



KINTORE COUNCILLOR REPORT - G. Reid

Kintore Surgery - Community Frustrations and Request to Reopen

In support of the recent petition, I have written to Aberdeenshire Health and Social Care Partnership (see below) to express the communities' frustrations at the non-provision of GP appointments at Kintore Medical Centre. It is a matter that is outwith the remit of the council, but so vital to us all that something must be done to improve the situation.

"After various communications with Inverurie Medical Group's Practice Systems Manager, where I expressed the disappointment and frustrations of the community about the non-provision of GP appointments at our Kintore surgery, I was assured by her and Dr Smith that this was not a permanent position, that they were carrying out a review after the 2023 summer holiday period and would then return to providing pre-booked appointments in Kintore.

I followed this up a couple of times, and was initially told that the review had not taken place yet, but in the last reply I was told that they would not be changing this at the moment:

'The GPs are independent contractors. The Partnership is essentially a business with a contract to provide healthcare provision. Due to a variety of factors you are aware of, resources are meagre. The GP Partners make decisions as to how best to provision their resources to serve the entire population whilst fulfilling contractual obligations. I am sorry that this is the situation, unfortunately we are unable to facilitate any changes at the moment.

If you do find this response unsatisfactory, I suggest you raise this with the Aberdeenshire Health & Social Care Partnership, although I do believe there are regular meetings between them and council representatives.'

A year has passed, and the situation has not changed and therefore I have decided to take it up with yourself as the local area manager of the Aberdeenshire Health & Social Care Partnership. There already exists a deficit of NHS provision in some areas of Aberdeenshire, especially in my ward where Newmachar and Blackburn constituents have to go to Aberdeen to access their GP practices and now you are overseeing another where the Kintore service has not been reinstated as promised and Kintore residents have to go to Inverurie to access their GP services.

We are a town of 5,000 people, and as such we have a considerable number of elderly people, people with mobility issues, young families and they are struggling to access their GP service. Public transport has worsened and there is now no direct bus to the GP practice, plus we are living in a cost of living crisis and people shouldn't have to pay for public transport to access their GPs when there is a surgery building already in Kintore.

People are aware that there are lots of resource pressures on the surgery, but we need a compromise. No one is expecting that it be reopened five days a week, but it is surely not beyond the resources of the practice to at least reopen the surgery for two or three days per week. What seems to be lacking is the will to do this and therefore I am requesting a meeting with yourself so we can discuss how we can resolve this.

It is unfair that the 10th largest town in Aberdeenshire is treated like a subsidiary of Inverurie. We need to remember that when things did not suit the practice they decided to hand back their contract. They then changed their minds, promised community engagement and the restoration of GP appointments in Kintore. However, they have reneged on this and if they will not honour their

not compromise and offer some appointments in our local surgery then perhaps you should look to remove Kintore from their practice and appoint another medical group to operate from Kintore.

The feeling in the town is so strongly in support of the surgery reopening that a recent petition on the subject gathered approximately 700 signatures within a matter of weeks.

I look forward to hearing from you and meeting you asap to see what resolution can be found to this hugely important issue."

Kintore Station Lights - Fixed

I have had multiple complaints from various constituents from Kintore and outwith that the lights were not working/on at the Station at night.

I raised the issue with various officers, as I no longer have a contact at Network Rail (NR), over the last two weeks as I know how concerning this has been for many people.

I was informed last week that NR were aware of the problem. I continued to chase this and yesterday I was told that NR had fixed them on the 2nd of October.

Hopefully this will give people some peace of mind when planning their trips.

Meet Gary Coutts

It's Your Neighbourhood Volunteer



Do you originally come from Kintore?

Yes, despite now staying just outside Alford I work full time at Jim Reid Vehicle Sales & Service as a driver/handyman based in Kintore and was born and raised in Kintore. Living with my late mum Mabel and dad Jim at 100 Kingsfield Road, where dad still stays now. I went to Kintore Primary School and spent my first and second year of senior schooling at Kintore when the secondary school was open before finishing my schooling at the then brand new Kemnay Academy in 1982.

After leaving school I became an apprentice Plasterer/Tile Fixer working for Eric Yule before getting an opportunity to join Taits Paper Mill in Port Elphinstone and worked there for 27 years before it sadly closed in March 2009. Following that redundancy, I had a few jobs locally and latterly worked on my wife Alison's family farm Mains of Tonley, Alford looking after their famous Aberdeen Angus herd amongst other things. Following an almost fatal brain aneurism I was advised to get a less stressful and manual labour-intensive job and saw an opening for a position with Team Reid as a driver/handyman about 6 years ago which is something I absolutely love because the job is so wide and varied, plus it gives me the opportunity to help out in the community.

You have been heavily involved this year with the Kintore – It's Your Neighbourhood Project can you tell us more about that?

IYN is an initiative set up by Kintore and District Community Council with my boss Jim Reid being Team Lead, it gave me the opportunity to participate, helping give something back to my hometown Kintore. Amongst other things, I have been involved with grass cutting, strimming, weeding, cleaning and washing bus shelters, the fountain, painting the tar at the Town House, filling potholes in various areas around the town, refurbishing benches across the town, making new flower beds, maintaining the trash pumps for the resilience team and even filling sandbags for the floods. So, as you can see it's been a really busy time over the last 12 -18 months, but I thoroughly enjoy it because I see it makes a difference and often Jim Reid is with me and we have a fantastic laugh, joke and share some great stories.

What has been your highlight this year?

I received a special award at work for helping out in the community but I'm very proud of helping Team Reid win the community STARS award from the Scottish Motor Trade Association recently to acknowledge our Team's fantastic effort helping out the local community.

Do you think others should follow your lead and help out volunteering?

Absolutely 100%, it is a great way to give back and help others. Anvone who wants to help Kintore look better should get involved with the It's Your Neighbourhood Project in 2025, trust me there is plenty to do!

Our team help animals throughout the year. As we head into winter, there are things you can do to help animals in your local area.

Keep antifreeze out of reach of pets and wildlife. If you suspect any animal has consumed antifreeze, contact a vet immediately. Look out for signs of staggering, increased drinking and urinating, lethargy, vomiting, seizures and difficulty breathing.

As it gets icy, don't take unnecessary risks. Slips and falls are just as likely for our pets as they are for us. Consider keeping your pet inside during severe weather.

Keep your dog on a lead on walks near frozen water. If the worst happens and they fall through, don't enter the

water. Seek assistance from a passerby and break ice from the bank to increase the chances of the animal making its way back. Their chance of rescue is higher if you're not the focus.

Pets Get Winter Blues Too

It is that wonderful time of year again with winter walks, snowmen and roaring fires. As the cold weather arrives, spare a thought for pets of all shapes and sizes who feel the cold too!

Dogs: Many of our canine patients love the snow! Owners are delighted to see their dog tearing around in a snowy park and rolling in snowdrifts. Smaller breeds (such as Chihuahuas or Yorkshire terriers), slimmer breeds (such as Lurchers or Greyhounds) or thin coated breeds (such as boxers) will feel the cold more. They might appreciate a well fitted doggy jacket to keep them warm when they are outside playing. Salt from road gritters can cause sore feet when out walking, so perhaps stick to verges or paths if the gritters have been out. Don't be surprised if older dogs start to feel stiff, colder weather can play havoc with stiff joints. If your dog is starting to stiffen up in the mornings or after exercise, he or she could be suffering from early stage arthritis. If you are worried that this might be the case then please contact your vet because there are many things that can be done to ease the stiffness and make your dog feel a lot better.

Outdoor Pets: (E.g. Rabbits, Guinea Pigs or even Chickens) need special consideration at this time of the year. Keep your hutches and coops extra clean, and make sure that they are dry and free from draughts. Move hutches to a sheltered position if possible, preferably inside a shed or garage. Add extra bedding, and even consider insulating the outside of a hutch or coop with blankets or house insulation. Give them fresh water and food every day and check the water bottle or dish every day to ensure it doesn't freeze up.

Anti-Freeze: Many people are changing their cars' antifreeze at this time of year. There may be half used tubs or pots lying around your street or a neighbour's garden. Dogs and cats find antifreeze tasty (it is a sweet substance) and will often try to drink it. However antifreeze is highly toxic and ingestion is often fatal. We have had a number of cats hospitalised at our surgery with anti-freeze poisoning over the years and even with intensive treatment, sadly they rarely pull through. Speak to your neighbours and check your shed for old bottles of antifreeze, and keep your pets safe!

