

To Koko Isle Interior or Non-Waterfront Units: Looking for a dock? Koko Isle non-waterfront property owners have 2 dock (4 slips) space opportunities available. Below is a photo of the new Non-Waterfront Unit docks consisting of 12 slips. The docks available will be installed to the left and right of this group of docks. Koko Isle Kolea: They are back!! Did You Know the tiny "Kolea", known to the world outside Hawaii as the Pacific Golden Plover, are among the world's mightiest long-distance flyers. They arrive in Hawaii in the early fall and stay through the end of April. Each year, our Kolea fly over 3,000 miles from their nesting grounds in the artic to winter in Hawaii and other Pacific Islands. Kolea return to and vigorously defend the same spot in both their summer and winter grounds, an extreme example of what ornithologists call "site faithfulness."





Many make Koko Isle their winter home and return here annually. Their return flight to Alaska, Siberia, and other artic destinations is synchronized to within a few days of April 25.

The bird's Hawaiian name, kolea, a phonetic imitation of its keening flight call, has come to mean "one who takes and leaves." Ai no ke kolea a momona hoi i Kahiki! goes one Hawaiian proverb: The kolea eats until he is fat, and then returns to the land from which he came.

Coconut Tree Trimming: It is that time again, we need to trim Coconut trees on Koko Isle. Hawaii Vista Masterscape is scheduled for the week of September 9th, 2024 (weather permitting). Please be aware that trucks & other equipment will be on the roadside, please drive with caution. Security Alert Car Break-ins: Warning for Cars Parked on the Roads. Crimes of opportunity of vehicle break-ins of cars parked along the roadside have increased in Hawaii Kai. Koko Isle Police partners advise us to keep our vehicles locked, store no valuables in your cars, and park in lighted areas. Property crimes, most notably car break-ns, are still a common occurrence. Many of these incidents have been a result of unattended unlocked vehicles and smashed windows, where items of value were left in plain view. These crimes of opportunity can be decreased through awareness, preparation and understanding. Please help your family, friends, neighbors, and visitors by sharing the important message of prevention.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS **WASTE FOR RESIDENTS**



Residents in Hawai'i have many different Fines of products that are used to maintain homes, gardens, and landscapes. However, some of these products are flammable, corrosive, or toxic and car harm our island environment. These products require special handling for oisposal by a hazardous waste contractor.

If the products cannot be used up for their invended purpose or given to friends or family, the City and County of Handulu provides an appointment based, complimentary HOUSEHOLD HAZARD JUS WASTE DROP OFF PROGRAM to residents to safely dispose of non-comme cial grade hazardous products.

Here is a list of products that require special handling:
