a su hijo en nuestra Clase de Preparación para la Confirmación de Séptimo Grado. De lo contrario, se retrasará la recepción del Sacramento de la Confirmación por parte de su hijo, que tradicionalmente debería tener lugar en septiembre de su año de octavo grado (septiembre de 2025). La clase actual de su hijo solo lo está preparando para recibir su Primera Reconciliación el 27 de abril y su Primera Comunión el 18 de mayo.

Padres de niños que actualmente participan en nuestro Programa de Formación Continua de Estudio en el Hogar: Los estudiantes actuales que ingresarán a los grados 3, 4 o 5 cuando comiencen las clases en agosto de 2024 (todos los cuales ya deben haber recibido su Primera Comunión o la recibirán el 18 de mayo) tendrán la oportunidad de participar en nuestro Programa de Formación Continua 2024-2025. Para este próximo año académico, este programa está disponible como un Programa de Estudio en el Hogar con una fecha de clase por mes o un programa semanal en clase. La participación en cualquiera de los dos programas es limitada.
