

#### The Value of Prevention

New research has shown that the value of CTC in the community has almost doubled! For every \$1 invested in CTC, \$11.13 is returned in the form of lower criminal justice system, crime victim, and health care costs and increased earnings and tax revenues. This is up from \$5.31 previously.



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## **Coming in August: Narcan Distribution Day**

Narcan is an opioid overdose reversal drug available as a nasal spray. Anyone who has a prescription for opioids should have Narcan on hand in case they or a family member accidentally ingest too much.

## MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS








The Marquette County Cares Coalition (MC2) will be partnering with Start the Cycle, MARESA and Great Lakes Recovery Centers to provide a youth biking event with Communities Talk funds the coalition received from SAMHSA. A motivational speaker will be speaking with the youth about the importance of choosing healthy alternatives, such as biking, to underage drinking. This event will be held on August 19th at the Negaunee Township Hall.

On August 31st, MC2 will be distributing Narcan in the Marquette Commons from 10 - 4 PM. This life-saving medication is free to all community members. The public is encouraged to stop by to learn how to administer Narcan and to pick up their free doses. This event is being held on the International Overdose Awareness day to help raise awareness of overdose, reduce the stigma associated with Narcan, and to increase the amount of community members who have Narcan in case of a life-threatening emergency.
