

ABATE of FLORIDA ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ABATE was the driving force behind the changes in Florida's Helmet Law. Florida Motorcyclists, over the age of 21 and who carry at least \$10,000 medical insurance coverage now enjoy the Freedom to Choose whether to wear a helmet or not. ABATE has developed & copyrighted "The Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Program" (MSAP). The program is presented to non-motorcyclists to educate them on how to safely share the road with motorcycles. It is taught in local schools & to civic organizations at no charge in the hope of reducing motorcycle accidents and deaths through education, not legislation. ABATE has passed the Vulnerable Road User Bill in 2024, signed by the Governor, for vulnerable road user to pay specified civil penalty; requires person's driver license to be suspended for specified period; requires person to attend specified driver improvement course.

ABATE has gained a positive and respected position in Tallahassee. Because of our Lobbyist and Legislative efforts, State Representatives are aware of ABATE members and our vigilant quest. ABATE reminds travelers every day to "Look Twice Save a Life, Motorcycles are everywhere"



*In case you don't know what MSAP is. ABATE of Florida, Inc. created the Motorcycle Safety Awareness Program (MSAP) to educate the public on motorcycle safety to help prevent motorcycle crashes and fatalities. The program's goal is to educate participants on how to safely share the road with motorcyclists.

STATE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT -

State party, an over 21 party, and looking at 2 different venues that are promising, more on that to come later. He asked all to sign up for COIR (Council of Informed Riders) https://nationalcoir.org/. The membership is free and comes with free \$3,500 AD& D insurance. You should also look into MRF (Motorcycle Rights Foundation) https://www.mrf.org/. There is a small annual membership fee, but they you also get \$4,000 AD&D insurance. Most importantly, is that if you join either, you get emails about what is going on nationally for motorcyclists and how you can help.

LEGISLATIVE LIAISON - BRAD WINSTON:

Brad was excused. Dreamer spoke about building relationships with our elected officials from federal to state to local levels. She also stated that she has reached out to get a copy of a survey that is used in another state so we can review it. This survey is used to determine the level of support elected officials and candidates have towards the motorcycle community and our rights. In the meantime, she will begin reaching out to our elected officials and did request a member or members from Miami-Dade lead up to do the same there. She will make appointments to see them in their local offices having a conversation and making them aware of who A.B.A.T.E of Florida is and some of the work we have done. 





A ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT

LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

Well on the legislative front, there is some good news... A driver's education bill was passed during the last Florida legislative session. Teens are required to complete a state approved drivers ed course before getting a learner's permit. Effective July 1, 2025, this applies to teens aged 15-17. Teens will need to pass hearing, vision and other tests as well as get parental consent in order to get a learner's permit. I believe this is a good thing for those of us on two wheels. Abate will be working hard to insure that biker awareness is included in the curriculum.

There was another bill that passed regarding speeding. Florida has enacted a new "Super Speeder Law" effective July 1stfo this year, targeting excessive speeding. Drivers exceeding the speed limit by 50 mph or more, or driving 100 mph or more, face increased penalties, including potential jail time, fines, and license suspension. The formal bill designation was Florida HB 351 if you wish to get more details.

Unfortunately, the hands-free driving bill died in committee. This bill prohibited operating of a motor vehicles while using a hand-held wireless communications device. I can't begin to tell you how many times I see individuals with a phone in their hand chatting away on their phone while I'm right next to them on my bike. Ugh In my opinion this is something we should consider supporting during the next legislative session.

During our state meeting in June this year, our state president asked us to reach out to the membership at large and get some input as to when we should focus on for our legislative agenda for the coming year. PLEASE contact me or any one

of the executive committee want us to pursue the Hands Free bill in the future or some other items as well.

My Perspective:

Meaning Behind the Music Series featuring Led Zeppelin's

'Stairway to Heaven'

With all the spiritual subject matter to cover, it might be interesting to consider song lyrics with a Christian perspective. Song lyrics are often metaphorical and can be interpreted in multiple ways. Therefore, these are merely my thoughts. This series won't be about bashing songs; my goal is to explore ideas about what the meaning, inspiration, and intent of the writer may have been.

"Stairway to Heaven" by Led Zeppelin is widely thought of as one of the most popular and influential rock songs of all time. Its popularity is derived from its impressive structure, memorable guitar solo, and ageless lyrics. The song's popularity was further sealed by its consistent play on rock radio, even though it was never officially released as a single.

