



Week 4: Confession and Belief

Lesson: Confession and Belief (5 minutes)

Start by asking the kids if they remember what the Romans Road is and what it teaches us about God's love and salvation.

Read Romans 10:9 aloud: "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

Discuss the verse:

Explain that confessing with our mouth means openly saying that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. Talk about how belief in our hearts means truly trusting and relying on Jesus' death and resurrection for our salvation.

Share a simple story or example to help them understand the concept:

For instance, imagine you have a secret treasure hidden in a box. To get the treasure, you need to know the special password and believe that the treasure is real. Similarly, confessing and believing in Jesus are like using the password to receive the amazing gift of salvation.

Ask the kids:

Why is it important to confess that Jesus is Lord with our mouth?

How does believing in Jesus change the way we live and think?

Encourage the kids to think of ways they can confess their faith and beliefs, such as by praying, talking to their friends, or even doing kind things to show God's love.

Close the lesson with a short prayer:

Thank God for sending Jesus to save us.

Ask God to help us always confess our faith and believe in Him.
