WHAT IS HAPPENING?

Teachers, in picture books, are rarely shown to be at the same level as students. They are rarely shown engaging in child-led activities.

Are the teachers in the books you read acting in ways that are surprising or expected?

ASK: WHAT DO YOU SEE TEACHERS DOING?

Schools vary greatly. When we see things that remind us of our stories, and things that show other peoples'stories, we have feelings.



ASK: HOW IS THIS STORY FAMILIAR & HOW DOES THAT FEEL?




WE COMMUNICATE IN MANY WAYS


