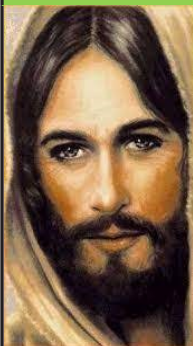

BY THE GRACE OF GOD, GO !!



Greetings!

On this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, both the first reading and Gospel indicate that God looks past the heroic and successful, those who think they are the beautiful people, and pours His love onto the underdogs, the unsuccessful, the disposable people.

This beckons a comment or two about today's Responsorial Psalm response, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." At first glance, that does not seem to be what the Lord is doing: the poor remain poor, the sick continue to be sick, and those suffering injustices are still being ground under, often enough at the hands of those who shamefully call themselves "good Catholics."

Since Jesus began working with us through a Church of human beings guided by the Spirit, we still have those "poor" among us, just as Jesus foretold. If God loves the little ones, why does God not do more for them? Should we not see some results? Admittedly, these are tough questions to be asked, and even more challenging for any of us to give an adequate response that will change the minds of those who ask such questions.

We must remember we are active members of Christ's Mystical Body. This means that the Glorified Christ, who remains active in our world today, uses us as the conduits through which to work. So, as the human occupants of this mortal world, the Glorified Christ, actively loving this world, uses our hearts. In solving the world's problems, the Glorified Christ uses our minds. In His desire to feed, heal, and lift up the poor, the Glorified Christ uses our hands. So, if Christ works through us, even amid all the good that does occur, we, as a group of imperfect and flawed people, quite often block the very efforts of Our Lord to do what He would like to accomplish in our world.

God created us as radically imperfect beings, and He alone will bring that perfection to us. He writes straight with our crooked lines, but He loves our scribbles and scratches because it is us, His beloved children, who are offering our imperfect selves as our gift to God. However, God needs us to open ourselves up to the unconditional transformation He offers us.

Ultimately, it needs to be our hope, with the help of our Lord, that we can push ourselves not to block the efforts of our Lord to use us to accomplish what we know to be right. We must listen to the Holy Spirit telling us what actions we must take to help those having difficulty traversing the adversities of everyday life. We often say, "It is by the Grace of God, go I." Well, that Grace comes through those willing to be used by God for the Greater Good! We must ensure we remain as open for someone else as someone had been for us!

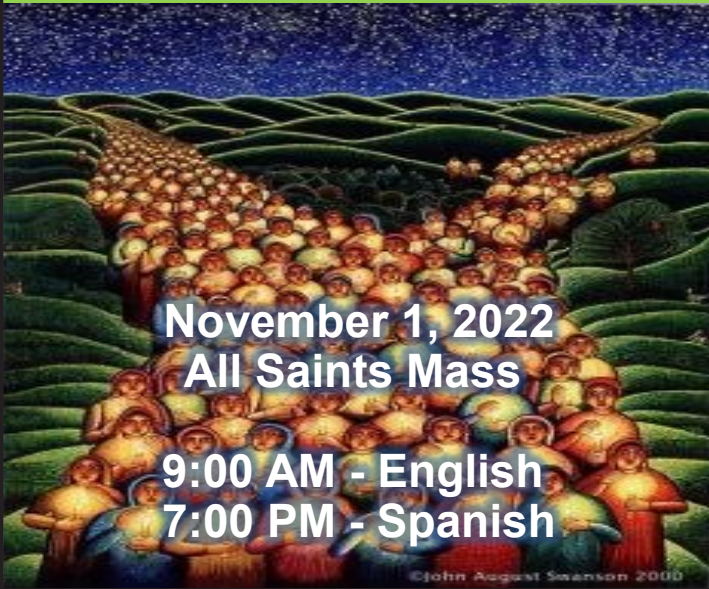

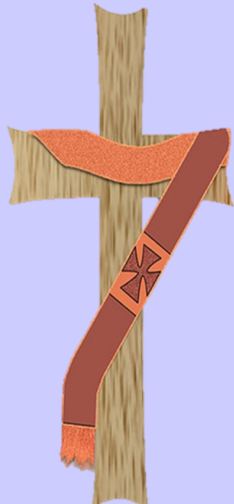

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ANTHONY MARY CLARET



Anthony Mary Claret, the “spiritual father of Cuba,” was a missionary, religious founder, social reformer, queen’s chaplain, writer and publisher, archbishop, and refugee. He was a Spaniard whose work took him to the Canary Islands, Cuba, Madrid, Paris, and the First Vatican Council.

In his spare time as a weaver and designer in the textile mills of Barcelona, Anthony learned Latin and printing: The future priest and publisher was preparing. Ordained at 28, he was prevented by ill health from entering religious life as a Carthusian or as a Jesuit but went on to become one of Spain’s most popular preachers.

Anthony spent ten years giving popular missions and retreats, always emphasizing the Eucharist and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It was said that his rosary was never out of his hand. At age 42, he founded a religious institute of missionaries beginning with five young priests, known today as the Claretians.

Anthony was appointed to head the much-neglected archdiocese of Santiago in Cuba. He began its reform by almost ceaseless preaching and hearing of confessions and suffered bitter opposition, mainly for opposing concubinage and giving instruction to black slaves. A hired assassin—whose release from prison Anthony had obtained—slashed open his face and wrist. Anthony succeeded in getting the would-be assassin’s death sentence commuted to a prison term. His solution for the misery of Cubans was family-owned farms producing a variety of foods for the family’s own needs and the market. This invited the enmity of the vested interests who wanted everyone to work on a single cash crop—sugar. Besides all his religious writings are two books he wrote in Cuba: *Reflections on Agriculture* and *Country Delights*.

He was recalled to Spain for a job he did not relish—chaplain for the queen. Anthony went on three conditions: He would reside away from the palace; he would come only to hear the queen’s confession and instruct the children; and he would be exempt from court functions. In the revolution of 1868, he fled to Paris with the queen’s party, where he preached to the Spanish colony.

All his life, Anthony was interested in the Catholic press. He founded the Religious Publishing House, a major Catholic publishing venture in Spain, and wrote or published 200 books and pamphlets.

At Vatican I, where he was a staunch defender of the doctrine of infallibility, Anthony won the admiration of his fellow bishops. Cardinal Gibbons of Baltimore remarked of him, “There goes a true saint.” At 63, he died in exile near the border of Spain.

Reflection: Jesus foretold that those who are truly his representatives would suffer the same persecution as he did. Besides 14 attempts on his life, Anthony had to undergo such a barrage of the ugliest slander that the very name Claret became a byword for humiliation and misfortune. The powers of evil do not easily give up their prey. No one needs to go looking for persecution. All we need to do is be sure we suffer because of our genuine faith in Christ, not for our own whims and lack of prudence.

3. Drop the gift cards in the collection box at church.

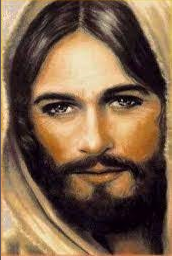
All cards must be brought in by November 20, 2022.

¡POR LA GRACIA DE DIOS, VOY YO!



En este domingo 30 del Tiempo Ordinario, ambos la primera lectura y el Evangelio indican que Dios mira más allá de los heroicos y exitosos, aquellos que se creen gente hermosa, y derrama Su amor sobre los desvalidos, los fracasados, los descartables.

Esto invita a uno o dos comentarios sobre la respuesta del Salmo Responsorial de hoy: "El Señor escucha el clamor de los pobres". A primera vista, eso no parece ser lo que el Señor está haciendo: los pobres siguen siendo pobres, los enfermos siguen estando enfermos, y los que sufren injusticias siguen siendo aplastados, muchas veces a manos de quienes vergonzosamente se llaman a sí mismos "buenos católicos".

Desde que Jesús comenzó a trabajar con nosotros a través de una Iglesia de seres humanos guiados por el Espíritu, todavía tenemos entre nosotros a esos "pobres", tal como Jesús lo predijo. Si Dios ama a los pequeños, ¿por qué Dios no hace más por ellos? ¿No deberíamos ver algunos resultados? Es cierto que estas son preguntas difíciles de hacer, y aún más desafiante para cualquiera de nosotros dar una respuesta adecuada que cambie la mente de quienes hacen tales preguntas.

Debemos recordar que somos miembros activos del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo. Esto significa que el Cristo Glorificado, que permanece activo en nuestro mundo de hoy, nos utiliza como conductos a través de los cuales obrar. Entonces, como ocupantes humanos de este mundo mortal, el Cristo Glorificado, amando activamente este mundo, usa nuestros corazones. Al resolver los problemas del mundo, el Cristo Glorificado usa nuestras mentes. En Su deseo de alimentar, sanar y levantar a los pobres, el Cristo Glorificado usa nuestras manos. Entonces, si Cristo obra a través de nosotros, incluso en medio de todo el bien que ocurre, nosotros, como un grupo de personas imperfectas y defectuosas, a menudo bloqueamos los mismos esfuerzos de Nuestro Señor para hacer lo que le gustaría lograr en nuestro mundo.

Dios nos creó como seres radicalmente imperfectos, y solo Él nos traerá esa perfección. Él escribe recto con nuestras líneas torcidas, pero ama nuestros garabatos y rasguños porque somos nosotros, sus amados hijos, quienes ofrecemos nuestro ser imperfecto como nuestro regalo a Dios. Sin embargo, Dios necesita que nos abramos a la transformación incondicional que Dios nos ofrece.

En última instancia, debe ser nuestra esperanza, con la ayuda de nuestro Señor, que podamos esforzarnos por no bloquear los esfuerzos de nuestro Señor para usarnos para lograr lo que sabemos que es correcto. Debemos escuchar al Espíritu Santo diciéndonos qué acciones debemos tomar para ayudar a quienes tienen dificultades para atravesar las adversidades de la vida cotidiana. A menudo decimos: "Es por la gracia de Dios, voy yo". ¡Bueno, esa Gracia viene a través de aquellos que están dispuestos a ser usados por Dios para el Bien Mayor! ¡Debemos asegurarnos de permanecer tan abiertos para alguien más como alguien lo ha sido para nosotros!
