

Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees;
 this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C.
 The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

TROY WAUGH

Troy Legrand Waugh, beloved son of Glenna and Gary Hollis, passed away on August 1, 2024, at the age of 60. Troy was born on October 9, 1963, to Stanley E. and Glenna (Vaughn) Waugh in Liberal, Kansas. He lived a life full of generosity, leadership, and strength. He was known for his passion for adventure, architectural expertise, proficiency in martial arts, and enjoyment of motorcycles and the open road.

Troy graduated from Merritt High School in Elk City, Oklahoma, in 1982. He worked many years at the Elk City Honda Shop. He then earned his Professional Bachelor of Architecture from Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma, and established a distinguished career with years of service in civil and government architecture.

Troy's work included building high-rises in Honolulu, Hawaii, and government projects in Kabul, Afghanistan, Manila, Philippines, and Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. He also worked on U.S. Embassy projects in Asuncion, Paraguay. Troy had a keen

eye for detail and a special appreciation for timeless church structures. At the time of his illness, Troy was an architectural project and construction manager for the City of Plantation, Florida, where he was greatly supported and encouraged by many friends and coworkers. He was a member of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and held a U.S. government "Q" Clearance, one of the highest levels of security privileges.

Troy lived an adventurous life and traveled to 42 countries. He loved hunting, fishing, deep- sea diving, and while living in Key West, Florida, he enjoyed spearfishing.

Troy was a respected figure in the professional mixed martial arts community, excelling as both a fighter and a UFC referee. He held a black belt and was skilled in various martial arts, including Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu, in which he trained under the renowned Gracie family. He was also a member of the Florida Boxing Commission. Troy fought in many MMA events worldwide, which included a notable world championship fight in Abu Dhabi, UAE. He also refereed many prominent UFC fights, including those featuring Jon "Bones" Jones and Kimbo Slice. In Moscow, Russia, he refereed a high-profile match attended by President Vladimir Putin, Italian President Ciampi, and actor Jean-Claude Van Damme at ringside.



Troy actively served as Vice President and Road Captain of the Florida Abate SE Motorcycle Chapter, was a contributing author to the Abate SE Florida Magazine, and advocated for biker safety laws. He spent hours riding on weekends with friends as a protective leader, always looking forward to the next ride.

Troy had a deep, personal, private faith in God, having been raised in the Friends Church and accepting Jesus Christ as his Savior at an early age at Camp Quaker Haven in Arkansas City, Kansas, where he was also baptized. His faith sustained him throughout his life, especially during his courageous two-year battle with brain cancer-he truly was a Braveheart.



Troy was a beloved uncle to his nine nieces and nephews-Michael Feltman, Rachel Martinez, Jordan Arias, Shane Smith, Lela Smith, Luke Smith, Tanner Smith, Alex Waugh, and Jacob Waugh-as well as to his 12 great-nieces and great-nephews: Judah, Michael John, Meggie, Hadassah, Leire, Adam, Samuel, Gael, Carter, Annie, Grace, and Clark. Additionally, he was loved by a host of stepnieces, step-nephews, many cousins, and loving friends too numerous to name. Troy was preceded in death by his father, Stanley E. Waugh, in 1982.

A Graveside Service honoring Troy will be held on August 9, 2024, at 2:00 p.m. at Liberal Cemetery in Liberal, Kansas. All who knew Troy will treasure their special relationship and memories with him. He will be greatly missed!

We can't go down there in a cage! After all, those guys in Dade are presidents and vice presidents of motorcycle clubs and riding groups. We can't go down there and look like a bunch of pussies!" So, we climbed on our bikes and rode all the way down there, 68 miles, in that crazy thunderstorm. When we got down there, guess how many motorcycles were there? Yup, that's right, two of them, mine and his. Everybody else knew it was safer to ride in a cage. And most of them live down there. It's better to be safe than sorry.

But that was Troy, he was hardcore in everything he did, riding, friendship, everything. I miss you bro, RIP, Ride in Peace!!



SOUTHEAST CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES HELD AT AMERICAN LEGION POST 142 171 SW 2ND STPOMPANO BEACH FL, 33060 AUGUST 24, 2024



While all this is happening, an: independent research company is doing traffic experiments throughout Florida in order for us to be able to explore new ways of making things safer.

Round and round it goes... until we reach everyone... One booth at a time...One class at a time.




James 1:5 says, "If you lack wisdom, ask God for it. He is always ready to give it to you and will never say you are wrong for asking."



CAPTAIN'S CORNER

GAME OVER ??

Throughout history great societies have remained on top for an average of 250 years. The United States is now in its 248th year.

The numerous reasons great societies have failed include epidemics, war and economic collapse. All of these issues are in play at this time. Economic collapse is of greatest concern to me. I have been very concerned about the mushrooming federal budget deficit since 2010. Currently our total deficit stands at over \$35 trillion. That is OVER \$100,000 per US citizen!! Some Background Like you and I, the government takes in revenues and has expenses. The biggest government revenue is income taxes. This represents about 50% of our income. An additional \$2 trillion of our debt is held by China and Japan. Interest must be paid to our debt holders in FULL and ON TIME or our country will be in default. In the current year, the interest on the \$35 trillion debt will be \$1.1 trillion or approximately 1/3 of our annual revenue. That is \$1.1 trillion that IS NOT AVAILABLE for healthcare, Social Security, defense, education, infrastructure, arts and all the rest. The solutions are few: raise taxes. Reduce expenditures. Continue funding the deficit by borrowing and paying a greater percentage of revenue in interest each year. RAISE TAXES? How much more can Americans pay in taxes? It is estimated that we are paying almost 50% in taxes when ALL taxes are considered. (Even more in states with city and state income taxes). REDUCE EXPENDITURES? Our government? Don't Hold Your Breath. CONTINUED DEFICIT FINANCING? A certain recipe for economic collapse. And soon. Sorry for the gloomy picture of our economy and where our country is headed. I will end on a positive note, however. We can solve this simply if each citizen of the United States would write a check

to the IRS for \$100,000. This would guarantee us another 250 years on top. I am writing my check now! National debt clock www.usdebtclock.









