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

## Unleashed: Nini Iris's Defiant Roar with "U CAN'T CONTROL ME"

The numbers are staggering: a reported \$130 million in revenue generated in the first week alone, spanning vinyl sales, streaming, traditional records, and an exclusive theatrical film. This isn't just a record; it's a financial masterclass. How did she pull off this tremendous, near-unprecedented feat? The answer lies in a meticulously coordinated strategy that monetizes every facet of her art and her fanbase's fierce dedication.

#### The Multi-Variant Marketing Machine

The cornerstone of the historic first-week revenue wasn't just an album; it was dozens of albums. Swift's strategy of releasing a plethora of physical variants has become her signature weapon in the sales war, and she took it to an extreme with Life of A Showgirl.

- The Collector's Hunt: Reports indicate Swift released upwards of 34 versions of the album.
   This included nearly 30 physical editions—a mix of CDs, eight different vinyl LPs, and even a cassette.
- Scarcity and Exclusivity: Each variant often featured unique cover art, collectible bonus tracks, or exclusive content (like the "original songwriting memos" on certain digital copies).
   This manufacturing of scarcity compels dedicated fans—the "Swifties"—to buy multiple copies to complete their collections.


LMARX recently sat down with us for an on and off camera interview. Look out for the full interview on our website and the video interview on our YouTube Channel.

CHRD: Florida R&B has a distinct feel, often blending classic soul with Trap or Dancehall rhythms from the Caribbean influences in the state. How has the specific culture and sonic landscape of Florida—from Miami to Jacksonville—shaped the core sound and lyrical themes of your music?

LMARX: My R&B has that bounce, but there's still emotion and storytelling in it. Miami brings the rhythm, Jacksonville gives that grit, and I try to meet somewhere in the middle—smooth melodies over beats that still knock. While focusing on the art of storytelling about making love and also being loved on as well.



For me, R&B has always been about emotion first — that real, honest passion you can feel - LMARX


With Double Vision Vol.2

Where Jett's earlier work has hinted at potential, this new chapter delivers and makes his potential undeniable.

There's a clarity to Jett's vision, a sense of control in the chaos. His songs spill out with a rare mix of confidence and honesty, the kind that makes you feel like you're catching someone mid-breakthrough.

Jett sat down with CHRD Magazine to talk evolution, duality, and what it really takes to keep your artistry intact when the noise gets louder.

"It's kind of intentionally emotionally shallow, which sounds insane to say, but leaning into the cliché of it all was so much fun." - Jett Blyton CHRD: Double Vision Vol.2 feels like a continuation of the story. Where does this new chapter pick up emotionally and creatively for you?

Jett: The ethos behind Double Vision has always been my love letter to pop, discovery of sound and paying homage to those before me. Emotionally, a lot of the songs feel singular in their approach, though somehow, I've ended up writing about a lot of parties for volume two and being in that altered state of mind-seeing double, if you will. It's kind of intentionally emotionally shallow, which sounds insane to say, but leaning into the cliche of it all was so much fun. It's a blaring synth project, with a major early 2010's energy throughout. Capital P Pop.

CHRD: How has your sound or mindset evolved since Vol. 1?

Jett: I am a completely different person! Everything is changing for me, and I feel a lot clearer about my creative vision and my future. I'm writing my best music right now. Lots of guitars. I can't wait for people to hear it.

#### A SURPRISING START

CHRD: What was inspiring you during the writing and recording process for this EP? Were there particular moments, people, or even visuals that sparked it?

Jett: During the recording process, I was inspired by Lady Gaga and Charli XCX. I think Charli XCX is one of the greatest artists of our time, and her music will age like wine. I was also inspired by, as aforementioned, the parties! I was going to a lot of parties when I was writing this and having so much fun. I think it rubbed off in the music.



#### A BORN ENTERTAINER

CHRD: Do you feel like Double Vision represents two sides of yourself, or is it more about sound and experimentation?

Jett: Definitely more about sound and experimentation. I think it represents the funnest side of me though: when I'm at the pre's, three Aperol spritz' deep.



There are singers, and then there are forces of nature. Georgia Black, the alternative R&B powerhouse hailing from North London, firmly belongs in the latter camp. With a voice as rich and commanding as a vintage Merlot, she's not just performing —she's holding court.

Inspired by the ultimate queens of command—the dramatic flair of Shirley Bassey, the raw grit of Etta James, and the cool elegance of Peggy Lee—Georgia has synthesized these iconic voices into something utterly her own. It's a sound that's both an immediate throwback and fiercely contemporary, blending her deep roots in Jazz, Blues, and Soul with sleek, modern production.

