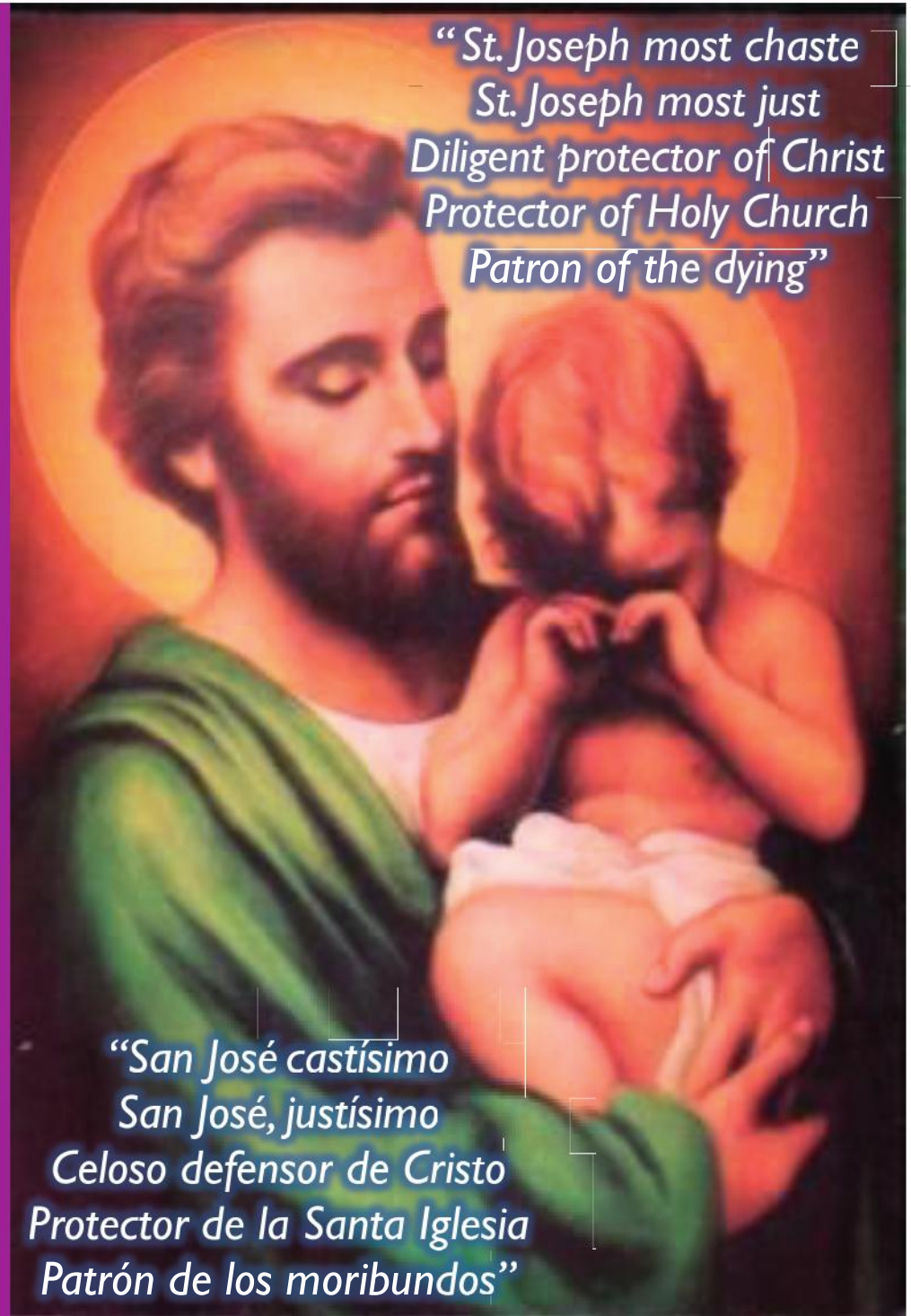

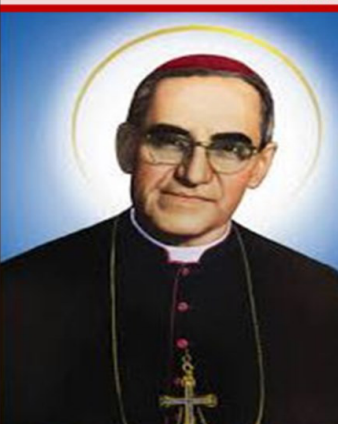

Saint Oscar Arnulfo Romero, Martyr

Feast: 24th March



Prayer

Almighty God, you called your servant Oscar Romero to be a voice for the voiceless poor, and to give his life as a seed of freedom and a sign of hope: Grant that we, inspired by his sacrifice and the example of the martyrs of El Salvador, may without fear or favor witness to your Word who is Life, even Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be praise and glory now and for ever. Amen.