*Educate, don't legislate" stuff we thought you might like to know

We were sitting around, talking about the recent event that some of our members attended, and where we had a Safety Booth, which was the Indian Motorcycle Riders Group, IRMG, Charity Ride. The IRMG teamed up with Folds of Honor to raise funds for fallen and disabled veterans. and they rode out from Broward Motorsports to the South Florida National Cemetery, and back. There were some beautiful Indian bikes there. We sometimes forget about the other great America motorcycle, the Indian. Sheila's mom, who was born in 1925, even rode around on one with her first husband. So we looked up some different stories about Indian motorcycle riders and came across the one below, about the "Abernathy Kids". It is such a great story, and it is always amazing to us, some of the incredible lost histories of riders, that are out there, like this. God bless the internet. So we are sharing that story here, and told better than we could, so we are siting where we got it, all here https://roaddirt.tv/the-abernathy-boys-anamerican-chronicle/

Two young brothers who criss-crossed America

I first laid eyes on the photo of the "Abernathy Kids" when my father gave me a wooden framed print of it some 10 years ago for my basement "man cave". He knew a little of the backstory which he shared with me, and I placed the picture and frame among some of my other vintage and antique paraphernalia downstairs, where it

remained for a decade. When we transferred my "motorcycle works" to a new outdoor garage, I thought the photo and frame would fit perfectly, so I set it among my other old stuff on the back pegboard.

The other night, as my wife was hanging out briefly with me in said garage, she saw the photo and asked about it. I recounted what I could remember my dad telling me about the boys, and she replied, "You should write a story about them for Road Dirt." Dumbfounded that I'd never thought of that before, I set about researching their tale, and it turned out to be more fantastic than even Pops had shared with me years before.

The boys' names were Louis "Bud" and Temple Abernathy, sons of a famous U.S. marshal and sheriff named Jack "Catch-Em Alive" Abernathy. Born and raised in Guthrie, Oklahoma in the early 1900s, their mother died in 1907 after giving birth to the couple's sixth child, and Jack raised the whole brood as a single father on their family ranch. Jack had been a soldier in Theodore Roosevelt's "Rough Riders" unit in the Spanish-American War by some accounts, and the two remained friends, staying in contact in the years following the war. Known for his toughness and bravado. Jack earned the nickname "Catch-Em Alive" for not only his track record of apprehending criminals as an agent of the law, but also for his unusual ability of catching wolves and coyotes alive that preyed on local livestock. He apparently was paid handsomely by regional ranchers for his unique skill set.

Life on a ranch in Oklahoma in the early years of the 20th century was hardscrabble, and Jack made sure his boys grew up strong and confident. The young brothers first adventure, approved and encouraged by their father as a way to "toughen up" the young lads, saw Bud and Temple ride their horses Geronimo and Sam from Guthrie, OK to Santa Fe, New Mexico in July of 1909. Alone. At ages 9 and 5, respectively. It was definitely different times back then.

The intrepid youngsters' next adventure saw them make a trip the very next year, from Guthrie to New York City astride their trusty steeds Geronimo and Sam again, this time amidst much newspaper coverage across the country. Upon arriving in NYC, they were welcomed by none other than Teddy Roosevelt himself and a crowd numbering in the thousands, lining the streets to see the "wonder kids". If that weren't enough, the boys purchased a small Brush Motor Car with sponsorship and gift money, and they drove that car back home to Guthrie, OK, once again on their own.

In 1911, the now young celebrities accepted a challenge to ride their horses from New York City to San Fransisco in under 60 days. If they succeeded, they would receive a \$10,000 prize. The catch: they were forbidden to eat or sleep indoors the entire trip. The boys rode Sam and Geronimo hard but missed the deadline by two days. Yet their quest had been so followed and popularized across the country via newspaper reports that they raised enough money to purchase a new Indian motorcycle, seen in the now iconic photo.

Their Indian motorcycle appears to be a single speed 1000cc v-twin, worth about \$250 back in its day, from what some sources have claimed. The bike had a leaf spring rear suspension, made about 7 hp, weighed about 355 lbs fully fueled, and rolled down the largely unpaved roads of its time at a top speed of 55 mph. The rear fendermounted tandem seat with its own handlebars was apparently a popular accessory of the day, and in 1913, the boys took up another challenge: ride that motorcycle from Oklahoma back to New York City. The boys were accompanied by their stepbrother Anton (unsure how they managed that), with Bud being all of 14 and Temple aged 10. Upon reaching New York, after being hailed again nationwide for their adventure, the boys loaded up the bike and took a train home to Guthrie, their escapades concluded. It would be their last cross-country adventure. In all, the boys traversed over 12,000 miles back and forth across America, in an age before superhighways or even

paved roads.


Jack eventually moved the family to Wichita Falls, Texas during the oil boom years, working as a "wildcatter" in the oil fields. Temple grew up to accompany his dad in the work. Louis "Bud" would go on to study law at the University of Oklahoma and practice law in Wichita Falls, Texas, later becoming a judge. Jack died in 1941, Bud passed away in 1979, and Temple died in 1986. Their story is the stuff of legend, from a time in American history that is long gone but never forgotten. May the tale of the Abernathy Kids live on in American lore.