While I don't have the space to cover the lyrics in their entirety, we find the main ideas in the first several verses,

'There's a lady who's sure all that glitters is gold And she's buying a stairway to Heaven When she gets there, she knows, if the stores are all closed

With a word she can get what she came for Ooh, ooh, and she's buying a stairway to Heaven'

The song's main character is a woman seeking a "stairway to heaven," which might be interpreted as humanity's desire for something more than earthly possessions. This is a reminder that God has instilled in all of us a desire for eternal things, as well as a curiosity about His kingdom.

As we continue, several other thoughts come to mind. 'She sees a sign on the wall but reminds us that words have two meanings'. This is very true not only of our complex English language, but there is a spiritual meaning running parallel to almost everything in the natural realm. "Ooh, it makes me wonder." It makes me wonder too. The question remains: how does one make one's way to heaven? Is there really a stairway? The answer is YES! Jesus is the Stairway!

John 1:51 says, 'Then he said, "I tell you the truth, you will all see heaven open and the angels of God going up and down on the Son of Man, the one who is the stairway between heaven and earth.'

The Bible also tells us in John 14:6, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Christ is the stairway that bridges the void between us and God. Since the exchange for sin is death, Christ took our sins upon himself and died in our place. Unlike this song, we cannot buy the Stairway. Our salvation cannot be purchased with even the finest gold or earned through good works; rather, it is free. It's a gift to all of us, received through faith in Jesus and God's unending grace. Ephesians 2:5 says, "For it is by grace you are saved, through faith- and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God- not by works, so that no one can boast."

The bridge of the song says, "Yes, there are two paths you can go by, but in the long run, there's still time to change the road you're on." With so many paths available to follow, it's evident that we need help in choosing the truth. Perhaps the "songbird" in the tree represents a voice of conscience or, better yet, the Holy Spirit, whose job is to guide us to the Father and help us to find a deeper understanding of truth.

It's no wonder this song became such a hit. It reminds me of how easily one can reach heaven. Jesus made it simple.

STEEL HORSES AND BATTLE SCARS:

THE DEEP CONNECTION BETWEEN THE BIKER COMMUNITY AND VETERANS



Let me tell you something straight: the bond between bikers and veterans runs deeper than chrome plating on a Harley tank. It's as real as bugs in your teeth on an open highway. And if you've ever rolled into a biker rally or a charity ride, you've seen those cuts, patches, and flags that tell the story: many in the biker world have worn

a uniform before they ever swung a leg over a motorcycle.

So why the connection? Why do so many veterans find themselves drawn to the biker life like a moth to a headlight?

Brothers (and Sisters) in Arms

First off, both communities speak the same language: Brotherhood.

In the military, your battle buddies become your family. You eat together, fight together, bleed together. You might not even like each other half the time—but you'd take a bullet for one another. That's the kind of loyalty the world doesn't always understand.

Guess what? It's the same in a biker club. We might not be dodging enemy fire anymore, but we've still got each other's backs in traffic, at rallies, and in life. Riding side by side down the highway feels an awful lot like rolling in a convoy. And if you've ever lost a brother, whether in combat or on the road, you know that pain cuts the same.

A Place to Belong

Here's another truth: a lot of veterans struggle after leaving the service. The military gives you purpose, structure, and identity. Civilian life can feel like being dumped in the middle of a cornfield without a compass. Suddenly, nobody's telling you where to be at 0600 or what uniform to wear.

The biker community fills that gap. It offers a place to belong, a patch to wear, and people who "get it." It's a tribe, plain and simple. A veteran who joins a riding club finds camaraderie that feels familiar—and healing.

Therapy on Two Wheels

Let's be real. PTSD is a nasty beast. Depression, anxiety... those shadows creep up on you when you least expect it. But there's something about a motorcycle that soothes the soul. The roar of pipes, the wind in your face, the miles rolling under your tires—it's therapy that no couch doctor can replicate.


I'd argue riding is a form of prayer. Out there, it's you, God, and the road. You clear your head. You talk to Jesus. You find peace. And that's true for a lot of veterans who carry heavy memories they'd rather not unpack at a dinner table.

Service Continues

The biker world doesn't just ride for fun. We ride for causes. Veterans' charities. PTSD awareness. Fallen soldier memorial rides. You'll see bikers—patches, tattoos, big old beards—raising thousands of dollars for vets who need help. It's service after service.