READY TO FLY



In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus used the grain of wheat as an example to explain the mystery of death and resurrection to a group of people who were familiar with agriculture. A grain not buried cannot bring life to a new plant or produce more fruits or seeds. Jesus uses this comparison to demonstrate that death is not the end but the starting point of a new life.

Tertullian, one of the Fathers of the Church, wrote: "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of Christians." In the early years of Christianity, when Christians were being persecuted, there were thousands of martyrs. The Roman Empire believed that killing Christians would end Christianity, but it actually did the opposite. As more Christians were martyred, the greater was the growth and strength of Christianity.

During Spring, I like to observe the metamorphosis of butterflies. During this time, we collect many caterpillars and place them in a cage in our Parish Office. We observe how they become fat after eating the milkweed leaves and make their own cocoon, which will serve as their home for approximately two weeks. It initially looks like a dead worm before a beautiful butterfly emerges. A couple of hours after birth and after consuming some water mixed with honey, the butterfly is ready to begin its flight. These animals can live for 24 days or, like the monarch butterfly, for nine months.

I like butterflies. For me, they symbolize the resurrection or transformation of life. When we die, we are transformed into a glorious body like Christ's. That is why we should never fear dying when convinced of the truth about eternal life.

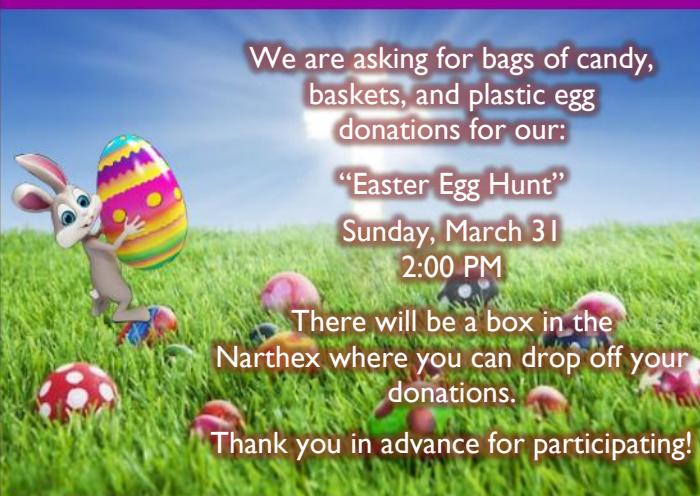

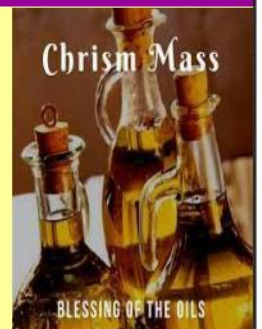

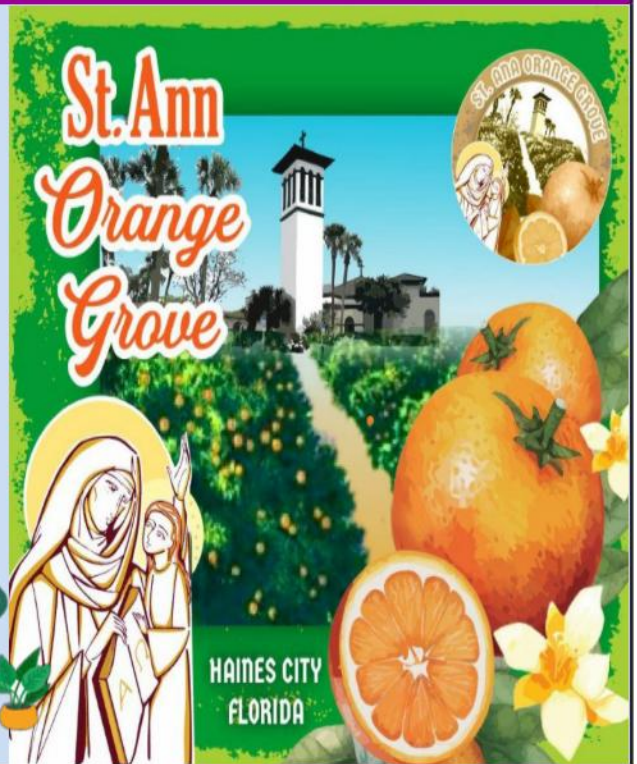

WHY DO CATHOLICS COVER CRUCIFIXES AND STATUES DURING HOLY WEEK?



Veils over sacred images keep our minds on the promise of Easter: It seems strange that during the most sacred time of year, Catholics cover everything beautiful in their churches, even the crucifix. Shouldn't we be looking at the painful scene at Calvary while we listen to the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday?

