A Cleveland landmark, the City Greenhouse had its origins in 1902 as a nursery, growing plants to beautify Cityowned parks and public spaces. Today, visitors to Rockefeller Park Greenhouse will find a botanical garden with indoor and outdoor display areas featuring specialty plant collections, rotating seasonal floral displays, and enchanting theme gardens.

BETTY OTT TALKING GARDEN

The Betty Ott Talking Garden is a sensory garden designed especially for sight-impaired visitors, but is open to all. The Garden features textured and aromatic plants that engage the senses, particularly those of touch, smell, and sound.



PEACE GARDEN

The Peace Garden's winding paths lead visitors through an old-fashioned gazebo, past rose and perennial gardens, and around colorful flower beds including the All-America Selections Display Garden which showcases national AAS-winning flower varieties.



INDOOR EXHIBITS

Inside the Greenhouse, visitors can experience:

- Tropical fruits and palms including citrus trees & banana plants
- Seasonal flowers featuring spectacular holiday poinsettias, spring bulbs, and flowering plant displays throughout the year

THE MALL

Structured and serene, The Mall is a traditional formal garden with clipped hedges enclosing a manicured grass center. Elegant statues placed at each corner of the garden represent the four seasons.



WILLOTT IRIS GARDEN

The Willott Iris Garden is a tribute to iris experts and longtime Greenhouse volunteers, Tony and Dorothy Willott. The Garden features many of the award-winning varieties that they grew and bred at Rockefeller Park Greenhouse





JAPANESE GARDEN

Developed during the 1960s, this garden uses plants and materials to suggest a soothing, ancient, and faraway landscape. Of special interest is the Metasequoia, or Dawn Redwood Tree, grown from one of six seeds brought from Japan.