Georgia's career didn't just start; it exploded onto the scene. She first captivated the crowds as the frontwoman for Agent Provocateur's show-band, Dirty Stop Out. Sharing stages with rock legends like The Clash's Mick Jones and Primal Scream's Bobby Gillespie, she honed a stage presence that could fill venues from Camden's KOKO to the glittering spectacle of Vienna's Life Ball and Berlin Fashion Week.





The Voice provided the spotlight, but Marcus provided the blinding light. That platform showcased the compelling combination that defines him: a powerful, soulful vocal delivery paired with a stage presence so effortlessly captivating, it felt star-struck even through the screen. While the show provided the catalyst, Rodriguez's subsequent success has been driven by something far more authentic than reality TV buzz: a deep, intimate connection with his audience, built one genuine note at a time. He isn't just performing for the crowd; he's sharing a journey with them.

That journey hit its most profound peak in October 2025 with the release of his first complete musical installment, the album, THE BREAKTHROUGH (DELUXE).

Hailed as his most insightful work to date, the album is less a collection of songs and more a spiritual and artistic evolution captured within the narration of his personal life between the ages of 18 and 23.

Working alongside the innovative production duo Blurry Vizzion, Marcus crafted an engaging, cohesive sound that seamlessly merges R&B and Pop. This is where his sonic genius truly shines: the production is rich and inviting, blending modern electronic beats with traditional acoustic elements, all while his signature smooth vocal delivery glides over the top, showcasing an impressive emotional range.



#### The Generative AI Revolution in Music Creation

The integration of Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) is the most disruptive current trend, fundamentally changing how music is made and consumed. AI tools can now instantly generate complex melodies, beats, and even realistic vocal tracks from simple text prompts, democratizing high-quality production and allowing non-musicians to create music. However, this has ignited a fierce debate over copyright and compensation, with artists and rights holders demanding legal clarity and protection against AI models being trained on their work without fair payment, fearing a devaluation of human creativity and a loss of income.

#### The Crisis of Streaming Compensation & Fan-Centric Models

Despite streaming platforms generating the vast majority of music industry revenue, the current "pro-rata" payment model—where all subscription money is pooled distributed based on market share-results in incredibly low per-stream payouts for the vast majority of artists. This structural issue has fueled a crisis of sustainability for musicians, leading to working major platforms experimenting with "fan-centric" or "user-centric" payment models.

#### The Vinyl Revival and the Collectability Factor

In an era dominated by digital files, physical music formats are experiencing a remarkable resurgence, with vinyl records leading the charge. Sales of LPs have consistently grown for over a decade, driven not just by nostalgic audiophiles but increasingly by Gen Z collectors who value the superior sound quality, the tangible nature, and the aesthetic appeal of album artwork.

THE MOMENT THE WORLD WATCHED: SINÉAD O'CONNOR'S ELECTRIC SHOCK ON SNL

## **FLASHBACK**

ICONIC MOMENTS IN MUSIC THAT HAPPENED THIS MONTH.

OCTOBER 3, 1992 WAS SUPPOSED TO BE A STANDARD NIGHT OF SKETCH COMEDY AND MUSICAL PERFORMANCE ON NBC'S SATURDAY NIGHT LIVE. INSTEAD, IT BECAME A MOMENT THAT INSTANTLY REDEFINED THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CELEBRITY, PROTEST, AND LIVE TELEVISION. ON THAT NIGHT, IRISH SINGER SINÉAD O'CONNOR, ALREADY A GLOBAL STAR KNOWN FOR HER SHAVED HEAD, INTENSE SINCERITY, AND CHART-TOPPING HIT "NOTHING COMPARES 2 U," DELIVERED A STUNNING ACT OF DEFIANCE THAT CONTINUES TO BE ANALYZED AND DEBATED DECADES LATER.

O'CONNOR'S SCHEDULED APPEARANCE WAS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROMOTE HER THEN-NEW ALBUM. FOR HER SECOND SONG, SHE CHOSE A SOLEMN, A CAPPELLA RENDITION OF BOB MARLEY'S "WAR," SUBSTITUTING SOME OF THE LYRICS TO FOCUS ON CHILD ABUSE RATHER THAN RACIAL INJUSTICE. THE PERFORMANCE WAS RAW AND EMOTIONALLY GRIPPING, SHOWCASING HER UNDENIABLE VOCAL POWER.

THE PLANNED CLIMAX OF THE PERFORMANCE, HOWEVER, WAS A SECRET KNOWN ONLY TO HER.

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
