Red teaming

- ▶ Military war-gaming planning tool
- ▶ Blue team (friend) vs. Red Team (foe)
- ▶ Process to challenge and prove plans
- ▶ Objective identified, plan devised
- ▶ Red team:
 - Examine plan
 - Identify points of failure/weakness
 - Counter-tactics
- ▶ Planners:
 - Revise, Red team repeat, revise etc
- ▶ Objective:
 - Reduce risk/ Secure outcome
- ▶ Implement plan.

Red teaming & business continuity

- ▶ Two purposes
- ▶ 1. Same context as military origins (check existing plan for POFs)
Should involve:
 - Planners (people who wrote the plan)
 - Response team members
 - Anyone with required technical expertise or interest
- ▶ 2. Engagement tool
 - Scenario for an identified risk/threat
 - Representatives from different departments
 - Work through the scenario
 - What you would be doing? Who would you be talking to? What needs to happen?
 - What do you need to know to respond effectively?

Red teaming conclusion

▶ Direct Benefits:

- Demonstrates gaps and defines 'need'
- Creates awareness
- Involves key stakeholders in the process (budget-holders, responders, wider staff)
- Identifies threats, risks and points of failure
- Identifies strategic and operational priorities
- Demonstrates organisation/agency interdependencies
- The only cost is time (and not very much time!)

▶ Wider benefits:

- Team building
- Better appreciation of other departments' priorities
- Breaks down silo working.
