1. The billboard outside your pharmacy is a prominent display. Is there a history of community wellness wishes that the billboard has displayed?

The students who designed the billboard have exactly the right message. Taking drugs, specifically drugs that involve THC marijuana interfere with making good decisions in life, controlling emotions when dealing with other people and possible violent situations in the family, and keeping impulsive behavior under control

2. Why is "Vaping and the Brain" important to you?

There are enough problems dealing with daily life, family, school, and work without having a damaged brain, lungs, other organs, and trying to make good decisions. We know it take years to clear the brain of toxins after quitting drugs. People change while on drugs and some never come back to the normal loving

It is not only vaping, but part of a current culture that is telling youth that being on drugs is OK. No, it is not. I have a family member who started marijuana at age twelve and went on to other drugs. He caused endless heartache in our family even though my loving parents tried everything. He became a changed person and never came back to us, not really. My heart still aches. It aches for all of my students and families who have experienced this pain.

3. You have a professional lifetime involving the inclusion of youth in the development of ideas and solutions. Can we do more and follow your example?

Look at the video contest we had, for example. If anyone can teach and reach youth, it is peers. The teams researched information, discussed it, sifted through it, and decided how to produce the videos. The information must become part of them. There must emotional involvement. They must believe the project is important and worthwhile. Youth like to save people and the world. They like causes. Any campaign to reach youth must include them on the team. That is not easy, but it is they only way. The Children's Museum is designed with that same teaching method and is extremely successful.