Because here's the deal: veterans don't stop serving when they hang up the uniform. Many keep





**EDUCATE, DON'T LEGISLATE

stuff we thought you might like to know

We were sitting around talking about usual random stuff and Little Bit was saying how she saw this online about the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act", H.R. 1, 119th Congress, which has been a big topic in news, and has passed. You can read about it here https://www.congress.gov/bill/119th-congress/house-bill/1 We know that this has been a bit controversial, but we try and stay out of fighting or arguing over things that either don't affect us, or that we can't change, you know, "God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change", that attitude. BUT this one does affect our motorcycling community in a good way, so we thought we would share this, directly quoted from the MRF, Motorcycle Riders Foundation, Washington, D.C.:

"Tax Credits For Purchases Of American-Made Motorcycles

The recently passed H.R. 1 legislation, signed by the President, includes a provision that will directly benefit those who purchase new motorcycles made or assembled in the United States. Interest paid on loans for qualifying new motorcycle purchases will now be tax-deductible.

Here are some important points to note. The deduction has a cap of \$10,000, and the benefit phases out based on increasing income levels. The change creates an "above-the-line" deduction for vehicle loan interest, meaning it reduces your adjusted gross income before calculating your taxable income. The position of the deduction is important because it will be available to most taxpayers, even those who do not itemize deductions. The bill states that vehicles impacted must be "manufactured primarily for use on public streets, roads, and highways" and are "a car,



minivan, van, sport utility vehicle, pickup truck, or motorcycle." This policy is temporary, with an expiration in 2028. If you are in the market for a new bike over the next three years, be sure to do some research to see if this new policy will benefit you.

There are diverse policy issues and priorities addressed in this bill. As the voice of the street rider in Washington, D.C., the Motorcycle Riders Foundation applauds the inclusion of this tax provision. Policies that foster the growth of motorcycling while supporting American manufacturing are something we can stand behind.

(s) 316.1922 EXCESSIVE SPEEDING (This applies to any motorized vehicle on the road)

- •If you are caught going more than 50mph OVER the posted speed limit and/or if you are caught going 100mph AND it is observed you are causing safety concerns to other people, property and/or interferes with the operation of any vehicle, you WILL get cited and have to appear in court.
- •IF CONVICTED (from the above citation) the following may occur:
- 1st offense: IMPRISONMENT UP TO 30 days AND/OR a fine of \$500.00.
- 2nd offense: IMPRISONMENT UP TO 90 days AND/OR a fine of \$1000.00.

NOTE: If your 2nd infraction happens within 5 YEARS of the first one, you WILL have your drivers license suspended at minimum 180 days (6 months) to maximum 1 YEAR.

The next section amends (s) 318.14 subsection 2, excluding certain criminal traffic violations and added the officer must indicate civil penalties.

The third section is amendments that speak about the excluded criminal traffic violations from above, for mandatory hearing.



This month I am going to talk about my rediscovered love for motorcycle camping. I hammock camped on my trip out west in 2018. At least until I got as far north as Yellowstone National Park where it was too cold to camp at night. Fast-forward seven years. In order to increase the range of my weekly "Riding Wednesdays", I have added on an occasional overnight. Florida has an incredible state park network. So far I have enjoyed two of these, Gamble Rogers State Park on Flagler Beach and Sebastian Inlet State Park. Having grown up at the beach in New Jersey (still have sand in my shoes) it was only natural that I chose two parks on the beach for my first two outings. I was once again lulled to sleep by the sound of the waves breaking on the shore, just like I was lulled to sleep 60 years ago. You can book your campsite online at reserve.floridastateparks.org. Campsites are a bargain, \$28 per night or \$14 per night if you are a senior citizen. Park staff is friendly. Campsites are well set up. Restrooms and shower facilities are clean and plentiful. One word of caution. The parks are almost fully booked. If you want to camp at a particular park or you want to camp for more than one night, you have to plan ahead. In my case, I have found no problem booking one night on short notice. You will be pleased to find that your bike has more than enough storage capacity for a camping trip. My "new" used Heritage does not have saddlebags. Much better looking without them in my opinion. I bought a medium size tail bag that I attached to the sissy bar. More than enough room for my tent, air mattress, ground cloth, a change of clothes, rain, gear, toiletries and whatever else. The secret to success is to buy camping gear designed for backpacking. These items will be smaller in size and lighter in weight as compared to standard camping gear. And forget cooking! It is a good excuse to enjoy a burger at a beachfront tiki bar. AND DO NOT FORGET BUG SPRAY LIKE ME!! TWICE!!
