






HEARTMORM AWARENESS MONTH

Child Maltreatment in Georgia

Nationally, 4 million referrals were made to Child Protective Services (CPS) involving 7.2 million children

1,826,820 Unique victim counts of child abuse and neglect nationally

108,718 maltreatment reports received by CPS in Georgia

26,952 Child victims in Georgia


113 Fatalities

Recent counts of child victims have increased, this may be in part to a 2014 change in Georgia's reporting mechanisms. Reports can now be made 24 hours a day online and through a centralized intake phone number.



Georgia ranked 42nd in the nation for child well-being in 2016.³

Types of

Maltreatment

Physical Abuse 2,913 victims*

The non-accidental physical injury of a child.

*Victim counts for Georgia in 2015¹

75% of fatalities were 3-years old or younger 1



Sexual Abuse 927 victims*


Child exploitation for sexual gratification of an adult or older child.

Psychological (Emotional) Abuse 5,745 victims*

Excessive or aggressive behavior that places unreasonable demands on a child, usually occurs as verbal abuse.

Neglect 20,121 victims*

Failure to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, medical care, education, supervision or failure to meet emotional or psychological needs; neglect is the most common form of child abuse

If you have an emergency, please call 911 or your local police department.

It's Almost Summer Smoothie

|% c. fruit | 1 meat alt. | Yield: 16 - 8 fluid ounce servings

INGREDIENTS

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Names	Weight	Measure	
Yoplait® ParfaitPro® Low Fat Strawberry Yogurt (16631)	4 lb	8 cups	
Pineapple Juice, chilled	2 lb 4 oz	4 cups	
Applesauce, canned, unsweetened, chilled	2 lb 4 oz	4 cups	
Total Weight	8 lb 8 oz		

DIRECTIONS

- Combine yogurt, pineapple juice in 8 quart or larger measurement-marked storage container; stir until well mixed
 - Add applesauce, 2 cups at a time, stirring until smooth.
- Verify mixture yields 4 quarts (16 cups) so each serving contains 1/2 cup fruit; add applesance as needed to yield 16 total cups and stir.
- Portion 8 oz into 9 oz serving cups; place lids on cups and serve chilled; refrigerate if not serving immediately. May also refrigerate overnight.

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Fill 1 serving cup with 8 oz of smoothie; use as a visual guide to fill remaining cups.

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Egg-shiuapating Puant Pots



See how outdoor plants grow by bringing nature indoors.

What You'll Need: 1 egg carton; scissors; black marker; potting soil; four seed packets; spoon; plate; water

Make It: Cut off the top of the egg carton, leaving just the bottom. Separate four egg cups from the carton to create a pot collection and use scissors to trim the edges so they are even and smooth. Write the name of each plant on one side of each of the egg cups and fill each with a few scoops of potting soil. Place a few seeds of one plant in the appropriately labeled pot. Place all the pots on a large plate and position the plate near a sunny window. Water the plants according to the instructions on each package. When the plants get too big for the pots, transfer them to a bigger pot or to a garden outside. There's no need to remove the plants from the egg cups when planting in the garden; they will decompose into the soil!