With the summer just a distant memory, it can be tempting to take a pause in the battle to keep your pets and your home flea free! Fleas can be just as active during the winter because the central heating stimulates the eggs to hatch in the house. A single adult flea can lay over 50 eggs per day – so even a brief pause in flea protection can allow literally thousands of fleas to hatch, leading to an infestation.

Embrace the holiday cheer and play safe this festive season!

In 1982 a man from my home-town who delighted in the name, "Crocodile" Harris, made it into the South African Christmas pop charts with a song called "Give Me the Good News". He was a one-hit wonder; we never heard from him again. The song wasn't much musically either but in terms of capturing the spirit of the moment it was a corker.

As we headed towards Christmas that year, the news each night alternated between reports of violence in Beirut, Belfast and Soweto, followed by an update of how many of "our boys" had been killed in the South African Border War in Angola. Against this backdrop Crocodile Harris sang:

If we accept the word forever, maybe we should live together And not be scared to watch the late night news.
You can't use guns to build a nation, a bullet never was creation Give, give me the good news. War's the one game where we all lose. Give me the good news.

40 years on and it seems the nightly news is just as scary as it was then. How we could use some Good News this Christmas!

In 1965 Charles M. Schulz, creator of the Peanuts cartoon, was invited to write a television special for Christmas. In "A Charlie Brown Christmas" Schulz's characters get involved in competitive Christmas lights displays, greedy letters to Santa, an uncooperative Christmas play cast and a search for the perfect Christmas tree – all while Charlie Brown is trying to find out what Christmas is really all about. Amidst all the hype his quest seems hopeless until his friend Linus hushes the cast and gives them the Good News:

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid.

And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men."

May your Christmas be filled with Good News and may the New Year bring a time when no one is afraid to watch the late night news.

According to information received from the Scottish Ambulance Service Community Reliance Team, the Inverurie team is in the top five busiest groups in the whole North Division.







Areas of achievement: Community involvement is very evident and of good quality in achieving outcomes. A well driven group wanting to achieve the best for the settlement. Utilising group members to improve the streetscape produces real results; washing bus shelters and weeding streets and other structures has such a real impact on the desirability of Kintore as a place to work and live.

Recommendations/suggestions from your assessor: This is a group that could enter the Beautiful Scotland competition, and I would recommend Kintore Community Council consider this going forward – do get in touch with Juliette at Keep Scotland Beautiful to chat through this and to find out about their mentor support offer. Like many groups, a leader that drives the idea of improving the locality is something to be proud of. It would be useful to have a 5-year plan considered building in sustainability for the group.

Aberdeenshire North Food Bank

We know only too well that everyone is continuing to see rising costs when shopping for their household due to the ongoing cost of living crisis and we are so grateful to all of you generous people who continue to buy something extra when you are out shopping to donate to our stocks.

Our wish list for the current month is always to be found on our website (https://aberdeenshirenorth.foodbank.org.uk) or on our Facebook page and is usually displayed on our local collection points in supermarkets both in Kintore and Inverurie. The wish



list reflects food items that we are particularly short of that month and can change quite quickly. Some items are always in short supply – we never seem to have enough UHT milk or long-life fruit juice! On the other hand, our stocks of tinned soup, tinned beans and packets of pasta are usually quite good. We can prove that many of you do look at our lists of shortages before you go shopping because, as each month passes, we see highlighted items coming in as donations in greater quantity and for that we are truly grateful.

We often tell you that we cannot continue to provide the help for households living in food poverty without your ongoing support and that is so true. Whether you donate items of food or make donations of money (details provided on our website), your good will and generosity is what keeps us going. In the first three months of this year, our food bank in Inverurie supplied 177 households with food parcels, feeding 239 adults and 126 children. In the same period, across our whole Aberdeenshire network of 5 food banks (Inverurie, Ellon, Huntly, Peterhead and Fraserburgh), we provided a total of 1124 food parcels, providing for 1572 adults and 462 children. In April, while we took in stock amounting to 4435 kg of food, we distributed 6827 kg in food parcels. We really do depend on your donations.

We volunteers are just so grateful that we are surrounded by communities who truly care about their neighbours and are willing to help in whatever way they can. We long for the day when the existence of Food Banks is no longer necessary but, until that happens, we can just say a heartfelt 'thank you' to you all for your support.