Veiling of statues and images: While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Lent, the Catholic Church recommends this practice to heighten our senses and build a longing for Easter Sunday. It is a tradition that should not only be carried out in our local parish but can also be a fruitful activity for the "domestic church" to practice.

The rubrics can guide us. In the Roman Missal, we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from Sunday may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

This is the Church's current practice, but veiling from the Fifth Sunday of Lent onward is minuscule compared to what was once practiced. For example, in Germany, there was a tradition to veil the altar from view throughout Lent.

Families are encouraged to imitate this practice and veil prominent religious images in their homes. It helps us participate in the liturgical season, especially if we are prevented from attending Mass during the week. Otherwise, we only see the veiled images in church once or twice before Easter, which has a minor effect on us. It is also a beautiful tradition to pass down to our children, who will be intrigued by it, and it will make this time of year truly special for them. We go to great lengths to decorate our homes for Easter, so why not prepare for the great feast using veils?

Why cover up something beautiful? But why go to such lengths to cover up images designed to raise our hearts and minds toward heaven?

First, we use veils to alert us of the special time we are in. When we walk into church and notice everything is covered, we immediately know something is different. These last two weeks of Lent are meant to be a time of immediate preparation for the Sacred Triduum, and these veils are a forceful reminder to get ready.

Second, the veils focus our attention on the words being said at Mass. When we listen to the Passion narrative, our senses can focus on the striking words from the Gospel and truly enter into the scene.

Third, the church uses veils to create heightened anticipation for Easter Sunday. This is further actualized when you attend daily Mass and see the veils each day. You don't want them to be there because they hide some beautiful images.

And therein lies the whole point: the veils are not meant to be there forever. The images need to be unveiled; it is unnatural for them to be covered.

The unveiling before the Easter Vigil is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a "veiled" world, exiled from our true home. Only through our own death is the veil lifted, and we can finally see the beauty of everything in our lives.

LISTO PARA VOLAR



En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús tomó como ejemplo el grano de trigo para explicar el misterio de la muerte y la resurrección a un grupo de personas familiarizadas con la agricultura. Un grano no enterrado no puede dar vida a una nueva planta ni producir más frutos o semillas. Jesús usa esta comparación para demostrar que la muerte no es el final sino el punto de partida de una nueva vida.

Tertuliano, uno de los Padres de la Iglesia, escribió: “La sangre de los mártires es la semilla de los cristianos”. En los primeros años del cristianismo, cuando los cristianos eran perseguidos, hubo miles de mártires. El Imperio Romano creía que matar cristianos acabaría con el cristianismo, pero en realidad hizo todo lo contrario. Cuanto más cristianos eran martirizados, mayor era el crecimiento y la fuerza del cristianismo.

Durante la primavera me gusta observar la metamorfosis de las mariposas. Durante este tiempo, recolectamos muchas orugas y las colocamos en una jaula en nuestra Oficina Parroquial. Observamos cómo engordan después de comer las hojas del palo de leche y elaboran su propio capullo, que les servirá de hogar durante aproximadamente dos semanas. Inicialmente parece un gusano muerto antes de que surja una hermosa mariposa. Un par de horas después de nacer y después de consumir un poco de agua mezclada con miel, la mariposa está lista para iniciar su vuelo. Estos animales pueden vivir 24 días o, como la mariposa monarca, nueve meses.

Me gustan las mariposas. Para mí simbolizan la resurrección o transformación de la vida. Cuando morimos, somos transformados en un cuerpo glorioso como el de Cristo. Por eso nunca debemos temer morir cuando estamos convencidos de la verdad sobre la vida eterna.

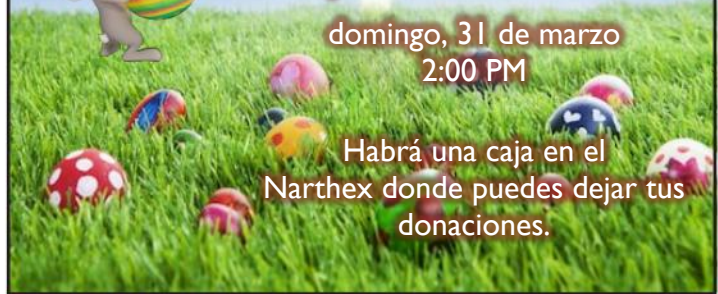

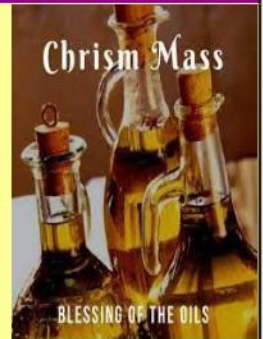
